A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO MOTOR VEHICLE INSPECTIONS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 To optimize the effectiveness of highway safety programs,
- 2 the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration recommends
- 3 that each state have a program for periodic safety inspections
- 4 of all registered motor vehicles. Inspections are intended to
- 5 reduce the number of unsafe vehicles on the road. The
- 6 legislature agrees that inspections are necessary to ensure
- 7 vehicles are in working order, ultimately increasing safety for
- 8 all who use the roadways.
- 9 Data from a report released in August of 2015 by the United
- 10 States Government Accountability Office (GAO) found that only
- 11 sixteen states currently require periodic motor vehicle safety
- 12 inspections. Of those sixteen states, Hawaii is one of eleven
- 13 that require inspections to be conducted on an annual basis,
- 14 while five states require inspections to be conducted on either
- 15 a biennial or other basis. The results of the GAO study reveal
- 16 that the existence of annual motor vehicle inspection programs
- 17 does not produce conclusive evidence of improving vehicle safety



- 1 conditions. Crash rates before and after the elimination of
- 2 motor vehicles safety inspection programs varied little from
- 3 year to year following the elimination of inspection programs.
- 4 The legislature finds that the current annual inspection
- 5 program is an undue hardship to Hawaii's residents, especially
- 6 those in rural areas. The recent decrease in availability of
- 7 safety inspectors and limited hours of business by inspection
- 8 operators favors a shift from annual to biennial inspections.
- 9 However, the legislature does not intend to permit an increase
- 10 in the fees collected for inspection services performed on a
- 11 biennial schedule.
- 12 The purpose of this Act is to amend the requirement that
- 13 motorists obtain an annual inspection to a biennial inspection.
- 14 SECTION 2. Section 286-26, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 15 amended to read as follows:
- 16 "\$286-26 Certificates of inspection. (a) The following
- 17 vehicles shall be certified as provided in subsection (e) once
- 18 every year:
- 19 (1) Trucks, truck-tractors, semitrailers, and pole
- 20 trailers having a gross vehicle weight rating of more
- 21 than 10,000 pounds;

- 1 (2) Buses; Rental or U-drive motor vehicles two years of age or 2 (3) older; and 3 4 (4)Taxicabs. 5 Ambulances shall be certified as provided in subsection (e) once 6 every six months. All other vehicles, including motorcycles, trailers, 7 8 semitrailers, and pole trailers having a gross vehicle weight rating of 10,000 pounds or less, and antique motor vehicles as 9 10 defined in section 249-1, except those in subsections (c) and 11 (d), shall be certified as provided in subsection (e) every 12 [twelve] twenty-four months; provided that any vehicle to which 13 this subsection applies-shall not require inspection within-two 14 years of the date on which the vehicle was first sold. 15 (c) Any vehicle that has been involved in an accident shall be certified as provided in subsection (e) before it is 16 operated again if: 17
- 18 (1) It is determined by a police officer or an insurer

 19 that the vehicle's equipment has been damaged so as to

 20 render the vehicle unsafe; or
- 21 (2) It is rebuilt or restored.

2 of a temporary or permanent registration by the director of 3 finance and prior to the transfer of any registration; provided 4 that this requirement shall not apply to a subsequent transfer 5 of registration in a vehicle that carries a current certificate 6 of inspection. 7 Upon application for a certificate of inspection to be 8 issued for a vehicle, an inspection as prescribed by the 9 director under subsection (g) shall be conducted on the vehicle, 10 and if the vehicle is found to be in a safe operating condition, 11 a certificate of inspection shall be issued upon payment of a 12 fee to be determined by the director. The certificate shall state the effective date, the termination date, the name of the 13 14 issuing insurance carrier, and the policy number of the motor 15 vehicle insurance identification card for the inspected motor 16 vehicle as specified by section 431:10C-107 or state the 17 information contained in the proof of insurance card as 18 specified by section 431:10G-106. A sticker, authorized by the 19 director, shall be affixed to the vehicle at the time a 20 certificate of inspection is issued. An inspection sticker 21 which has been lost, stolen, or destroyed shall be replaced

(d) Every vehicle shall be certified prior to the issuance

- 1 without reinspection by the inspection station that issued the
- 2 original inspection sticker upon presentation of the vehicle's
- 3 current certificate of inspection; provided that the current
- 4 certificate of inspection and inspection sticker shall not have
- 5 expired at the time the replacement is requested. The director
- 6 shall adopt rules to determine the fee for replacement of lost,
- 7 stolen, or destroyed inspection stickers.
- **8** (f) The operator of an official inspection station shall
- 9 pay, from the fee in subsection (e), an amount to be determined
- 10 by rules adopted pursuant to chapter 91 to the director of
- 11 transportation. This amount shall be expended only for
- 12 administration and enforcement of the periodic motor vehicle
- 13 inspection program. The funds collected pursuant to this
- 14 subsection shall be deposited into the highway special fund.
- 15 (q) The director of transportation shall adopt necessary
- 16 rules for the administration of inspections and the issuance of
- 17 certificates of inspection.
- 18 (h) This section shall not apply to:
- 19 (1) Any motor vehicle which is covered by part XI,
- 20 governing safety of motor carrier vehicle operation
- 21 and equipment; provided that the rules adopted

1	pursuant to part IA impose standards of inspection at
2	least as strict as those imposed under subsection (g)
3	and that certification is required at least as often
4	as provided in subsections (a), (b), (c), and (d); and
5	(2) Aircraft servicing vehicles that are being used
6	exclusively on lands set aside to the department of
7	transportation for airport purposes.
8	(i) As part of the inspection required by this section,
9	the owner of the vehicle to be inspected shall produce and
10	display the motor vehicle insurance identification card for the
11	inspected motor vehicle required by section 431:10C-107 or the
12	proof of insurance card required by section 431:10G-106. If no
13	card is displayed, then the sticker authorized by the director
14	shall not be affixed to the vehicle and the certificate of
15	inspection shall not be issued."
16	SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
17	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
18	SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
