## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO LIVEABOARD FEES.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Section 200-10, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is

2 amended by amending subsection (c) to read as follows:

3 "(c) The permittee shall pay moorage fees to the

4 department for the use permit that shall be based on but not

5 limited to the use of the vessel, its effect on the harbor, use

6 of facilities, and the cost of administering this mooring

8 (1) Except for commercial maritime activities where there

9 is a tariff established by the department of

transportation, moorage fees shall be established by

appraisal by a state-licensed appraiser approved by

the department and shall be higher for nonresidents

than for residents. The moorage fees shall be set by

appraisal categories schedule A and schedule B, to be

determined by the department, and may be increased

annually by the department, to reflect a cost-of-

3		principal habitation, the permittee shall pay, in
4		addition to the moorage fee, a liveaboard fee that
5		shall be calculated at a rate of:
6		(A) $[\$5.20]$ $\$9.43$ a foot of vessel length a month if
7		the permittee is a state resident; and
8		(B) $[\$7.80]$ $\$14.14$ a foot of vessel length a month if
9		the permittee is a nonresident;
10		provided that the liveaboard fees established by this
11		paragraph may be increased [by the department at the
12		rate-of-the-annual cost-of-living index, but not more
13		than five per cent in any one year, beginning July 1
14		of each year; or decreased by rules adopted by the
15		department pursuant to chapter 91;
16	(5)	If a vessel is used for commercial purposes from its
17		permitted mooring, the permittee shall pay, in lieu of
18		the moorage and liveaboard fee, a fee based on three
19		per cent of the gross revenues derived from the use of
20		the vessel or two times the moorage fee assessed for a

3	(6) The depar	rtment is authorized to assess and collect
4	utility :	ees, including electrical and water charges,
5	and commo	on-area maintenance fees in small boat

7	SECTION 2. The	nis Act does not affect rights and duties that
8	matured, penalties	that were incurred, and proceedings that were
9	begun before its e	fective date.
