(a) Upon the establishment of the Pacific-Asia institute for resilience and sustainability, the [office of 4 5 the lieutenant governor] department of business, economic development, and tourism shall act as the State's liaison, 6 7 assisting the institute to: (1) Form partnerships with various entities from the 8 9 public, private, and non-military sectors, including 10 but not limited to international governmental and 11 nongovernmental organizations, businesses, universities, research institutes, and foundations; 12 **13** and Facilitate three core initiatives, as follows: 14 (2) Sustainability and the environment, including 15 16 issues concerning energy, water, food security, 17 and climate change adaptation;
