# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE KING KAMEHAMEHA CELEBRATION COMMISSION.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. Section 8-5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 1 2 amended to read as follows: 3 "§8-5 King Kamehameha celebration commission. (a) There 4 shall be a commission to be known as the King Kamehameha 5 celebration commission placed within the department of 6 accounting and general services for administrative purposes. The commission shall consist of thirteen members to be appointed 7 8 by the governor in the manner provided by section 26-34. 9 appointments shall be made from the following organizations, 10 with at least one member from each organization: 11 (1) Royal Order of Kamehameha I; 12 (2) 'Ahahui Ka'ahumanu; 13 (3) Hale O Nā Ali'i O Hawai'i 'Ahahui Po'o; 14 (4)Daughters and Sons of Hawaiian Warriors[+]-15 Mamakakaua; 16 (5) Kamehameha Schools Alumni Association; Association of Hawaiian Civic Clubs; 17 (6)

6	with the State	e of Hawai'i issued by the department of commerce	
7	and consumer affairs and an active list of its members. In		
8	selecting the	r respective member to the commission, the	
9	membership organizations may select members who will help		
10	provide admin	strative guidance to the commission with regards	
11	to legal, bus:	ness, accounting, marketing, philanthropy, or	
12	public relation	ons. In addition, the governor shall appoint [ene	
13	member from-ea	ach of the following islands: Kauai, Maui, Molokai	
14	and Hawaii. l	Each of these members shall be a resident of the	
15	respective is	and that the member represents.] four at-large	
16	members repres	senting the city and county of Honolulu and the	
17	counties of Ka	uaʻi, Maui and Kalawao, and Hawaiʻi. The governor	
18	shall select r	nembers who will help provide administrative	
19	guidance to th	ne commission with regard to legal, business,	
20	accounting, ma	arketing, philanthropy, or public relations.	

1	(b) The terms of all appointments shall be four years.			
2	The governor shall appoint the chairperson of the commission			
3	from among the members. The chairperson may appoint an advisory			
4	committee composed of past commission members and personnel to			
5	advise the chairperson on the historical and archival background			
6	of the commission.			
7	(c) The members of the King Kamehameha celebration			
8	commission shall serve without compensation, but shall be			
9	entitled to reimbursement for travel and necessary expenses			
10	while attending meetings and while in discharge of their duties			
11	The comptroller shall reimburse the members of the King			
12	Kamehameha celebration commission for all necessary expenses			
13	incurred during the discharge of their duties.			
14	(d) [The commission may appoint and dismiss an arts			
15	program specialist and a part-time clerk typist, without regard			
16	to chapter 76, who shall serve at the commission's pleasure, and			
17	whose salaries shall be provided through fees, public			
18	contributions, and private donations.] The commission, by a			
19	majority vote, shall appoint an executive director, who shall:			
20	(1) Serve without regard to chapter 76 for a term to be			
21	determined by the commission;			

1	(2)	Serve as the commission's chief executive officer;	
2	(3)	Be responsible for all fiscal and administrative	
3		matters, including securing public contributions and	
4		private foundation grants and donations;	
5	(4)	Be responsible for developing and administering the	
6		programs under the commission's direction; and	
7	<u>(5)</u>	Be familiar with the people and culture of Hawaii.	
8	The salar	y of the executive director shall be established by the	
9	commissio	n; provided that the salary shall not exceed the salary	
10	of depart	ment heads or executive officers. The commission, by a	
11	two-thirds vote of all members to which it is entitled, may		
12	remove th	e executive director for cause at any time. The	
13	commissio	n may appoint and dismiss a part-time clerk typist,	
14	without regard to chapter 76, who shall serve at the		
15	commission's pleasure and whose salary shall be established by		
16	the commission.		
17	(e)	The commission shall have charge of all arrangements	
18	for the c	elebration [each year] under the direction of the	
19	commission and shall support other events as approved by the		
20	commission. The celebration is generally observed throughout		
21	Hawaiʻi Ne	ei each year on June 11, to commemorate the memory of	

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- 1 the great Polynesian Hawaiian warrior and statesman King
- 2 Kamehameha I, who united the Hawaiian Islands into the Kingdom
- 3 of Hawai'i, and is thus recognized [as-such] under section 8-1.
- 4 The commission may appoint committees and delegate powers and
- 5 duties to the committees as it shall determine.
- 6 (f) The comptroller shall account for all moneys
- 7 appropriated by the legislature, may raise funds to defray
- 8 administrative costs, and may accept donations of money and
- 9 personal property on behalf of the commission; provided that all
- 10 donations accepted from private sources shall be expended in the
- 11 manner prescribed by the contributor, and all moneys received
- 12 from all sources shall be deposited into the commission's trust
- 13 account.
- 14 (q) The commission shall be the coordinating agency for
- 15 all [state sponsored as well as other celebration] events
- 16 [staged during the celebration period] approved by the
- 17 commission, as set forth in subsection (e), and as designated by
- 18 the commission, to [assure] ensure activities planned are timely
- 19 and appropriate to commemorate the memory of King Kamehameha I.
- 20 The commission is authorized to determine to whom and for which

- 1 occasions permission is to be granted for the use of the statue
- 2 of King Kamehameha I.
- 3 (h) The commission shall adopt rules pursuant to chapter
- 4 91 necessary for the purpose of this section."
- 5 SECTION 2. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 6 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 7 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2016.
