A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PARKS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECT:	ION 1. Transfer of state parks to county control;
2	feasibilit	ty; advisory task force. (a) There is established
3	within the	e department of land and natural resources for
4	administra	ative purposes a temporary advisory task force to
5	develop a	n action plan for the transfer of all state parks,
6	together v	with all state park functions and funds, to the
7	counties.	The department of land and natural resources shall
8	convene th	ne task force no later than October 1, 2016.
9	(b)	The advisory task force shall be composed of:
10	(1)	The chairperson of the board of land and natural
11	•	resources, or a designee, who shall serve as the
12		chairperson of the task force;
13	(2)	The four county directors having jurisdiction over
14		parks and recreation, or their designees;
15	(3)	One park user appointed by the governor;
16	(4)	The chairperson of the house of representatives
17		standing committee having jurisdiction over

1		intergovernmental affairs, or a designee appointed by
2		the speaker of the house of representatives; and
3	(5)	The chairperson of the senate standing committee
4		having jurisdiction over intergovernmental affairs, or
5		a designee appointed by the president of the senate.
6	(c)	In carrying out its duties under this section, the
7	advisory t	task force may request staff assistance from the
8	department	t of land and natural resources and other appropriate
9	state and	county executive agencies.
10	(d)	The members of the advisory task force shall serve
11	without co	ompensation but shall be reimbursed for expenses
12	necessary	for the performance of their duties, including travel
13	expenses.	
14	(e)	The advisory task force shall have the following
15	functions	and duties:
16	(1)	Develop an action plan to transfer the functions and
17		funding relating to the state parks to the counties;
18	(2)	Develop a timetable for the proposed transfer that
19		would be the most cost-effective for both the State
20		and counties, and that would provide the least
21		disruption of services to the public users;

1	(3)	Include all relevant appropriations for specific parks		
2		proje	ects that would be affected by the proposed	
3		tran	sfer to the counties;	
4	(4)	Incl	ade all relevant contracts relating to state parks	
5		that	would be affected by the proposed transfer to the	
6		coun	ties;	
7	(5)	Incl	ade all relevant federal and state funds and	
8		asse	ss how the proposed transfer to the counties would	
9		affe	ct each funding source;	
10	(6)	Make	recommendations, as appropriate, regarding the	
11		enactment of any county ordinances or policies that		
12		would be necessary to:		
13		(A)	Provide for protection of the natural environment	
14			for parks that were formerly in the state land	
15			use conservation district;	
16		(B)	Ensure preservation of historical and cultural	
17			sites;	
18		(C)	Continue to provide community recreation and	
19			education activities, as appropriate, at	
20			transferred parks;	

1		(D)	Continue to provide for park repair and
2			maintenance without an increase in cost to the
3			<pre>public;</pre>
4		(E)	Ensure that the county will be able to comply
5			with federal statutes and grant conditions as
6			appropriate;
7		(F)	Ensure that public safety is maintained in all
8			parks transferred to the counties; and
9		(G)	Maintain or improve responsiveness to park user
10			and customer concerns, particularly those of
11			residents and visitors using beach parks and
12			wilderness areas;
13	(7)	Cons	ider all relevant state statutes and county
14		ordi	nances relating to state and county parks and
15		rela	ted areas for possible amendment; and
16	(8)	Cons	ider any other relevant issues necessary to ensure
17		a ti	mely and efficient transfer of responsibility of
18		the	state park system under chapter 184, Hawaii
19		Revi	sed Statutes, to the counties.
20	SECT	ION 2	. The chairperson of the board of land and
21	natural r	esour	ces shall submit a report, including

- 1 recommendations and implementing legislation from the advisory
- 2 task force, to the legislature no later than twenty days prior
- 3 to the convening of the 2017 regular session.
- 4 SECTION 3. The advisory task force shall be dissolved on
- 5 June 30, 2017.
- 6 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2016.
