A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO NATIVE HAWAIIAN BURIALS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. (a) There is established within the department 2 of land and natural resources for administrative purposes an iwi 3 reinterment working group. 4 The working group shall elect a chair from among its 5 members and adopt rules and procedures as needed. The working group shall consist of the following members: 6 (1) One representative from the state historic 7 preservation division; 8 9 (2) One representative from the office of Hawaiian 10 affairs; 11 (3) One representative from the Kaho'olawe island reserve 12 commission: One representative from the Protect Kaho'olawe 'Ohana; 13 (4)14 (5) One representative from the aha moku advisory 15 committee; 16 (6) One representative from the Association of Hawaiian 17 Civic Clubs; and

- 3 (c) The working group shall create a process to select and
- 4 reinter Native Hawaiian remains in the possession of the State,
- 5 whose provenience is unknown, or in other special circumstances,
- 6 on the island of Kaho'olawe. The working group shall determine
- 7 the annual costs of such a reinterment process, including the
- 8 costs of reinterment and monitoring and stewardship of the
- 9 burial area.
- 10 (d) The members of the working group shall serve without
- 11 compensation but shall be reimbursed for expenses, including
- 12 travel expenses, necessary for the performance of their duties.
- (e) The working group shall submit a report of its
- 14 findings and recommendations to the legislature no later than
- 15 twenty days prior to the convening of the regular session of
- 16 2017.
- 17 (f) The working group shall be dissolved on June 30, 2017.
- 18 SECTION 2. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
