A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PUBLIC SCHOOLS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECT	ION 1. The department of education and department of	
2	accounting and general services, in consultation with the Hawaii		
3	state energy office of the department of business, economic		
4	development, and tourism and the Hawaii natural energy institut		
5	of the University of Hawaii, shall jointly develop a master		
6	strategy for the cooling of all public school facilities and		
7	shall conduct a comprehensive study that addresses factors,		
8	including but not limited to:		
9	(1)	Applicable electrical and environmental standards	
10		governing air conditioning equipment and use;	
11	(2)	Estimated capital improvement project costs;	
12	(3)	Projected long-term repair and maintenance costs; and	
13	(4)	Any other relevant factors that may impact the	
14		legislature's decision-making process for funding the	
15		master strategy for cooling at all public school	
16		facilities.	

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1	SECTION 2. The department of education and department of		
2	accounting and general services shall submit a joint report of		
3	their findings and recommendations, including any proposed		
4	legislation, to the legislature no later than twenty days prior		
5	to the convening of the regular session of 2016. The report		
6	shall include:		
7	(1)	A timeline that includes dates and prioritization	
8		schedules for the implementation of the master	
9		strategy for cooling all public school facilities;	
10	(2)	Discussion of the capacity, infrastructure, and	
11		funding needs of the department of education in	
12		implementing the master strategy for cooling all	
13		public school facilities; and	
14	(3)	Discussion of how the master strategy for cooling all	
15		public school facilities complements and overlaps with	
16	,	the department of education's overall facilities	
17		master plan and sustainability efforts.	
18	SECT	ION 3. There is appropriated out of the general	
19	revenues	of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so	
20	much ther	eof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2015-2016 for a	
21	comprehensive study regarding the cooling of all public school

- 2 all public school facilities.
- 3 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 4 education for the purposes of this Act.
- 5 SECTION 4. The director of finance is authorized to issue
- 6 general obligation bonds in the sum of \$ or so much
- 7 thereof as may be necessary and the same sum or so much thereof
- 8 as may be necessary is appropriated for fiscal year 2015-2016
- 9 for the purpose of funding projects that demonstrate efficient
- 10 methods of air conditioning classrooms.
- 11 SECTION 5. The appropriation made for the capital
- 12 improvement project authorized by this Act shall not lapse at
- 13 the end of the fiscal biennium for which the appropriation is
- 14 made; provided that all moneys from the appropriation
- 15 unencumbered as of June 30, 2018, shall lapse as of that date.
- 16 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2015.

Report Title:

Public Schools; Air Conditioning; General Obligation Bonds; Appropriation

Description:

Requires the department of education and department of accounting and general services, in consultation with the Hawaii state energy office of the department of business, economic development, and tourism and the Hawaii natural energy institute of the University of Hawaii, to conduct a comprehensive study and develop a master strategy for the cooling of all public schools. Requires the findings to be reported to the legislature. Appropriates funds for the comprehensive study of cooling needs and development of a master strategy for cooling all public schools. Authorizes the issuance of general obligation bonds and appropriates funds for projects that demonstrate efficient methods of air conditioning classrooms.
