A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HAWAIIAN LANGUAGE TELEVISION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that article XV, section
- 2 4, of the Hawaii State Constitution states that "English and
- 3 Hawaiian shall be the official languages of Hawaii . . . " The
- 4 legislature further finds that the Hawaiian language movement
- 5 has become a leading national and international model for
- 6 indigenous language revitalization. Today, unlike any other
- 7 state in the country, there are twenty-one Hawaiian language
- 8 immersion public schools and eleven preschools in the State,
- 9 serving over two thousand students annually.
- 10 The legislature additionally finds that the media can have
- 11 a very important part in furthering the efforts to normalize the
- 12 Hawaiian language throughout Hawaii. If the Hawaiian language
- 13 is to reach an equal status with that of the English language in
- 14 everyday use, the production and distribution of Hawaiian
- 15 language broadcast media must be adopted.
- 16 The legislature also finds that the department of commerce
- 17 and consumer affairs is authorized to assess franchise fees from

- 1 cable operators. The use of this franchise fee covers the
- 2 department's costs to administer chapter 440G, Hawaii Revised
- 3 Statutes, and to also fund operations for public access
- 4 television. The department formerly collected 4.64 per cent of
- 5 a cable system's annual gross revenues but now collects the
- 6 maximum five per cent. The legislature finds that there remains
- 7 an unallocated percentage of funds from the franchise fee
- 8 collection.
- 9 The department of commerce and consumer affairs has briefed
- 10 the legislature over several years that there would be a method
- 11 and program in place for the production and distribution of
- 12 Hawaiian language broadcast media. Furthermore, the department
- 13 has also provided a dollar amount that would be committed to
- 14 this program. To date, there has been no movement to procure
- 15 Hawaiian language broadcast media services, and the dollar
- 16 amount initially represented to the legislature has been cut in
- 17 half.
- 18 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to require the
- 19 department of commerce and consumer affairs to allocate all
- 20 unencumbered revenues derived from collected franchise fees for
- 21 the establishment of a Hawaiian language television channel.

1	SECTION 2.	Chapter	440G,	Hawaii	Revised	Statutes,	is

- 2 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
- 3 and to read as follows:
- 4 "\$440G~ Franchise fee; Hawaiian language television;
- allocation. Notwithstanding any other law or rule to the 5
- 6 contrary, the department shall allocate all unencumbered
- 7 revenues derived from collected franchise fees for the
- 8 establishment of a Hawaiian language television channel."
- 9 SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored.
- SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval. 10
