# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO DRIVER LICENSING.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 286-107, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 2 amended to read as follows:
- 3 "§286-107 License renewals; procedures and requirements.
- The examiner of drivers may accept an application for a 4
- 5 renewal of a driver's license made not more than six months
- 6 prior to the date of expiration.
- 7 If, however, the renewal is not applied for within ninety
- 8 days after the expiration of the license, the applicant for
- 9 renewal shall be treated as an applicant for a new license and
- 10 examined as provided in section 286-108.
- 11 Except as otherwise provided in subsection (c), an
- 12 applicant for a renewal of a driver's license under this
- 13 section, or the reactivation of an expired license under section
- 286-107.5(a), shall appear in person before the examiner of 14
- 15 drivers and the examiner of drivers shall administer such
- 16 physical examinations as the state director of transportation
- **17** deems necessary to determine the applicant's fitness to continue
- to operate a motor vehicle. 18

1 (c) Any person who holds a category (1), (2), or (3) license issued under this part who is unable to appear in person 2 before the examiner of drivers to apply for a renewal of the 3 driver's license, may, if the person is not disqualified from 4 5 renewing the license under subsection (a) except as provided 6 under subsection (h), apply for a renewal by mail. 7 applicant's request to have the license renewed by mail must be 8 received by the examiner of drivers within ninety days after the 9 expiration of the license or it shall be treated as an application for reactivation of an expired license under section 10 286-107.5. The examiner of drivers shall, upon receipt of the 11 12 request, furnish the applicant with all necessary forms and 13 instructions. An application for renewal made pursuant to this subsection shall be accompanied by a statement from a licensed 14 15 physician, physician assistant, or advanced practice registered 16 nurse certifying that the applicant was examined by the licensed 17 physician, physician assistant, or advanced practice registered nurse not more than six months prior to the expiration date of 18 the applicant's license and that the applicant was found by the 19 20 examination to have met the physical requirements established by 21 the state director of transportation for the renewal of

PURPOSE:

To amend the driver's license issuance process to issue driver's licenses with photographs to conform to the requirements

of the REAL ID Act.

MEANS:

Amend section 286-107, Hawaii Revised

Statutes (HRS).

JUSTIFICATION:

Currently, section 286-107(f), HRS, allows driver's licenses to be issued without incorporating a photograph of the licensee. Additionally, section 286-107(g), HRS, provides, in pertinent part that a driver's license shall not be renewed by mail more than two consecutive renewals as provided under section 286-106, HRS, on the sixth birthday after issuance.

This bill proposes to repeal the current section of 286-107(f) and amend the current section of 286-107(g) as follows:

Amend "sixth" to read "eighth" so it is consistent with section 286-106, HRS; and add wording that reads as follows, "or sixteen years have lapsed since the applicant had appeared in person" to ensure our driver license procedures are compliant with the Real ID Act which requires in person renewal if sixteen years have passed since the applicant appeared in person.
