- mental health professional shall state in the client record whether and when the treating clinician attempted to contact the 2 minor's parent or guardian, and whether the attempt to contact 3 was successful or unsuccessful, or the reason why, in the 4 treating licensed mental health professional's opinion, it would 5 be inappropriate to contact the minor's parent or quardian. 6 (c) A minor may not abrogate consent provided by a parent 7 or legal guardian on the minor's behalf, nor may a parent or 8 legal guardian abrogate consent given by the minor on his or her 9 10 own behalf. (d) If a minor consents to receive mental health treatment 11 or counseling services pursuant to this section, the minor shall 12 13 not be liable for payment.
- (e) The minor's parents or guardian are not liable for 14
- payment for mental health treatment or counseling services 15
- provided pursuant to this section unless the parent or guardian 16

PURPOSE:

To reduce barriers in accessing mental health care for adolescents by lowering the

age of consent to receive outpatient

treatment from 18 years old to 12 years old.

MEANS:

Add a new section to chapter 577, Hawaii

Revised Statutes.

JUSTIFICATION:

In certain situations, minors seeking mental health services may be reluctant to disclose this need to their parents, may have parents that disrupt proper health care, may have inaccessible parents or have parents that will not consent to treatment. By lowering the age of consent for mental health services, similar to consent laws for

substance abuse and family planning, minors may access treatment based upon their consent. If it is later determined that

parental involvement would benefit

treatment, the provider will plan for such a

disclosure.

Impact on the public: Improved access for
minors to mental health care that may
otherwise be unobtainable due to family

dynamics or other circumstances.

Impact on the department and other agencies:
There may be impact on the Department of
Education, which provides school-based
behavioral health services to students.
