A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE PUBLIC UTILITIES COMMISSION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the public utilities
- 2 commission's primary purpose is to ensure that regulated
- 3 companies efficiently and safely provide their customers with
- 4 adequate and reliable services at just and reasonable rates,
- 5 while providing regulated companies with a fair opportunity to
- 6 earn a reasonable rate of return. However, the public utilities
- 7 commission has several long and short term goals that reflect
- 8 the commission's increased work complexity and program
- 9 responsibilities, which go beyond the commission's traditional
- 10 regulatory role, including in the area of energy regulation.
- 11 The legislature further finds that due to these increasing
- 12 responsibilities, it is essential that all areas of the State
- 13 are adequately represented in the commission. Enabling a
- 14 person's island of residence to be used as a criterion when
- 15 determining the person's qualification to serve as a
- 16 commissioner will meet this need.

1	The legislature further finds that advancements in	
2	technolog	y have enabled people to participate and work remotely,
3	without having to be physically present in the same location as	
4	their colleagues. Permitting the use of teleconference or	
5	videoconference technology for certain public hearings before	
6	the public utilities commission will enable commissioners to	
7	participate in public hearings in a convenient manner and be	
8	fully engaged.	
9	The ;	purpose of this Act is to:
10	(1)	Allow a commissioner to attend by teleconference or
11		videoconference a public hearing of the public
12		utilities commission, except for a contested case
13		hearing, if the commissioner resides on an island
14		other than Oahu; and
15	(2)	Allow a commissioner residing on the island of Oahu to
16		attend a public hearing of the commission, except for
17		a contested case hearing, held on an island other than
18		Oahu by teleconference or videoconference;
19	(3)	Enable a member of the commission who is a resident of

a county other than the city and county of Honolulu to

1	receive per diem compensation and be reimbursed for		
2	reasonable transportation and lodging expenses; and		
3	(4) Enable a person's island of residence to be used as a		
4	criterion when determining the person's qualification		
5	to serve as a commissioner.		
6	SECTION 2. Chapter 269, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
7	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated		
8	and to read as follows:		
9	"§269- Hearing attendance by teleconference or video		
10	conference. (a) A commissioner may attend a public hearing of		
11	the public utilities commission by teleconference or		
12	videoconference to allow a commissioner residing on an island		
13	other than Oahu to attend a public hearing of the commission		
14	held on Oahu and a commissioner residing on the island of Oahu		
15	to attend a public hearing of the commission held on an island		
16	other than Oahu, by teleconference or videoconference; provided		
17	that commissioner participation by teleconference or		
18	videoconference shall not be permitted at contested case		
19	hearings.		
20	(b) Each commissioner participating in a public hearing by		
21	teleconference or videoconference shall be considered present at		

- 1 the meeting for purposes of determining quorum and participating
- in all proceedings.
- 3 (c) A public hearing held by teleconference or
- 4 videoconference:
- 5 (1) Need not have a quorum present at any one location;
- 6 and
- 7 · (2) Is subject to the notice requirements under section
- 8 269-12.
- 9 (d) The notice of each teleconference or videoconference
- 10 public hearing shall specify all physical locations from which
- 11 the commissioners will participate.
- 12 (e) The public utilities commission shall adopt rules
- 13 pursuant to chapter 91 to carry out the purposes of this
- 14 section."
- 15 SECTION 3. Section 269-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 16 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:
- 17 "(a) There shall be a public utilities commission of three
- 18 members, to be called commissioners, and who shall be appointed
- 19 in the manner prescribed in section 26-34, except as otherwise
- 20 provided in this section. All members shall be appointed for
- 21 terms of six years each, except that the terms of the members

- 1 first appointed shall be for two, four, and six years,
- 2 respectively, as designated by the governor at the time of
- 3 appointment. A member who is a resident of a county other than
- 4 the city and county of Honolulu shall receive per diem
- 5 compensation for the days on which actual service is rendered at
- 6 a rate of per day and shall be reimbursed for reasonable
- 7 transportation and lodging expenses. The governor shall
- 8 designate a member to be chairperson of the commission. Each
- 9 member shall hold office until the member's successor is
- 10 appointed and qualified. Section 26-34 shall not apply insofar
- 11 as it relates to the number of terms and consecutive number of
- 12 years a member can serve on the commission; provided that no
- 13 member shall serve more than twelve consecutive years.
- In appointing commissioners, the governor shall select
- 15 persons who have had experience in accounting, business,
- 16 engineering, government, finance, law, or other similar fields.
- 17 A person's island of residence may be used as a criterion when
- 18 determining the person's qualification to serve as a
- 19 commissioner. The commissioners shall devote full time to their
- 20 duties as members of the commission and no commissioner shall
- 21 hold any other public office or other employment during the

- 1 commissioner's term of office. No person owning any stock or
- 2 bonds of any public utility corporation, or having any interest
- 3 in, or deriving any remuneration from, any public utility shall
- 4 be appointed a commissioner."
- 5 SECTION 4. New statutory material is underscored.
- 6 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050;
- 7 provided that sections 2 and 3 of this Act shall take effect on
- 8 January 1, 2018.

Report Title:

Public Utilities Commission; Commissioners; Teleconference; Videoconference; Per Diem; Qualifications

Description:

Beginning January 1, 2018, allows a commissioner to attend by teleconference or videoconference a public hearing of the public utilities commission, except for a contested case hearing, including allowing a commissioner who resides on an island other than Oahu to attend a public hearing of the commission held on Oahu and a commissioner residing on the island of Oahu to attend a public hearing of the commission held on an island other than Oahu, by teleconference or videoconference. Enables a member of the commission who is a resident of a county other than the city and county of Honolulu to receive per diem compensation and reimbursed for reasonable travel and lodging expenses. Enables a person's island of residence to be used as a criterion when determining the person's qualification to serve as a commissioner. (SB2776 HD1)
