A BILL FOR AN ACT

PROPOSING AN AMENDMENT TO ARTICLE I OF CONSTITUTION OF THE STATE OF HAWAII TO ESTABLISH RIGHTS FOR VICTIMS OF CRIMES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to propose an 2 amendment to article I of the Constitution of the State of 3 Hawaii to provide recognized and protected constitutional rights 4 for victims of crime from the time of their victimization and 5 continuing throughout the criminal justice process, to be known 6 as "Marsy's Law". SECTION 2. Article I of the Constitution of the State of 7 8 Hawaii is amended by adding a new section to be appropriately 9 designated and to read as follows: 10 "RIGHTS OF VICTIMS OF CRIME 11 **SECTION** . A victim of crime shall enjoy the following rights at the time of the victim's victimization and continuing 12 throughout the criminal justice process: 13 14 1. To be reasonably protected from the accused, including 15 having the victim's safety considered in denying or

1		fixing the amount of bail and in setting release
2		conditions for the accused;
3	<u>2.</u>	To reasonable, accurate and timely notice of all
4		proceedings related to the criminal conduct;
5	<u>3.</u>	To not be excluded from any proceeding related to the
6		criminal conduct, unless the court, after receiving
7		clear and convincing evidence, determines that
8		testimony by the victim would be materially altered if
9		the victim heard other testimony at the proceeding;
10	<u>4.</u>	To be reasonably heard at all proceedings related to
11		the criminal conduct;
12	<u>5.</u>	To the reasonable right to confer with the attorney
13		for the State in the case or other proceeding related
14		to the criminal conduct;
15	<u>6.</u>	To full and timely restitution as provided by law;
16	<u>7.</u>	To proceedings free from unreasonable delay;
17	8.	To be treated with fairness and with respect for the
18		victim's dignity and privacy;
19	9.	To be informed in a timely manner of any plea bargain,
20		deferred prosecution agreement or final disposition,
21		and other major developments, as that term may be

1	defined by law, in proceedings related to the criminal		
2	conduct; and		
3	10. To be informed of these rights and of other rights and		
4	services available for crime victims.		
5	ENFORCEMENT		
6	In any proceeding related to the criminal conduct, the		
7	court shall ensure that the victim of crime is afforded these		
8	rights.		
9	The victim of crime, or the victim's lawful representative		
10	and the attorney for the State may assert and enforce the rights		
11	established by this section. Except to enforce these rights,		
12	nothing in this section shall be construed to create a cause of		
13	action against the State or counties, or any of their agencies,		
14	officials or employees.		
15	A person accused of the crime may not obtain any form of		
16	relief established by this section.		
17	The legislature may enact laws to define, implement,		
18	preserve and protect the rights established by this section.		
19	Nothing in this section shall be construed to supersede the		
20	constitutional rights of a person accused of the crime.		

1	As used herein, "a victim of crime", "crime victim" or		
2	"victim" means any person who suffers direct, proximate or		
3	threatened physical, psychological or financial harm as a result		
4	of the commission or attempted commission of a crime by the		
5	accused, and shall include the lawful representative of a victim		
6	who is a minor, incompetent, physically or mentally		
7	incapacitated or deceased. The term does not include the		
8	accused or a person whom the court finds would not act in the		
9	best interests of a minor, incompetent, incapacitated or		
10	deceased victim."		
11	SECTION 3. The question to be printed on the ballot shall		
12	be as follows:		
13	"Shall victims of crime be provided rights in the		
14	Constitution of the State of Hawaii, including fair and		
15	respectful treatment throughout the criminal justice		
16	process; notification of critical proceedings, possible plea		
17	agreements and case dispositions; proceedings free from		
18	unreasonable delay; the opportunity to be present at all		
19	proceedings related to the criminal conduct; the opportunity		
20	to speak at the sentencing hearing; financial reimbursement		

- from the offender; and notification of the offender's
- 2 release from custody?"
- 3 SECTION 4. New constitutional material is underscored.
- 4 SECTION 5. This amendment shall take effect upon
- 5 compliance with article XVII, section 3, of the Constitution of
- 6 the State of Hawaii.
