### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE STATE FOUNDATION ON CULTURE AND THE ARTS.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 9-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 2 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:
- 3 "(a) There is hereby created a state foundation on culture
- 4 and the arts, which shall be placed within the creative
- 5 industries division of the department of [accounting and general
- 6 services] business, economic development, and tourism for
- 7 administrative purposes."
- 8 SECTION 2. Section 103-8.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 9 amended by amending subsections (d) to (f) to read as follows:
- 10 "(d) The [comptroller] director of business, economic
- 11 development, and tourism and the state foundation on culture and
- 12 the arts shall decide on the specific art objects to acquire,
- 13 giving first consideration to placing appropriate pieces of art
- 14 at the locations of the original appropriation.
- 15 The selection of, commissioning artists for, reviewing of
- 16 design, execution, and placement of, and the acceptance of works
- 17 of art shall be the responsibility of the [comptroller] director

9	(1)	Provide each agency receiving capital improvement
10		appropriations with information regarding items that
11		shall be included and excluded from the one per cent
12		amount;
13	(2)	Ensure that each agency calculates its one per cent
14		amount correctly; and
15	(3)	Ensure that each agency transfers the correct amount
16		to the works of art special fund in a timely manner.
17	(f)	The [comptroller] director of business, economic
18	developme	nt, and tourism and the executive director shall track
19	amounts d	ue from each agency under the one per cent requirement

as provided in this section."

SECTION 3. All rights, powers, functions, and duties of 1 the department of department of accounting and general services 2 relating to the state foundation on culture and the arts are 3 transferred to the department of business, economic development, 4 5 and tourism. All employees who occupy civil service positions and whose 6 7 functions are transferred to the department of business, 8 economic development, and tourism by this Act shall retain their 9 civil service status, whether permanent or temporary. Employees shall be transferred without loss of salary, seniority (except 10 as prescribed by applicable collective bargaining agreements), 11 12 retention points, prior service credit, any vacation and sick leave credits previously earned, and other rights, benefits, and 13 privileges, in accordance with state personnel laws and this 14 Act; provided that the employees possess the minimum 15 16 qualifications and public employment requirements for the class or position to which transferred or appointed, as applicable; 17 provided further that subsequent changes in status may be made 18 pursuant to applicable civil service and compensation laws. 19 Any employee who, prior to this Act, is exempt from civil 20 21 service and is transferred as a consequence of this Act may

- 1 retain the employee's exempt status, but shall not be appointed
- 2 to a civil service position as a consequence of this Act. An
- 3 exempt employee who is transferred by this Act shall not suffer
- 4 any loss of prior service credit, vacation or sick leave credits
- 5 previously earned, or other employee benefits or privileges as a
- 6 consequence of this Act; provided that the employees possess
- 7 legal and public employment requirements for the position to
- 8 which transferred or appointed, as applicable; provided further
- 9 that subsequent changes in status may be made pursuant to
- 10 applicable employment and compensation laws. The director of
- 11 business, economic development, and tourism may prescribe the
- 12 duties and qualifications of these employees and fix their
- 13 salaries without regard to chapter 76, Hawaii Revised Statutes.
- 14 SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 15 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 16 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2016.
