### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PUBLIC SAFETY.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Section 354D-4, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended to read as follows: 3 "§354D-4 Powers and duties of the director. Under the 4 supervision of the director or the director's designee, the 5 administrator of the correctional industries program shall: 6 (1) Develop programs generating revenue that best sustains 7 their operation and allows for capital investment, and reimburses the general fund, when possible, for the 8 9 expense of correctional services; 10 (2) Develop programs providing the maximum level of work 11 and training opportunities for qualified, able-bodied 12 inmates; Develop programs assuming responsibility for training 13 (3) 14 qualified, able-bodied inmates in general work and 15 specific training skills that increase their 16 employment prospects after release;

1	(4)	Develop programs in which inmates can learn skills
2		used in the construction and other industries, while
3		providing low-cost construction, renovation, and
4		repairs of facilities, grounds, furniture, vehicles,
5		and equipment for private, nonprofit social services,
6		health, or education agencies and programs;
7	(5)	Acquire or purchase equipment, materials, supplies,
8		office space, insurance, and services necessary to
9		establish and maintain programs pursuant to this
10		chapter;
11	(6)	[Use-labor services of qualified, able-bodied inmates
12		in the manufacture or production of goods and services
13		that are needed for the construction, operation, or
14		maintenance of any office, department, institution, or
15		agency supported in whole or in part by the State, the
16		counties; or the federal government; Ensure the
17		correctional industries program is operated for the
18		purpose of employment training of inmates in:
19		(A) Manufacturing or producing articles or products
20		for sale to the general public, including
21		photographs, paintings, drawings, sewn items,

1		crocheted items, woodwork, and other items deemed
2		appropriate for sale by the director; and
3		(B) Providing labor services for the construction,
4		repair, or maintenance of any equipment or real
5		property of any department or agency of the
6		State, a county, or the federal government;
7		provided that the administrator of the
8		correctional industries program may assess a
9		reasonable charge for the services provided under
10		this subparagraph;

12		counties, or the federal government;
13	<del>(8)</del> ]	(7) Sell uniforms and uniform accessories to state-
14		employed adult corrections officers;

16		maintain personal property; [and]
17	[ <del>(10)</del> ]	(9) Accept grants or loans from the State, the
18		counties, or the federal government[-]; and
19	(10)	Ensure that the proceeds from the sale of products and
20		crafts pursuant to paragraph 6(A) are deposited as
21		follows:

1	<u>(A)</u>	Twenty-five per cent to be deposited into the			
2		correctional industries revolving fund; and			
3	<u>(B)</u>	Seventy-five per cent to be deposited into the			
4		committed person's account established pursuant			
5		to section 353-20."			
6	SECTION 2. Section 354D-10, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is				
7	amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:				
8	"(a) There is created the correctional industries				
9	revolving fund to be administered by the department. All moneys				
10	collected by the department from the sale or disposition of				
11	goods and services produced in accordance with this chapter,				
12	from the sale of products and crafts in accordance with section				
13	353D-4(10), and any inmate deductions shall be deposited into				
14	the correctional industries revolving fund. The proceeds in the				
15	correctional i	ndustries revolving fund shall be used for: the			
16	purchase or lease of supplies, equipment, and machinery; the				
17	construction,	leasing, or renovating of buildings used to carry			
18	out the purpos	es of this chapter; the salaries of personnel			
19	necessary to administer the enterprises established in				
20	accordance with this chapter; payment of inmates for work				
21	assignments; t	he reimbursement of incarceration costs of the

- 1 inmates related to the inmates' participation in correctional
- 2 industries; and other necessary expenses; provided that the
- 3 correctional industries revolving fund shall not be maintained
- 4 in excess of the amount necessary to carry out the purposes of
- 5 this chapter."
- 6 SECTION 3. Section 354D-15, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 7 repealed.
- 8 ["-[§354D-15] Sale of goods. It shall be unlawful to-sell,
- 9 or-offer for sale, on the open market of this State, any
- 10 articles or products manufactured or produced, wholly or in
- 11 part, under this chapter. Goods-or-services produced by venture
- 12 agreements under section 354D-13 shall be exempt from this
- 13 limitation."]
- 14 SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 15 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 16 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.

## S.B. NO. 2639

### Report Title:

Corrections; Committed Persons; Sale of Crafts; Correctional Industries Program; Correctional Industries Revolving Fund

### Description:

Allows committed persons to create approved products and crafts that may be sold through the correctional industries program to the public. Requires that all moneys collected from the sale of products and crafts to be deposited into either the correctional industries revolving fund or the committed person's account. Repeals the prohibition of the sale of such products on the open market.
