A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO BIOSECURITY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the unchecked spread
- 2 of invasive species is one of the greatest threats to Hawaii's
- 3 economy, natural environment, and the health and lifestyle of
- 4 Hawaii's people. Invasive pests can cause millions of dollars
- 5 in crop losses, the extinction of native species, the
- 6 destruction of native forests, the spread of disease, and the
- 7 quarantine of exported agricultural crops.
- 8 Island ecosystems are particularly vulnerable to the
- 9 destructive power of invasive pests. On Guam, the accidental
- 10 introduction of the brown tree snake has resulted in widespread
- 11 devastation. Without natural predators or competition for food,
- 12 brown tree snake populations have grown exponentially, causing
- 13 mass extinction of endemic birds. Where there were once bird
- 14 songs, the forests of Guam are now silent and home to as many as
- 15 fifteen thousand snakes per square mile. The introduction of
- 16 just one new pest like the brown tree snake could change the
- 17 ecological character of the Hawaiian islands forever.

1	Despite the State's ongoing efforts to detect and eradicate
2	invasive species, Hawaii's fragile island ecosystem is
3	constantly at risk from insects, disease-bearing organisms,
4	snakes, weeds, and other invasive pests. The coconut rhinoceros
5	beetle, little fire ant, coffee berry borer, coqui frog, and
6	other introduced invasive species are disrupting the delicate
7	balance of island ecosystems, crowding out native species, and
8	reducing the biodiversity of Hawaii.
9	The department of agriculture has created a biosecurity
10	program to fight invasive species on several fronts by:
11	(1) Administering pre-entry measures to minimize the risk
12	of invasive pests entering the State;
13	(2) Conducting port-of-entry inspections to detect and
14	quarantine or destroy pests upon arrival; and
15	(3) Administering post-entry measures to mitigate the
16	establishment of pests in the State.
17	The department of agriculture has also supported the growth
18	of Hawaii's agriculture industry by attempting to reduce the
19	State's dependency on imported agricultural products that may
20	contain pests. The legislature finds that the department of
21	agriculture's biosecurity program is vital to the public's

1	health and wel	lfare, and th	he department	must fully	execute it	S
2	comprehensive	strategy to	control and	prevent ind	creasing	

- 3 invasive species threats entering and spreading throughout the
- 4 State. While inspections are critical, building local capacity
- 5 to increase the State's ability to stop the entry of high-risk
- 6 products would enhance the State's ability to mitigate and
- 7 manage invasive species. This is vitally important not only to
- 8 protect the fragile environment, but to grow the local
- 9 agricultural industries and to increase levels of self-
- 10 sufficiency and sustainability.
- 11 The purpose of this Act is to:
- 12 (1) Reaffirm the legislature's finding that the

 13 implementation of the department of agriculture's

 14 biosecurity program is vital to the State;
- 15 (2) Authorize the department of agriculture to establish
 16 or participate in public-private partnerships to
 17 enhance the biosecurity program and quarantine
 18 inspection process; provided that department employees
 19 perform the actual inspections;

8	SECT	ION 2. Section 150A-53, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
9	amended t	o read as follows:
10	"[+]:	§150A-53[+] General actions to achieve objectives.
11	(a) To a	chieve the objectives of the biosecurity program, the
12	departmen	t shall plan for and, within available legislative
13	appropria	tions[7] or through funding from other sources,
14	implement	the following:
15	(1)	Work with government agencies and agricultural
16		commodity exporters of other states and countries to
17		establish pre-entry inspection programs under which
18		inbound cargo into the State is inspected at the ports
19		of departure or other points outside the State;
20	(2)	Establish, operate, or participate in operating port-
21		of-entry facilities where multiple government agencies

1	may	inspect, quarantine, fumigate, disinfect, destroy,
2	or e	xclude as appropriate, articles that may harbor
3	pest	s or exclude articles that are prohibited or
4	rest	ricted without a permit, with the goals of:
5	(A)	Performing inspections in an efficient,
6	•	effective, and expeditious manner for the
7		government agencies involved and for cargo
8		owners, carriers, and importers; [and]
9	(B)	Providing for the proper and safe storage and
10		handling of cargo, especially agricultural and
11		food commodities, awaiting inspection; and
12	<u>(C)</u>	Establishing or participating in public-private
13		partnerships to enhance the biosecurity program
14		and quarantine inspection process with on-port
15		and off-port facilities, including inspection and
16		treatment facilities, transitional facilities,
17		and consolidation and deconsolidation facilities;
18		provided that actual access to shipping documents
19		is limited to shipping companies and department
20		personnel; provided further that actual
21		inspections shall be performed only by department

1		employees and not private contractors of their
2		employees;
3	(3)	Develop, implement, and coordinate post-entry measures
4		to eradicate, control, reduce, and suppress pests and,
5		as appropriate, eradicate or seize and dispose of
6		prohibited or restricted organisms without a permit
7		that have entered the State;
8	(4)	Collaborate with relevant government agencies,
9		agricultural commodity importers, and other persons to
10		examine and develop joint integrated systems to better
11		implement the biosecurity program;
12	(5)	Improve cargo inspection capabilities and methods,
13		including enhancement of the content and submission
14		requirements for cargo manifests and agricultural
15		commodity ownership and movement certificates;
16	(6)	Promote the production of agricultural commodities in
17		the State to reduce cargo shipments of imported
18		commodities into the State; and
19	(7)	Provide public education on the negative effects of
20		pests and prohibited or restricted organisms without a
21		permit, to the environment and economy of the State.

1	(b)	The department shall adopt rules to establish
2	parameters	and construction requirements for biosecurity
3	facilities	that provide for and ensure the safety of
4	agricultur	al and food commodities consumed by Hawaii residents,
5	including :	for cold storage facilities established by public-
6	private pa	rtnerships to preserve the quality and ensure the
7	safety of	the commodities arriving at the State's airports and
8	harbors."	
9	SECTI	ON 3. There is appropriated out of the general
10	revenues o	f the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
11	much there	of as may be necessary for fiscal year 2016-2017 for
12	the biosec	urity program of the department of agriculture;
13	provided th	hat the sum appropriated shall be used for the
14	following p	projects:
15	(1)	An electronic manifest system for maritime cargo
16	:	inspections;
17	(2)	Import replacement of high risk crops and the
18	(development of systems management to enhance pest
19	ī	management practices;
20	(3)	Research on new generation pesticides and development
21	C	of integrated pest management methods;

1	(4)	Development of quarantine treatment options;
2	(5)	Development and implementation of diagnostics to
3		quickly and reliably identify new and evolving pests
4		and diseases;
5	(6)	Improvement of productivity of inspection capacity;
6		and
7	(7)	Public and agriculture industry education activities.
