A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO VETERINARY TECHNICIANS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that veterinary
- 2 technicians are key members of the veterinary health care team,
- 3 second only to licensed veterinarians, who deliver quality
- 4 animal care to the community. In public service, veterinary
- 5 technicians ensure compliance with animal care and control at
- 6 the University of Hawaii, in the animal industry division of the
- 7 department of agriculture, in laboratories, and in the rabies
- 8 quarantine branch of the department of agriculture. Veterinary
- 9 technicians also assist veterinarians to promote and ensure
- 10 animal health at the Honolulu zoo, in the shelter and rescue
- 11 community, in laboratories, and in other veterinary-related
- 12 establishments. In private practice, supervised by licensed
- 13 veterinarians, veterinary technicians assist in managing
- 14 veterinarian practices and veterinary health care teams.
- 15 Highly-trained veterinary technicians also assist veterinarians
- 16 in educating the staff and public and provide hands-on quality
- 17 veterinary medical and surgical services.



1	The legislature further finds that although students must				
2	travel to the continental United States to seek a doctorate of				
3	veterinary medicine, Hawaii has a successful veterinary				
4	technician program at Windward community college that has been				
5	accredited by the American Veterinary Medical Association since				
6	2013. The program enjoys ongoing popularity and outstanding				
7	success and its graduates are easily placed in gainful				
8	employment.				
9	Currently, Hawaii is the last state to recognize veterinary				
10	technicians as bona fide health professionals. Accordingly, the				
11	legislature concludes that veterinary technicians should be				
12	registered by the department of commerce and consumer affairs to				
13	ensure the continuing delivery of quality veterinary service to				
14	the community and protect animal welfare.				
15	The purpose of this Act is to recognize the important role				
16	veterinary technicians play in the level of care of animals in				
17	the State by:				
18	(1) Beginning July 1, 2018, establishing requirements for				
19	the regulation of veterinary technicians and the				
20	practice of veterinary technology; and				

Establishing registration requirements and limitations (2) 1 on use of titles for veterinary technicians. 2 SECTION 2. The Hawaii Revised Statutes is amended by 3 adding a new chapter to be appropriately designated and to read 4 5 as follows: 6 "CHAPTER VETERINARY TECHNOLOGY PRACTICE 7 -1 Definitions. As used in this chapter: 8 "Department" means the department of commerce and consumer 9 10 affairs. "Intubate" means to pass a tube into the trachea for 11 purposes of anesthesia and airway maintenance. 12 13 "Monitor" means to evaluate patient health by tracking 14 vital signs via physical examination and multi-parameter 15 monitors in order to recognize abnormalities while an animal is 16 under anesthesia. "Practice of veterinary technology" includes but is not 17 limited to the following procedures only under the direct 18 supervision of a licensed veterinarian: 19 20 Monitoring anesthesia; (1) 21 (2) Intubating;

1	(3) Performing dental cleaning;
2	(4) Creating a relief hold in the skin to facilitate
3	placement of an intravenous catheter; and
4	(5) Practice and laboratory management activities.
5	§ -2 Practice of veterinary technology; qualifications;
6	registration required. (a) No person shall represent,
7	announce, or advertise oneself, publicly or privately, as a
8	veterinary technician or registered veterinary technician, or
9	shall append the letters "RVT" or "VT" or affix any other words
10	letters, abbreviations, or insignia to the person's name
11	indicating or implying that the person is engaged in the
12	practice of veterinary technology, unless the person:
13	(1) Registers the person's name and business address
14	biennially with the department in a manner prescribed
15	by the department; and
16	(2) Meets the qualifications of section -3.
17	(b) The department shall maintain and biennially update a
18	list of the names and business addresses of the veterinary
19	technicians who are registered pursuant to subsection (a).
20	(c) Nothing in this chapter shall be construed to prohibi
21	a licensed veterinarian from utilizing support or auxiliary

1	personnel to assist in the practice of veterinary medicine;		
2	provided that the support or auxiliary personnel shall work		
3	under the direct supervision of a licensed veterinarian.		
4	(d) A registration granted under this chapter shall mean		
5	that the person has met the requirements, including minimum		
6	practice standards, to provide protection to the public and is		
7	permitted to use the title of veterinary technician or		
8	registered veterinary technician and engage in the practice of		
9	veterinary technology.		
10	§ -3 Veterinary technician qualifications. No applicant		
11	shall be registered to engage in the practice of veterinary		
12	technology unless the applicant:		
13	(1) Is at least eighteen years of age;		
14	(2) Has successfully passed the Veterinary Technician		
15	National Examination; and		
16	(3) Meets at least one of the following conditions:		
17	(A) Has successfully completed a course of study at a		
18	program for veterinary technology accredited by		
19	the American Veterinary Medical Association		
20	Committee on Veterinary Technician Education and		
21	Activities;		

1	(B)	Is a licensed, certified, or registered	
2		veterinary technician in good standing in another	
3		state having standards for registration	
4		comparable to those in this State; or	
5	(C)	Prior to July 1, 2021, submits a notarized	
6		document from an employer who is a licensed	
7		veterinarian and who certifies that the applicant	
8		has five years or more of practical experience in	
9		Hawaii; provided that no reciprocity shall be	
10		given for practical experience gained outside of	
11		the State.	
12	Before an	y applicant shall be eligible for registration	
13	under this chapter, the applicant shall file an application in		
14	form as shall	be prescribed by the department and pay to the	
15	department of	commerce and consumer affairs an application fee	
16	and all other applicable fees."		
17	SECTION 3	. Upon the issuance of a new registration under	
18	section 2 of t	his Act and at each registration renewal period,	
19	each veterinar	y technician shall pay, in additional to the	
20	registration f	ee or renewal fee, a surcharge of \$100, which	
21	shall be maint	ained in a separate account within the compliance

- 1 resolution fund established pursuant to section 26-9(o), Hawaii
- 2 Revised Statutes. At the end of each quarter, the moneys
- 3 contained in the separate account established pursuant to this
- 4 section shall be transferred to the compliance resolution fund
- 5 until such time that the total transferred amounts equal the
- 6 amount appropriated in section 4 of this Act. Thereafter, no
- 7 surcharge shall be assessed, and any funds in excess of the
- 8 amount appropriated in section 4 of this Act shall be deposited
- 9 into the compliance resolution fund.
- 10 SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the compliance
- 11 resolution fund established pursuant to section 26-9(o), Hawaii
- 12 Revised Statutes, the sum of \$95,000 or so much thereof as may
- 13 be necessary for fiscal year 2016-2017 to implement the
- 14 registration of veterinary technicians as required by this Act.
- 15 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 16 commerce and consumer affairs for the purposes of this Act.
- 17 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2016;
- 18 provided that section 2 shall take effect on July 1, 2018.
