A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE HAWAII EMPLOYER-UNION HEALTH BENEFITS TRUST FUND.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the Hawaii employer-
- 2 union health benefits trust fund offers health benefits to the
- 3 children of state and county employees and retirees. Due to the
- 4 current construction of chapter 87A, Hawaii Revised Statutes,
- 5 when an employee or retiree passes away, the employee's or
- 6 retiree's surviving spouse's children that are born after the
- 7 employee's or retiree's death are eligible to participate in
- 8 benefits plans offered by the fund. However, the legislature
- 9 finds that a child born or legally adopted after an employee's
- 10 or retiree's death who is not the natural child of the deceased
- 11 employee or retiree should not be eligible to participate in
- 12 fund benefits plans because the child is not the child of the
- 13 state or county employee or retiree.
- 14 The legislature further finds that the definition of
- 15 "dependent-beneficiary" should be amended to be consistent with
- 16 the federal Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act of 2010,
- 17 which prohibits restricting health insurance coverage to only



1	unmarried dependents and denying health insurance coverage to		
2	married dependents.		
3	The purpose of this Act is to amend the definition of		
4	"dependent-beneficiary" contained in chapter 87A, Hawaii Revised		
5	Statutes, to clarify eligibility of children for participation		
6	in fund benefit plans and to bring the definition of "dependent-		
7	beneficiary" into conformance with the federal Patient		
8	Protection and Affordable Care Act of 2010.		
9	SECTION 2. Section 87A-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
10	amended by amending the definition of "dependent-beneficiary" to		
11	read as follows:		
12	""Dependent-beneficiary" means an employee-beneficiary's:		
13	(1) Spouse;		
14	(2) [Unmarried-child] Child deemed eligible by the board,		
15	including a legally adopted child, stepchild, foster		
16	child, or recognized natural child who lives with the		
17	employee-beneficiary[+], but excluding a child born or		
18	legally adopted more than ten months after the death		
19	of an employee killed in the performance of duty, born		

or legally adopted more than ten months after the

death of an active employee who was eligible to retire

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1		on the date of death, or born or legally adopted more
2		than ten months after the date of death of a retired
3		employee-beneficiary; and
4	(3)	Unmarried child regardless of age who is incapable of
5		self-support because of a mental or physical
6		incapacity, which existed prior to the unmarried
7		child's reaching the age of nineteen years."
8	SECT	ION 3. This Act does not affect the rights that
9	accrued b	efore the effective date of this Act.
10	SECT	ION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
11	and stric	ken. New statutory material is underscored.
12	SECT	TON 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2016.
