## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE STATE BUILDING CODE COUNCIL.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the state building
- 2 code council was created in 2007 to review and adopt a
- 3 comprehensive suite of the latest editions of nationally
- 4 recognized building codes and standards for the State of Hawaii.
- 5 However, operating expenses for council staff have never been
- 6 funded, thereby limiting the effectiveness of the work of the
- 7 eleven voting members, who include subject matter experts of
- 8 government and private building industry representatives.
- 9 The legislature further finds that timely updated building
- 10 codes are necessary to ensure compliance with requirements of
- 11 the National Flood Insurance Program, hurricane and earthquake
- 12 resiliency standards, energy efficiency, and technological
- 13 advances in building materials and methods.
- 14 The purpose of this Act is to establish a task force to
- 15 consider long-term funding for the state building code council,
- 16 and to appropriate funds to the state building code council for

- 1 administrative staff positions and administrative rulemaking
- 2 expenses.
- 3 SECTION 2. (a) The state building code council shall
- 4 convene a task force to consider the necessity, potential
- 5 source, and application of long-term dedicated funding for the
- 6 council's operations.
- 7 (b) The task force shall consist of individuals appointed
- 8 by the state building code council.
- 9 (c) The state building code council shall be responsible
- 10 for administering the work of the task force, providing a
- 11 facilitator, and submitting reports to the legislature.
- 12 (d) Members of the task force shall serve without
- 13 compensation but shall be reimbursed for expenses, including
- 14 travel expenses, necessary for the performance of their duties.
- 15 (e) The task force shall submit a preliminary report of
- 16 its findings to the legislature no later than twenty days prior
- 17 to the regular session of 2017, and a final report of its
- 18 findings and recommendations, including any recommendations for
- 19 legislation, to the legislature no later than twenty days prior
- 20 to the regular session of 2018.
- 21 (f) The task force shall cease to exist on June 30, 2018.

- 2 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$150,000 or so much
- 3 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2016-2017 for an
- 4 executive director, an administrative assistant, or contracted
- 5 service for these two positions, and administrative rulemaking
- 6 expenses for the state building code council.
- 7 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 8 accounting and general services for the purposes of this Act.
- 9 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2016.

### Report Title:

State Building Code Council; Task Force; Operating Expenses; Appropriation

### Description:

Establishes a task force within the state building code council to consider the necessity, potential source, and application of long-term funding for council operations, and appropriates funds to the council for administrative expenses and staff positions.

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
