A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO AGE OF CONSENT FOR ADOLESCENT MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Chapter 577, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 2 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
- 3 and to read as follows:
- 4 "\$577- Mental health services relating to minors;
- 5 diagnosis, counseling, and related activities. (a)
- 6 Notwithstanding any other law to the contrary, a minor who is
- 7 twelve years of age or older may consent to mental health
- 8 treatment or counseling services provided by a licensed mental
- 9 health professional if, in the opinion of the licensed mental
- 10 health professional, the minor is mature enough to participate
- 11 intelligently in the mental health treatment or counseling
- 12 services.
- 13 (b) The mental health treatment or counseling services of
- 14 a minor authorized by this section shall include involvement of
- 15 the minor's parent or legal guardian, unless the licensed mental
- 16 health professional, after consulting with the minor, determines
- 17 that the involvement would be inappropriate. The licensed



- 1 mental health professional shall state in the client record
- 2 whether and when the treating clinician attempted to contact the
- 3 minor's parent or legal guardian, and whether the attempt to
- 4 contact was successful or unsuccessful, or the reason why, in
- 5 the treating licensed mental health professional's opinion, it
- 6 would be inappropriate to contact the minor's parent or
- 7 guardian.
- 8 (c) A minor may not abrogate consent provided by a parent
- 9 or legal guardian on the minor's behalf, nor may a parent or
- 10 legal guardian abrogate consent given by the minor on the
- 11 minor's own behalf.
- 12 (d) If a minor consents to receive mental health treatment
- 13 or counseling services pursuant to this section, the minor shall
- 14 not be liable for payment.
- 15 (e) The minor's parents or legal guardian is not liable
- 16 for payment for mental health treatment or counseling services
- 17 provided pursuant to this section unless the parent or guardian
- 18 participates in the mental health treatment or counseling
- 19 services, and then only for services rendered with the
- 20 participation of the parent or quardian.
- 21 (f) As used in this section:

2	provision	of outpatient mental health treatment or counseling by
3	a licensed mental health professional.	
4	"Lic	ensed mental health professional" means any of the
5	following:	
6	(1)	A person designated as a licensed mental health

8	(2)	A person designated as a licensed marriage and family
9		therapist pursuant to 451J-1;
10	<u>(3)</u>	A clinical social worker licensed pursuant to chapter
11		<u>467E;</u>
12	(4)	A person licensed in the practice of psychology
13		pursuant to chapter 465; or
14	<u>(5)</u>	A board certified, or board eligible, psychiatrist."
