#### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CONSUMER PROTECTION.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that transportation
- 2 network companies are entities that use a digital network to
- 3 connect riders with a transportation network company driver who
- 4 is offering services using the driver's personal vehicle.
- 5 Transportation network companies have become increasingly
- 6 popular throughout the country, including in Hawaii, and have
- 7 expanded transportation options for the benefit of the public.
- 8 Although the public has been receptive to this innovation in
- 9 transportation services, transportation network companies are
- 10 not currently regulated in Hawaii and therefore, there are no
- 11 consumer protections in place for members of the public who use
- 12 the services of transportation network companies.
- 13 The legislature further finds that concerns have been
- 14 raised about potential gaps in motor vehicle insurance coverage
- 15 associated with transportation network companies. In response
- 16 to these concerns, by the end of 2015, twenty-nine states
- 17 enacted legislation to establish insurance requirements covering
- 18 transportation network companies, thereby protecting



- 1 transportation network company drivers, their passengers, and
- 2 the public.
- 3 The legislature additionally finds that concerns have also
- 4 been raised about certain consumer protection aspects of the
- 5 taxicab industry in Hawaii. The policy of the State is to
- 6 promote safe and reliable privately-owned public passenger
- 7 vehicle service to provide the benefits of that service. In
- 8 furtherance of this policy, minimum consumer protection
- 9 requirements for taxicab companies and taxicab drivers,
- 10 including driver requirements, zero tolerance policies, and
- 11 anti-discrimination policies, should be established at the state
- 12 level and enforced and regulated by the counties. The
- 13 legislature notes that these requirements should also apply to
- 14 transportation network companies, as consumers in Hawaii should
- 15 be confident that similar consumer protections are available,
- 16 regardless of the type of transportation service a consumer
- 17 chooses to use.
- 18 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to establish
- 19 various consumer protection requirements for transportation
- 20 network companies and taxicab companies by:

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3		drivers and issue permits to transportation network

5	(2)	Require transportation network companies to pay an
6		annual airport permit fee to the department of
7		transportation, for purposes of authorizing
8		transportation network company drivers to pick up and
9		discharge riders at airports in the State;
10	(3)	Establish insurance, qualifications, and other
11		requirements for transportation network companies and
12		transportation network company drivers; and
13	(4)	Establish minimum standards for driver qualifications,
14		drug and alcohol policies, and antidiscrimination and
15		accessibility policies for taxicab companies and
16		taxicab drivers operating within each county.
17	SECT	ION 2. Chapter 46, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended
18	by adding	a new part to be appropriately designated and to read
19	as follow	s:
20		"PART . TRANSPORTATION NETWORK COMPANIES
21	§ <b>46</b>	A Definitions. As used in this part:
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1 "Department" means the department of transportation. 2 "Digital network" means any online-enabled application, software, website, or system offered or utilized by a 3 4 transportation network company that enables the prearrangement 5 of rides with transportation network company drivers. "Personal vehicle" means a vehicle that is used by a 6 transportation network company driver and is: 7 8 (1) Owned, leased, or otherwise authorized for use by the transportation network company driver; and 9 Not a taxicab, limousine, or other for-hire vehicle. **10** (2) "Prearranged ride" means the provision of transportation by 11 12 a driver to a rider, beginning when a driver accepts a ride requested by a rider through a digital network controlled by a 13 transportation network company, continuing while the driver 14 transports a requesting rider, and ending when the last 15 16 requesting rider departs from the personal vehicle. A prearranged ride shall not include transportation provided using **17** a taxicab, limousine, or other for-hire vehicle. 18 "Transportation network company" means a corporation, 19 partnership, sole proprietorship, or other entity that operates 20 21 in Hawaii and uses a digital network to connect transportation

7	(c) The department may adjust the fee amount established
8	under subsection (b) through rulemaking subject to chapter 91.
9	(d) The airport permit fees collected under subsections
10	(b) and (c) shall be deposited to the credit of the airports
11	division of the department for purposes of authorizing
12	transportation network company drivers to pick up and discharge
13	riders at airports in the State and ensuring transportation
14	network companies and transportation network company drivers
15	comply with all other applicable department rules regarding
16	motor vehicles for hire picking up and discharging passengers at
17	airports in the State.
18	§46-D Agent. A transportation network company shall
19	maintain an agent in the State for service of process.
20	§46-E Business registration. A transportation network
21	company driver shall register as a business entity with the

- ${f 1}$  business registration division of the department of commerce and
- 2 consumer affairs.
- 3 §46-F Duration of fare; amount charged for fare. (a)
- 4 Transportation network company fare shall be deemed to:
- 5 (1) Commence when a transportation network company driver
- 6 begins to transport a rider in the transportation
- 7 network company driver's personal vehicle; and
- **8** (2) Conclude when the rider exits the transportation
- 9 network company driver's personal vehicle.
- (b) On behalf of a transportation network company driver,
- 11 a transportation network company may charge riders; provided
- 12 that, if a fare is charged, the transportation network company
- 13 shall disclose to riders the fare calculation method on its
- 14 website or within the digital network. The transportation
- 15 network company shall also provide riders with the applicable
- 16 rates being charged and the option to receive an estimated fare
- 17 before the rider enters the transportation network company
- 18 driver's personal vehicle.
- 19 §46-G Identification of vehicles and drivers. In
- 20 accordance with applicable county ordinances or rules, the

- 1 transportation network company's digital network shall display a
- 2 picture of:
- 3 (1) The transportation network company driver; and
- 4 (2) The license plate number of the motor vehicle being
- 5 used for providing the prearranged ride,
- 6 before the rider enters the transportation network company
- 7 driver's vehicle.
- 8 §46-H Electronic receipt. In accordance with applicable
- 9 county ordinances or rules, within a reasonable period of time
- 10 following the completion of a trip, a transportation network
- 11 company shall transmit an electronic receipt to the rider that
- 12 specifies:
- 13 (1) The origin and destination of the trip;
- 14 (2) The total time and distance of the trip;
- 15 (3) An itemization of the total fare paid, if any; and
- 16 (4) The information required by section 46-G.
- 17 §46-I Transportation network company and transportation
- 18 network company driver; insurance requirements. (a) A
- 19 transportation network company and any transportation network
- 20 company driver shall maintain a primary motor vehicle insurance
- 21 policy that meets the requirements of this section.

1	(d)	The primary motor vehicle insurance required under
2	this sect	ion shall recognize that the driver is a transportation
3	network c	ompany driver or otherwise uses a vehicle to transport
4	riders fo	r compensation and covers the driver:
5	(1)	While the driver is logged on to the transportation
6		network company's digital network; or
7	(2)	While the driver is engaged in a prearranged ride.
8	(c)	The primary motor vehicle insurance required under
9	this sect	ion shall include:
10	(1)	Primary liability coverage of not less than \$100,000
11		per person, with an aggregate limit of \$200,000 per
12		accident, for all damages arising out of accidental
13		harm sustained as a result of any one accident and
14		arising out of ownership, maintenance, use, loading,
15		or unloading of a motor vehicle;
16	(2)	Primary liability coverage of not less than \$50,000
17		for all damages arising out of damage to or
18		destruction of property including motor vehicles and
19		including the loss of use thereof, but not including
20		property owned by, being transported by, or in the

charge of the insured, as a result of any one accident

	arising out or ownership, maintenance, use, roading,
	or unloading of the insured vehicle;
(3)	Uninsured and underinsured motorist coverages for the
	transportation network company driver and passengers,
	as set forth in section 431:10C-301, that shall be
	equal to the primary liability limits specified in
	paragraphs (1) and (2); provided that the stacking of
	uninsured and underinsured motorist coverages may be
	rejected in writing as set forth in section 431:10C-
•	301;
(4)	Personal injury protection coverage in an amount that
	meets the requirements of section 431:10C-103.5 and
	shall be equal to or greater than the coverage limits
	for the personal motor vehicle insurance maintained by
	the vehicle's owner and reported to the transportation
	network company; and
(5)	Collision and comprehensive coverage limits for the
	transportation network company driver's vehicle that
	(4)

shall be equal to or greater than the coverage limits

for the personal motor vehicle insurance maintained by

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1		the vehicle's owner and reported to the transportation
2		network company.
3	(d)	The requirements for the coverage specified in
4	subsectio	n (c) may be satisfied by any of the following:
5	(1)	Motor vehicle insurance maintained by a transportation
6		network company driver; provided that the
7		transportation network company verifies that the
8		policy is maintained by the transportation network
9		company driver and is specifically written to cover
10		the transportation network company driver's use of a
11		vehicle in connection with a transportation network
12		company's digital network;
13	(2)	Motor vehicle insurance maintained by a transportation
14		network company; or
15	(3)	Any combination of paragraphs (1) and (2).
16	(e)	The insurer providing insurance under this section
17	shall hav	e the duty to defend and indemnify the insured.
18	(f)	Coverage under a transportation network company
19	insurance	policy shall not be dependent on a personal motor

vehicle insurance policy first denying a claim nor shall a

- personal motor vehicle insurance policy, including a personal
  liability umbrella policy, be required to first deny a claim.
- 3 (g) In every instance where motor vehicle insurance
- 4 maintained by a transportation network company driver to fulfill
- 5 the insurance obligations of this section has lapsed or ceased
- 6 to exist, the transportation network company shall provide the
- 7 coverage required by this section beginning with the first
- 8 dollar of a claim.
- 9 (h) Nothing in this section shall be construed to require
- 10 a personal motor vehicle insurance policy to provide primary or
- 11 excess coverage while the driver is logged on to the
- 12 transportation network company's digital network or is engaged
- 13 in a prearranged ride. While a driver is logged on to the
- 14 transportation network company's digital network or is engaged
- 15 in a prearranged ride, and notwithstanding any other law to the
- 16 contrary, the following shall apply:
- 17 (1) The transportation network company driver's or the
- vehicle owner's personal motor vehicle insurance
- 19 policy shall not be required to provide, nor shall it
- 20 provide, any coverage to any person or entity unless
- 21 the policy expressly provides for that coverage while

1		the driver is logged on to the transportation network
2		company's digital network or is engaged in a
3		prearranged ride, with or without a separate charge,
4		or the policy contains an amendment or endorsement to
5		provide coverage for when the driver is logged on to
6		the transportation network company's digital network
7		or is engaged in a prearranged ride, for which a
8		separately stated premium is charged; and
9	(2)	The transportation network company driver's or the
10		vehicle owner's personal motor vehicle insurance
11		policy shall not have the duty to defend or indemnify
12		for the driver's activities in connection with the
13		transportation network company, unless the policy
14		expressly provides otherwise for when the driver is
15		logged on to the transportation network company's
16		digital network or is engaged in a prearranged ride,
17		with or without a separate charge, or the policy
18		contains an amendment or endorsement to provide
19		coverage for when the driver is logged on to the
20		transportation network company's digital network or is

- engaged in a prearranged ride, for which a separately

  stated premium is charged.
- 3 Notwithstanding any other law to the contrary, a (i) 4 personal motor vehicle insurer may, at its discretion, offer a 5 motor vehicle liability insurance policy, or an amendment or 6 endorsement to an existing policy that covers a private passenger vehicle, station wagon type vehicle, sport utility 7 vehicle, or similar type of vehicle with a passenger capacity of 8 9 eight persons or less, including the driver, while the driver is 10 logged on to the transportation network company's digital 11 network or is engaged in a prearranged ride if the policy 12 expressly provides for coverage when the driver is logged on to the transportation network company's digital network or is 13 engaged in a prearranged ride, with or without a separate 14 charge, or the policy contains an amendment or an endorsement to 15 16 provide coverage when the driver is logged on to the transportation network company's digital network or is engaged **17**
- 20 (j) In a claims coverage investigation, a transportation21 network company or its insurer shall cooperate with insurers

in a prearranged ride, for which a separately stated premium may

- 1 that are involved in the claims coverage investigation to
- 2 facilitate the exchange of information, including the provision
- 3 of dates and times at which an accident occurred that involved a
- 4 transportation network company driver and the precise times that
- 5 the transportation network company driver logged on and off the
- 6 transportation network company's digital network.
- 7 (k) A transportation network company driver of a
- 8 transportation network company shall carry proof of insurance
- 9 coverage as required by this section within the vehicle at all
- 10 times when the vehicle is being used while the driver is logged
- 11 on to the transportation network company's digital network or is
- 12 engaged in a prearranged ride. In the event of an accident, a
- 13 transportation network company driver shall provide this
- 14 insurance coverage information to any other party involved in
- 15 the accident, and to a police officer, upon request. The owner
- 16 of the vehicle may display the motor vehicle insurance
- 17 identification card or the proof of insurance card in electronic
- 18 format on a mobile electronic device, as that term is defined in
- 19 section 291C-137.
- 20 (1) Notwithstanding any other law affecting whether one or
- 21 more policies of insurance that may apply with respect to an

2	the oblig	ations under insurance policies issued to
3	transport	ation network companies and, if applicable,
4	transport	ation network company drivers using a personal vehicle
5	while the	drivers are logged on to the transportation network
6	company's	digital network or are engaged in prearranged rides.
7	§ <b>4</b> 6-	J Disclosures. A transportation network company shall
8	disclose	in writing to transportation network company drivers,
9	before th	e drivers are allowed to accept a request for a
10	prearrang	ed ride on the transportation network company's digital
11	network:	
12	(1)	The insurance coverage, including the types of
13		coverage and limits for each coverage, that the
14		transportation network company provides while the
15		transportation network company driver uses a personal
16		vehicle in connection with a transportation network
17		company's digital network; and
18	(2)	That the transportation network company driver's own
19		motor vehicle insurance policy might not provide any
20		coverage while the driver is logged on to the
21		transportation network company's digital network and

1	is available to receive transportation requests or is
2	engaged in a prearranged ride, depending on the terms
3	of the motor vehicle insurance policy.
4	§46-K Zero tolerance for drug or alcohol use. (a) In
5	addition to any applicable county ordinances or rules, the
6	transportation network company shall implement a zero tolerance
7	policy on the use of drugs or alcohol while a transportation
8	network company driver is providing a prearranged ride or is
9	logged into the transportation network company's digital
10	network, even if not providing a prearranged ride, and shall
11	provide notice of the zero tolerance policy on its website, as
12	well as procedures for reporting a complaint about a driver with
13	whom a rider was matched and who the rider reasonably believes
14	was under the influence of drugs or alcohol during the course of
15	the trip.
16	(b) Upon receipt of a rider complaint alleging a violation
17	of the zero tolerance policy, the transportation network company
18	shall immediately suspend the transportation network company
19	driver's access to the transportation network company's digital
20	network and shall conduct an investigation into the reported
21	incident. The suspension shall last for the duration of the

1	investigation; provided that the investigation shall be
2	conducted in a reasonably expeditious manner.
3	(c) The transportation network company shall maintain
4	records relevant to a reported incident for a period of at least
5	two years from the date that a rider complaint is received by
6	the transportation network company.
7	§46-L Driver requirements. (a) Prior to permitting an
8	individual to act as a transportation network company driver on
9	its digital network, the transportation network company shall:
10	(1) Require the individual to submit an application to the
1	transportation network company, including information
12	regarding the individual's address, age, driver's
13	license, driving history, motor vehicle registration,
14	motor vehicle insurance, and other information
15	required by the transportation network company;
16	(2) Conduct, or have a third party conduct, a local and
17	national criminal background check for each applicant
18	that shall include:
19	(A) Multi-state/Multi-Jurisdiction Criminal Locator
20	or other similar commercial nationwide database
21	with validation (primary source search); and

1		(B) National Sex Offender Registry database;
2	(3)	Obtain and review a traffic violations bureau
3		certified abstract for the individual;
4	(4)	Require the individual to submit evidence of a
5		physical examination to determine the individual's
6		health and fitness to act as a transportation network
7		company driver every four years;
8	(5)	Require the individual to have at least one year of
9		driving experience in Hawaii;
10	(6)	Require the individual to submit fingerprints for
11		analysis by a local law enforcement agency; and
12	(7)	Require the individual to use only a hands free device
13		when engaged in a prearranged ride.
14	(d)	The transportation network company shall not permit an
15	individua	l to act as a transportation network company driver on
16	the trans	portation network company's digital network who:
17	(1)	Has been found to have committed more than three
18		traffic infractions, as defined in section 291D-2, in
19		the prior three-year period, other than traffic
20		infractions involving parking, standing, equipment,
21		and pedestrian offenses;

1	(2)	Has been convicted once in the prior three-year period
2		for the offense of resisting an order to stop a motor
3		vehicle, reckless driving, or driving with a suspended
4		or revoked driver license;
5	(3)	Has been convicted in the prior seven-year period of
6		driving under the influence of drugs or alcohol;
7	(4)	Has been convicted at any time of fraud, any sexual
8		offense, any domestic violence offense, use of a motor
9.		vehicle to commit a felony, or a crime involving
10		property damage, theft, stalking, acts of violence, or
11		acts of terrorism;
12	(5)	Is a match in the National Sex Offender Registry
13		database;
14	(6)	Does not possess a valid driver's license;
15	(7)	Does not possess proof of registration or other
16		authorization for the motor vehicle used to provide
17		prearranged rides;
18	(8)	Does not possess proof of motor vehicle insurance for
19		the motor vehicles used to provide prearranged rides;
20		or .

(9) Is not at least twenty-one years of age.

- 1 (c) The requirements of this section shall be the minimum
- 2 requirements that a transportation network company shall divulge
- 3 to the counties and the department. Nothing in this section
- 4 shall prohibit a transportation network company from adopting
- 5 stricter driver requirements.
- 6 §46-M Vehicle safety. The transportation network company
- 7 shall require that any motor vehicle that a transportation
- 8 network company driver uses to provide prearranged rides meets
- 9 the inspection requirements of section 286-26.
- 10 §46-N No street hails. A transportation network company
- 11 driver shall only accept rides booked through a transportation
- 12 network company's digital network and shall not solicit or
- 13 accept street hails.
- 14 §46-0 No cash trips. The transportation network company
- 15 shall adopt a policy prohibiting solicitation or acceptance of
- 16 cash payments from riders and notify transportation network
- 17 company drivers of the policy. Transportation network company
- 18 drivers shall not solicit or accept cash payments from riders.
- 19 Any payment for prearranged rides shall be made only
- 20 electronically, using the transportation network company's
- 21 digital network.

- 1 §46-P No discrimination; accessibility. (a) The
- 2 transportation network company shall adopt a policy of non-
- 3 discrimination on the basis of destination, race, color,
- 4 national origin, religious belief or affiliation, sex,
- 5 disability, age, sexual orientation, or gender identity with
- 6 respect to riders and potential riders and notify transportation
- 7 network company drivers of the policy.
- 8 (b) A transportation network company shall not impose any
- 9 additional charges for providing services to persons with
- 10 physical disabilities because of those disabilities.
- 11 (c) A transportation network company shall provide riders
- 12 an opportunity to indicate whether they require a wheelchair-
- 13 accessible vehicle. If a transportation network company cannot
- 14 arrange a wheelchair-accessible prearranged ride in any
- 15 instance, the transportation network company shall direct the
- 16 rider to an alternate provider of wheelchair-accessible service,
- 17 if available.
- (d) Transportation network company drivers shall comply
- 19 with all applicable laws regarding non-discrimination against
- 20 riders or potential riders on the basis of destination, race,

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1	color, national origin, religious belief or affiliation, sex,
2	disability, age, sexual orientation, or gender identity.
3	(e) Transportation network company drivers shall comply
4	with all applicable laws relating to accommodation of service
5	animals.
6	§46-Q Records. (a) A transportation network company
7	shall maintain:

- (1) Electronic records of each prearranged ride provided by a transportation network company driver for at least one year from the date each prearranged ride was provided; and
- 12 (2) Transportation network company driver records at least

  13 until the one year anniversary of the date on which a

  14 transportation network company driver's activation on

  15 the transportation network company digital network has

  16 ended.
- (b) A transportation network company shall make the records in subsection (a) available for inspection, upon request by a county or the department.

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1	§46-R Personally identifiable information. (a) A
2	transportation network company shall not disclose a rider's
3	personally identifiable information to a third party unless:
4	(1) The rider consents;
5	(2) Disclosure, including disclosure to the counties or
6	the department, is required by law; or
7	(3) Disclosure is required to protect or defend the terms
8	of use of the service or to investigate violations of
9	those terms.
10	(b) A transportation network company may share a rider's
11	name or telephone number with the transportation network compan
12	driver providing a prearranged ride to the rider in order to
13	facilitate correct identification of the rider by the
14	transportation network company driver or to facilitate
15	communication between the rider and the transportation network
16	company driver.
17	§46-S Controlling authority. Notwithstanding any other
18	provision of law, transportation network companies and
19	transportation network company drivers shall be regulated by
20	this part, any rules adopted pursuant to this part by the

department pursuant to chapter 91, and any ordinances or rules

1	adopted by	y the countles. Nothing in this part shall prevent a
2	county fro	om imposing stricter requirements on a transportation
3	network c	ompany or a transportation network company driver."
4	SECT	ION 3. Section 46-16.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
5	amended to	o read as follows:
6	"§ <b>4</b> 6	-16.5 Public passenger vehicle regulation. (a) The
7	legislatu	re finds and declares the following:
8	(1)	The orderly regulation of vehicular traffic on the
9		streets and highways of Hawaii is essential to the
10		welfare of the State and its people;
11	(2)	Privately-operated public passenger vehicle service
12		provides vital transportation links within the State.
13		Public passenger vehicle service operated in the
14		counties enables the State to provide the benefits of
15		privately-operated, demand-responsive transportation
16		services to its people and to persons who travel to
17		the State for business or tourist purposes;
18	(3)	The economic viability and stability of privately-
19		operated public passenger vehicle service is
20		consequently a matter of statewide importance;

1	(4)	The policy of the State is to promote safe and
2		reliable privately-operated public passenger vehicle
3		service to provide the benefits of that service. In
4		furtherance of this policy, the legislature recognizes
5		and affirms that the regulation of privately-operated
6		public passenger vehicle service is an essential
7		governmental function;
8	(5)	The policy of the State is to require that counties
9		regulate privately-operated public passenger vehicle
10		service and not subject a county or its officers to
11		liability under the federal antitrust laws;
12	(6)	The policy of the State is to further promote
13		privately-operated public passenger vehicle service,
14		including but not limited to, the picking up and
15		discharge of passengers from various unrelated
16		locations by taxicabs; and
17	(7')	The policy of the State is to further promote

#### Report Title:

Consumer Protection; Transportation Network Companies; Transportation Network Company Drivers; Permit; Fee; Taxicab Companies; Taxicab Drivers; Requirements; Qualifications; Insurance; Policies

#### Description:

Requires the counties to regulate transportation network companies and transportation network company drivers and issue permits to transportation network companies. Requires transportation network companies to pay an annual airport permit fee to the department of transportation, for purposes of authorizing transportation network company drivers to pick up and discharge riders at airports in the State. Establishes insurance, qualifications, and other requirements for transportation network companies and transportation network company drivers. Establishes minimum standards for driver qualifications, drug and alcohol policies, and antidiscrimination and accessibility policies for taxicab companies and taxicab drivers operating within each county. (SD1)

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
