A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO NATURAL RESOURCES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the trafficking of 1 2 animals threatened with extinction continues to grow at an 3 alarming pace, threatening an increasing variety of animal The threat of extinction is due in large part to the 4 species. trafficking of animal parts and products. The National Strategy 5 for Combating Wildlife Trafficking, released in February 2014, 6 7 recognized the important role that states have in protecting 8 species that are subject to illegal wildlife trade. Federal law regulates the transfer and importation of parts or products made 9 from endangered and threatened animal species, but due to the 10 11 increasing demand for these products around the world, it is 12 important to align state authority with federal and 13 international laws to appropriately regulate these markets on a 14 local level.

15 The legislature further finds that the most effective way 16 to discourage illegal trafficking is to eliminate markets and 17 profits. It is in the public interest to protect animal species

threatened with extinction by prohibiting within the State, with 1 certain limited exceptions, the sale, offer for sale, purchase, 2 trade, possession with intent to sell, or barter for any part or · 3 product of any species of elephant (Elephantidae), mammoth 4 (Mammuthus), rhinoceros (Rhinocerotidae), tiger (Panthera 5 tigris), great ape (Hominoidea), shark and ray (Elasmobranchii), 6 sea turtle (Chelonioidea), walrus (Odobenus rosmarus), narwhal 7 (Monodon monoceros), whale (Cetacea), hippopotamus (Hippopotamus 8 amphibius), monk seal (Neomonachus), lion (Panthera leo), 9 pangolin (Manis), cheetah (Acinonyx jubatus), jaguar (Panthera **10**[°] onca), and leopard (Panthera pardus) identified as threatened 11 with extinction by the Convention on International Trade in 12 Endangered Species and the Endangered Species Act. These 13 animals represent some of the most trafficked species threatened 14 with extinction according to illegal wildlife product seizure 15 data gathered by the World Wildlife Fund-TRAFFIC, International 16 Union for the Conservation of Nature, and other international 17 conservation organizations. 18

19 The legislature further finds that in September 2015, the 20 United States and China announced a cooperative effort to take 21 comprehensive action to curb wildlife trafficking, including

1 significant restrictions on the import of ivory as hunting 2 trophies and halting the domestic commercial trade of ivory. As the host of the upcoming International Union for the 3 4 Conservation of Nature World Conservation Congress with the 5 United States in September 2016, it is important to demonstrate 6 Hawaii's continuing leadership in global conservation challenges 7. such as international wildlife trafficking and endangered 8 species protection.

9 The purpose of this Act is to improve coordination between 10 state and other government authorities as encouraged in section 11 183D-8, Hawaii Revised Statutes, and to remove any potential 12 conflicts of law that unintentionally make Hawaii an attractive 13 market for illegal wildlife trafficking as other countries and 14 states pass legislation to protect global populations of 15 endangered species.

16 SECTION 2. Chapter 183D, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
17 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
18 and to read as follows:

19 "<u>§183D-</u> <u>Wildlife trafficking; prohibited.</u> (a) No
20 person shall sell, offer to sell, purchase, trade, possess with

13	of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof, shall be punished

1 products, or items containing prohibited animal parts 2 or products used in the commission of the violations shall be considered contraband to be forfeited to and 3 disposed of by the State; and 4 5 For a third or subsequent conviction within five years (3) 6 of the first two or more convictions, by a mandatory 7 fine of not less than \$2,000, or by imprisonment of not more than one year, or both, and all firearms, 8 9 animal parts, products, or items containing prohibited 10 animal parts or products used in the commission of the 11 violations shall be considered contraband to be 12 forfeited to and disposed of by the State." SECTION 4. This Act does not affect rights and duties that 13 14 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were 15 begun before its effective date. 16 SECTION 5. If any provision of this Act, or the 17 application thereof to any person or circumstance, is held 18 invalid, the invalidity does not affect other provisions or 19 applications of the Act that can be given effect without the 20 invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions

of this Act are severable.

Imposes penalties for violations of the prohibition on trafficking animal parts and products. (SB2647 HD2)
