## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE DEPARTMENT OF BUSINESS, ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT, AND TOURISM.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 201-72, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 2 amended to read as follows:
- 3 "\$201-72 Office of aerospace development; establishment.
- 4 (a) There is established an office of aerospace development in
- 5 the department of business, economic development, and tourism.
- 6 [(b) The director shall have experience, knowledge, and
- 7 expertise in space related activities and development. The
- 8 director shall be nominated and appointed by the governor
- 9 without regard to chapter 76.
- 10 (c) The director shall hire staff necessary to carry out
- 11 the purposes of this part.
- 12 (d) The director and employees of the office shall be
- 13 included in any benefit-program generally applicable to the
- 14 officers and employees of the State.]
- 15 (b) Subject to funding, the office of aerospace
- 16 development may hire an executive director with an annual salary
- of up to \$100,000, a business development officer with an annual



- 1 salary of up to \$80,000, a program manager with an annual salary
- 2 of up to \$70,000, and administrative support with an annual
- 3 salary of up to \$48,000. The executive director shall be
- 4 appointed by the governor, and the other positions shall be
- 5 civil service positions.
- 6 (c) The executive director and employees of the office
- 7 shall be included in any benefit program generally applicable to
- 8 the officers and employees of the State."
- 9 SECTION 2. Section 201-76, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 10 amended to read as follows:
- "[+]\$201-76[+] Pacific international space center for
- 12 exploration systems. (a) There is established the Pacific
- international space center for exploration systems [-] division,
- 14 to be under the direction of the office of aerospace
- 15 development, and to be administratively attached to the office
- 16 of aerospace development in the department of business, economic
- 17 development, and tourism. This division of the office of
- 18 aerospace development shall be located on the island of Hawaii.
- 19 [\(\frac{b}{-}\) The space-center may employ, subject to chapter 76,
- 20 technical experts and officers, agents, and employees, permanent
- 21 and temporary, as required. The space center may also employ

1 officers, agents, and employees, prescribe their duties and 2 qualifications, and fix their salaries, without regard to 3 chapter 76, when in the determination of the board, the services 4 to be performed by those employed are unique and essential to 5 the execution of the functions of the space center.] 6 (b) Pacific international space center for exploration 7 systems employees shall promote and market Hawaii as an aerospace and aviation destination for research and development, 8 9 shall actively solicit aerospace and aviation businesses to 10 establish facilities or work offices in Hawaii, shall work with 11 government agencies on aerospace and aviation related projects, 12 and shall encourage direct and indirect job creation related to aerospace, aviation, technology, and robotics. 13 14 (c) Subject to funding, the Pacific international space 15 center for exploration systems may hire an administrator with an 16 annual salary up to \$82,000, a business development officer with 17 an annual salary up to \$70,000, a program specialist with an 18 annual salary up to \$60,000, and administrative support with an 19 annual salary up to \$48,000. The administrator shall be 20 appointed by the governor; the other positions shall be civil 21 service positions."

14	SECTION 7. There is appropriated out of the general
15	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
16	much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2016-2017 for
17	the purposes of this Act, including the hiring of personnel for
18	the office of aerospace development and the Pacific
19	international space center for exploration systems.

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The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of business, economic development, and tourism for the purposes of this Act.

SECTION 8. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

SECTION 9. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2017; provided that section 7 shall take effect July 1, 2016.

### Report Title:

Pacific International Space Center for Exploration Systems Division; PISCES; Office of Aerospace Development; Appropriation

#### Description:

Allows, subject to funding, the office of aerospace development to hire various positions. Establishes PISCES as a division of the office of aerospace development that is to be located on the island of Hawaii. Directs the PISCES staff to promote and market Hawaii as a research destination and allows PISCES to hire various positions, subject to funding. Amends the board of directors of PISCES to seven members and amends their powers and duties. Transfers various duties of the PISCES executive director to PISCES staff. Simplifies PISCES' annual report to just a summary of significant accomplishments and activities, and also status of the development of partnerships. Effective '7/1/2017. (SD1)

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
