A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO UNCONTESTED TRAFFIC FINES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Chapter 291C, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 2 amended by adding a new part to be appropriately designated and
- 3 to read as follows:
- 4 "PART . UNCONTESTED TRAFFIC INFRACTIONS; TRANSMITTAL OF
- 5 TRAFFIC FINES TO COUNTIES
- 6 §291C-A Definitions. As used in this part, unless the
- 7 context clearly requires otherwise:
- 8 "Traffic infraction" means the same as defined under
- 9 section 291D-2.
- 10 "Uncontested traffic infraction" means a traffic infraction
- 11 for which the person notified under section 291D-5 does not
- 12 contest the infraction. A person "does not contest" an
- infraction if, in accordance with section 291D-6(b)(4), the
- 14 person admits the commission of the infraction without
- 15 requesting a hearing to explain mitigating circumstances and
- 16 pays the fine by mail within thirty days of the date of the
- 17 infraction.

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- 2 Beginning July 1, 2016, the director of finance shall transmit
- 3 to each county, not more than thirty days after the end of each
- 4 fiscal quarter, all the fines collected for uncontested traffic
- 5 infractions committed in that county that are in excess of
- 6 amounts required by the State to pay the administrative costs of
- 7 the traffic violations bureau. The fines shall be directed to
- 8 the law enforcement agency in the county in which the citations
- 9 were issued.
- 10 (b) This section shall not apply to:
- 11 (1) Fines for violations that occur on off-street parking
- facilities, parks, airports, and harbors that are
- subject to enforcement by the State; and
- 14 (2) Fines for violations that are required by law to be
- paid into a special, revolving, or trust fund of the
- 16 State.
- 17 No county shall be entitled to any portion of the fines
- 18 described in this subsection."
- 19 SECTION 2. Section 291C-171, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 20 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:

1	"(a) All fines and forfeitures collected upon conviction
2	or upon the forfeiture of bail of any person charged with a
3	violation of any section or provision of the state traffic laws
4	and all assessments collected relating to the commission of
5	traffic infractions shall be paid to the director of finance of
6	the State[-]; provided that the judiciary shall identify those
7	fines paid for uncontested traffic infractions as defined in
8	section 291C-A and the disposition of those fines shall be paid
9	to the director of finance and subject to section 291C-B."
10	SECTION 3. Section 291D-6, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
11	amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows:
12	"(b) Provided that the notice of traffic infraction does
13	not require an appearance in person at [+]a[+] hearing as set
14	forth in section $[+]$ 291D-5(d)(10)[$+$], in answering a notice of
15	traffic infraction, a person shall have the following options:
16	(1) Admit the commission of the infraction in one of the
17	following ways:
18	(A) By mail or in person, by completing the
19	appropriate portion of the notice of traffic
20	infraction or preaddressed envelope and
21	submitting it to the authority specified on the

1		notice together with payment of the total amount
2		stated on the notice of traffic infraction.
. 3		Payment by mail shall be in the form of a check,
4		money order, or by an approved credit or debit
5		card. Payment in person shall be in the form of
6		United States currency, check, money order, or by
7		an approved credit or debit card; or
8		(B) Via the Internet or by telephone, by submitting
9		payment of the total amount stated on the notice
10		of traffic infraction. Payment via the Internet
11		or by telephone shall be by an approved credit or
12		debit card;
13	(2)	Deny the commission of the infraction and request a
14		hearing to contest the infraction by completing the
15		appropriate portion of the notice of traffic
16		infraction or preaddressed envelope and submitting it,
17		either by mail or in person, to the authority
18		specified on the notice. In lieu of appearing in
19		person at a hearing, the person may submit a written
20		statement of grounds on which the person contests the
21		notice of traffic infraction, which shall be

1		constacted by the court as a statement given in court
2		pursuant to section 291D-8(a); [ex]
3	(3)	Admit the commission of the infraction and request a
4		hearing to explain circumstances mitigating the
5		infraction by completing the appropriate portion of
6		the notice of traffic infraction or preaddressed
7		envelope and submitting it, either by mail or in
8		person, to the authority specified on the notice. In
9		lieu of appearing in person at a hearing, the person
10		may submit a written explanation of the mitigating
11		circumstances, which shall be considered by the court
12		as a statement given in court pursuant to section
13		291D-8(b) [-]; or
14	(4)	Admit the commission of the infraction but without
15		requesting a hearing under paragraph (3), in which
16		case the infraction shall be deemed uncontested;
17		provided that fines paid shall be transmitted to the
18		counties as provided in part of chapter 291C."
19	SECT	ION 4. In codifying the new sections added by section
20	1 of this	Act, the revisor of statutes shall substitute

- 1 appropriate section numbers for the letters used in designating
- 2 the new sections in this Act.
- 3 SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 4 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 5 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2016.
