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# A BILL FOR AN ACT

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RELATING TO AGRICULTURE.

**BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:**

1       SECTION 1. The legislature finds that agricultural theft  
2 and vandalism is a constant worry for farmers and ranchers.  
3 Given the broad acreage that many farming and ranching  
4 operations encompass, it is often difficult for farmers and  
5 ranchers to police their entire operations at all times.  
6 Furthermore, vigilance at night after work hours may be  
7 challenging because not all farmers and ranchers are able to  
8 live on or near the fields where they work. All of these  
9 factors make agricultural operations easy prey for theft or  
10 vandalism.

11       The legislature also finds that the county of Hawaii is  
12 known as the breadbasket of the State. However, agricultural  
13 theft and vandalism has been a constant threat for farmers and  
14 ranchers on the island, increasing the cost of production and  
15 making it more difficult for farming and ranching operations to  
16 be successful.



1       The purpose of this Act is to establish a two-year  
2   agricultural theft pilot project to focus on investigating and  
3   prosecuting agricultural theft and vandalism in the county of  
4   Hawaii.

5       SECTION 2. (a) The department of agriculture shall:

6       (1) Establish a two-year agricultural theft and vandalism  
7       pilot project to focus on investigating and  
8       prosecuting agricultural theft and agricultural  
9       vandalism;

10      (2) Partner with the county of Hawaii to hire an  
11      enforcement officer within the prosecuting attorney's  
12      office; and

13      (3) No later than January 1, 2018, assess the  
14      implementation of the pilot project, including the  
15      pilot project's effectiveness for:

16      (A) Identifying the number of convictions for  
17      agricultural theft and agricultural vandalism;

18      (B) Identifying best practices for prosecuting  
19      perpetrators of agricultural theft and  
20      agricultural vandalism;



(C) Identifying areas where agricultural theft and agricultural vandalism are most prevalent;

(D) Identifying best practices for preventing agricultural theft and agricultural vandalism; and

(E) Making recommendations for a statewide program to address agricultural theft and agricultural vandalism.

(b) Based on the department of agriculture's assessment of the agricultural theft and vandalism pilot project, the department shall determine whether to continue, expand, or end the pilot project.

(c) The department of agriculture shall submit a report of its findings and recommendations, including any proposed legislation, to the legislature no later than December 31, 2017.

SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$                      or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2016-2017 for the purposes of establishing and implementing a two-year agricultural theft and vandalism pilot project.




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1       The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of  
2 agriculture for the purposes of this Act.


3       SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2016.


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
