# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO MOTOR VEHICLE INSPECTIONS.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 The legislature finds that motor vehicle 2 inspections are necessary to ensure vehicles are in working order, ultimately increasing safety for all who use the 3 4 To optimize the effectiveness of highway safety

programs, the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration 5

6 recommends that each state have a program for periodic safety

inspections of all registered motor vehicles. Inspections are 7

8 intended to reduce the number of unsafe vehicles on the road.

States Government Accountability Office (GAO) found that only sixteen states currently require periodic motor vehicle safety inspections. Of those sixteen states, Hawaii is one of eleven

that require inspections to be conducted on an annual basis,

14 while five states require inspections to be conducted on either

a biennial or other basis. The results of the GAO study reveal 15

that annual motor vehicle inspection programs do not produce 16

17 conclusive evidence of improving vehicle safety conditions.

- 1 safety inspection programs varied little from year to year
- 2 following the elimination of inspection programs.
- 3 The legislature further finds that the current annual
- 4 inspection program is an undue hardship to many of Hawaii's
- 5 residents, especially those in rural areas. The recent decrease
- 6 in availability of safety inspectors and limited business hours
- 7 of inspection operators favors a shift from annual to biennial
- 8 inspections. However, the legislature does not intend to permit
- 9 an increase in the fees collected for inspection services
- 10 performed on a biennial schedule.
- 11 The purpose of this Act is to require that motorists obtain
- 12 a biennial motor vehicle inspection rather than an annual
- 13 inspection.
- 14 SECTION 2. Section 286-26, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 15 amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows:
- 16 "(b) All other vehicles, including motorcycles, trailers,
- 17 semitrailers, and pole trailers having a gross vehicle weight
- 18 rating of 10,000 pounds or less, and antique motor vehicles as
- 19 defined in section 249-1, except those in subsections (c) and
- 20 (d), shall be certified as provided in subsection (e) every
- 21 [twelve] twenty-four months[7-provided that any vehicle to which

- 1 this subsection applies shall not require inspection within two
- 2 years of the date on which the vehicle was first sold ]."
- 3 SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 4 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 5 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
