## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO A LAW ENFORCEMENT EMPLOYMENT STANDARDS AND TRAINING BOARD.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that Hawaii is the only
- 2 state in the country without a statewide board for law
- 3 enforcement employment standards or training. Given the immense
- 4 power and authority that the State and counties grant to police,
- 5 sheriffs, and other law enforcement officers who carry firearms,
- 6 it is important to establish recommended statewide standards for
- 7 these officers. These standards will benefit county and state
- 8 departments and agencies, as well as the general public.
- Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to establish an
- 10 advisory law enforcement employment standards and training board
- 11 responsible for recommending statewide standards for employment
- 12 and training to be implemented by state and county government
- 13 agencies for their law enforcement officers who carry firearms
- 14 and wear badges.

1	SECTION 2. The Hawaii Revised Statutes is amended by		
2	adding a new chapter to be appropriately designated and to read		
3	as follows:		
4	"CHAPTER		
5	ADVISORY LAW ENFORCEMENT EMPLOYMENT STANDARDS AND TRAINING BOARD		
6	§ -1 Definitions. As used in this chapter, unless the		
7	context clearly indicates otherwise, the following terms shall		
8	mean as follows:		
9	"Advisory board" means the advisory law enforcement		
10	employment standards and training board.		
11	"Law enforcement officer" means:		
12	(1) A police officer employed by a county police		
13	department who wears a badge and carries a firearm;		
14	(2) A public safety officer employed by the department of		
15	public safety who wears a badge and carries a firearm;		
16	(3) An employee of the department of transportation or the		
17	department of land and natural resources who wears a		
18	badge and carries a firearm; or		
19	(4) An employee of a government agency's vendor or		
20	contractor who is permitted to wear a badge and carry		
21	a firearm.		

1	<b>§</b>	-2 Creation of advisory law enforcement employment
2	standards	and training board; composition. (a) There is
3	created in	n the department of the attorney general, for
4	administra	ative purposes only, the advisory law enforcement
5	employmen	t standards and training board. The advisory board
6	shall con	sist of the following voting members:
7	(1)	The state sheriff or the sheriff's designee;
8	(2)	Two members of the public not currently employed by a
9		government agency, one of whom shall have a background
10		in criminal justice, who shall be appointed by the
11		governor, in accordance with section 26-34;
12	(3)	Two members of the public not currently employed by a
13		government agency, one of whom shall have a legal
14		background, who shall be appointed by the governor
15		from a list of two nominees submitted by the president
16		of the senate; and
17	(4)	Two members of the public not currently employed by a
18		government agency, one of whom shall have a background
19		in human resources management, who shall be appointed
20		by the governor from a list of two nominees submitted

by the speaker of the house of representatives.

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- 1 In addition, the governor shall invite the chiefs of police
- 2 of the four counties or their designees to be voting members of
- 3 the advisory board.
- 4 (b) The terms of the members shall end on June 30, 2021.
- 5 (c) The advisory board shall select a chairperson from
- 6 among its members; provided that the chairperson shall not be a
- 7 current law enforcement officer.
- 8 (d) When a vacancy occurs on the advisory board, the
- 9 successor shall be appointed in the same manner as the
- 10 predecessor member who vacated a position on the advisory board.
- 11 § -3 Duties. (a) Between January 1, 2017, and
- 12 September 30, 2018, the advisory board shall hold meetings at
- 13 least once every quarter; provided that the meetings shall be
- 14 open to the public in accordance with chapter 92.
- 15 (b) By January 7, 2019, the advisory board shall propose
- 16 recommendations for statewide employment standards and training
- 17 for law enforcement officers who wear badges and carry firearms.
- 18 The proposed standards and training recommendations may include
- 19 but not be limited to age requirements, education requirements,
- 20 criminal background checks, hearing tests, eye examinations,
- 21 psychological tests, physical ability tests, and other

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- 1 requirements necessary to become a law enforcement officer. The
- 2 advisory board may work or collaborate with existing law
- 3 enforcement agencies to develop the proposed employment
- 4 standards and training recommendations. The advisory board
- 5 shall make the proposed standards and training recommendations
- 6 available for public review and comment for a period of not less
- 7 than ninety days. The advisory board shall hold at least two
- 8 public hearings on the proposed standards and training
- 9 recommendations by March 31, 2019.
- 10 (c) After the period of public review and comment, the
- 11 advisory board shall adopt final statewide employment standards
- 12 and training recommendations and transmit them to relevant
- 13 government agencies by July 31, 2019.
- (d) Beginning July 31, 2019, the advisory board shall meet
- 15 at least twice a year to review the statewide employment
- 16 standards and training recommendations and extent of
- 17 implementation by the relevant government agencies.
- 18 § -4 Employment standards and training recommendations;
- 19 voluntary implementation. Each government agency may
- 20 voluntarily implement the employment standards and training

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- 1 recommendations for its law enforcement officers who wear badges
- 2 and carry firearms.
- 3 § -5 No county mandate. Nothing in this chapter shall
- 4 be construed to require a political subdivision of this State to
- 5 undertake a new program or increase the level of service of an
- 6 existing program that would require cost sharing by the State
- 7 under article VIII, section 5, of the Constitution of the State
- 8 of Hawaii.
- 9 If any provision of this chapter is deemed to be such a
- 10 mandate upon a political subdivision, the provision shall be
- 11 void and no longer in effect.
- 12 § -6 Termination of advisory board. On June 30, 2021,
- 13 the advisory board shall terminate."
- 14 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
- 15 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much
- 16 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2016-2017 for the
- 17 operation of the advisory law enforcement employment standards
- 18 and training board.
- 19 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 20 the attorney general for the purposes of this Act.

- 1 SECTION 4. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
- 2 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
- 3 begun before its effective date.
- 4 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on January 7, 2059,
- 5 and shall be repealed on June 30, 2021.

#### Report Title:

Advisory Law Enforcement Employment Standards and Training Board; Law Enforcement Employment Standards and Training Recommendations; Appropriation

#### Description:

Establishes a temporary advisory law enforcement employment standards and training board with the responsibility of developing statewide employment standards and training recommendations for law enforcement officers who carry firearms and wear a badge. Allows the relevant government agencies to voluntarily implement the employment standards and training recommendations. (SB2755 HD1)

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
