## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO KE'EHI LAGOON BEACH PARK.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that Ke'ehi lagoon beach
- 2 park is an urban beach park managed by the city and county of
- 3 Honolulu that has been a popular place for canoe racing and
- 4 boating for many years. Although the man-made beach is not
- 5 suitable for swimming, it is an extremely valuable location to
- 6 the canoe racing and boating community. As the home to
- 7 countless practice sessions and many outrigger canoe regattas,
- 8 the Ke'ehi lagoon has touched the lives of thousands of Hawaii's
- 9 children and youth throughout the years.
- 10 The legislature further finds that the beach at Ke'ehi
- 11 lagoon beach park has deteriorated. Over time, the sand has
- 12 disappeared and jagged rocks and asphalt now protrude, creating
- 13 dangerous conditions for the children and youth who come for
- 14 canoe racing practices and competitions. This community
- 15 attraction is no longer safe for people to enjoy.
- 16 The purpose of this Act is to appropriate funds for the
- 17 replenishment of the beach at Ke'ehi lagoon beach park.

1	SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
2	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
3	much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2015-2016 and
4	the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal
5	year 2016-2017 for the replenishment of the beach at Ke'ehi
6	lagoon beach park.
7	The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
8	of land and natural resources for the purposes of this Act.
9	SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2015.
