A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE RAPID RE-HOUSING ASSISTANCE PROGRAM.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to statutorily
2	establish the rapid re-housing assistance program.
3	SECTION 2. Chapter 346, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
4	amended by adding a new section to part XVII to be appropriately
5	designated and to read as follows:
6	" <mark>§346-A Rapid re-housing assistance program.</mark> (a) Subject
7	to the availability of legislative appropriations, federal
8	grants, or both, the department shall establish and operate a
9	rapid re-housing assistance program.
10	The purpose of the program shall be to help homeless
11	families or individuals move as quickly as possible into
12	permanent housing and achieve stability in that housing.
13	(b) The rapid re-housing assistance program shall be
14	designed and operated by the department to qualify for federal
15	emergency shelter grants; provided that this provision shall not
16	be construed as prohibiting the use of other federal grants for
17	the program if allowable under federal law and regulations.

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1	(c)	As part of the rapid re-housing assistance program,		
2	the department may provide housing relocation and stabilization			
3	services and short- and medium-term rental assistance.			
4	(d)	The authority shall include information and data about		
5	the rapid	re-housing assistance program in its annual reports		
6	required	under section 356D-20.		
7	<u>(e)</u>	As used in this section:		
8	<u>"Hou</u>	sing relocation and stabilization services "includes		
9	the follo	wing:		
10	<u>(1)</u>	Financial assistance, including payment to housing		
11		owners, utility companies, or other third parties on		
12		behalf of homeless families or individuals, for the		
13		following costs:		
14		(A) Rental application fees;		
15		(B) Security deposits;		
16		(C) Last month's rent;		
17		(D) Utility deposits;		
18		(E) Utility payments; and		
19		(F) Moving costs;		
20	<u>(2)</u>	Providing or making payment for the following		
21		services:		

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1	<u>(A)</u>	Hous	ing search and placement to help homeless
2		famil	lies or individuals locate, obtain, and
3		retai	in suitable permanent housing;
4	<u>(B)</u>	Housi	ing stability case management to:
5		<u>(i)</u>	Help homeless families or individuals
6			overcome immediate barriers to obtaining
7			permanent housing; or

10			in permanent housing;
11	(C)	Media	ation between homeless families or

16		<u>(i)</u>	Help homeless families or individuals obtain

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- 1	<u>(E</u>) Credit counseling and services to help homeless
2		families or individuals acquire skills needed for
3		household budgeting, managing money, accessing
4		free personal credit reports, and resolving
5		credit problems.
6	"Short-	and medium-term rental assistance" includes the
7	following:	
8	<u>(1)</u> Sh	ort-term rental assistance, under which rental
9	pa	yments on behalf of homeless families or individuals
10	ar	e made for a maximum of three months;
11	<u>(2)</u> <u>Me</u>	dium-term rental assistance, under which rental
12	pa	yments on behalf of homeless families or individuals
13	ar	e made for at least three, but not more than twenty-
14	fo	ur months; and
15	<u>(3)</u> Re	ntal arrears payment consisting of a one-time
16	pa	yment on behalf of homeless families or individuals
17	fo	r up to six months of rent in arrears, including any
18	<u>la</u>	te fees on the arrears.
19	<u>(f)</u> Th	e department may adopt rules pursuant to chapter 91
20	to implement	the rapid re-housing assistance program. The rules
21	may clarify	the types of services and assistance that may be

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1	provided as hou	sing relocation and stabilization services or			
2	short- and medium-term rental assistance; provided that the				
3	rules shall not be inconsistent with applicable federal laws and				
4	regulations."				
5	SECTION 3. Section 346-361, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is				
6	amended by amending the definition of "homeless" to read as				
7	follows:				
8	""Homeless	s" or "homeless families or individuals" means:			
9	(1) An ir	ndividual or family who lacks a fixed, regular,			
10	and a	adequate night-time residence; [or]			
11	(2) An ir	ndividual or family who has a primary night-time			
12	resid	dence that is:			
13	(A)	A supervised publicly or privately operated			
14		shelter designed to provide temporary living			
15		accommodations;			
16	(B)	An institution that provides temporary residence			
17		for individuals intended to be institutionalized;			
18		or			
19	(C)	A public or private place not designed for or			
20		ordinarily used as sleeping accommodations for			
21		human beings[-]; or			

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1	(3) An individual or family who currently resides in
2	permanent housing as participants in the rapid re-
3	housing assistance program, but who was formerly
4	homeless.
5	This term does not include any individual imprisoned or
6	otherwise detained under an act of Congress or a state law."
7	SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the general
8	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$1,000,000 or so much
9	thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2016-2017 for the
10	establishment and operation of the rapid re-housing assistance
11	program, including the employment of full-time equivalent
12	(FTE) program specialists for the program.
13	The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
14	human services for the purposes of this Act; provided that the
15	department of human services shall commence planning the rapid
16	re-housing assistance program upon the effective date of this
17	section to ensure that the program may be implemented beginning
18	January 1, 2017.

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SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on January 1, 2017;
provided that section 4 shall take effect on July 1, 2016.

Rapid Re-Housing Assistance Program; Appropriation

Description:

Requires DHS to establish a rapid re-housing assistance program to move homeless families or individuals into permanent housing as quickly as possible and achieve stability in that housing. Requires the program to be designed and operated to qualify for federal emergency shelter grants. Expands definition of "homeless" as applied to DHS' homeless programs. Appropriates general funds for fiscal year 2016-17. Effective 1/1/2017. (SD1)

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
