## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HEALTH.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECT	ION 1. Chapter 329, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended b	y adding two new sections to part I to be appropriately
3	designate	d and to read as follows:
4	" <u>§32</u>	9-A Narcotics enforcement and prescription drug
5	monitorin	g advisory committee; established. (a) There is
6	establish	ed a narcotics enforcement and prescription drug
7	monitorin	g advisory committee within the department of health
8	for administrative purposes. The committee shall be composed of	
9	five memb	ers appointed by the governor in accordance with
10	section 2	6-34. Of the five members:
11	(1)	One member shall be a physician licensed in accordance
12		with chapter 453, specializing in pain medicine;
13	(2)	One member shall be a physician licensed in accordance
14		with chapter 453, specializing in family medicine;
15	(3)	One member shall be a physician licensed in accordance
16		with chapter 453, specializing in internal medicine;
17	(4)	One member shall be a physician licensed in accordance
18		with chapter 453 or a psychologist licensed in

1		accordance with chapter 465, specializing in substance
2		use and addiction; and
3	(5)	One member shall be a registered pharmacist, as
4		defined in section 461-1.
5	(b)	All members shall serve for a term of four years. Any
6	vacancies	occurring in the membership of the committee shall be
7	filled fo	r the remainder of the unexpired term in the same
8	manner as	the original appointments.
9	(c)	The purpose of the narcotics enforcement and
10	prescript	ion drug monitoring advisory committee shall be to
11	advise an	d assist the department of public safety narcotics
12	enforceme	nt division by:
13	(1)	Monitoring and reviewing statewide statistics
14		regarding drug prescriptions, including patient and
15		<pre>provider information;</pre>
16	(2)	Identifying the top twenty per cent of all drug
17		prescribers based on the number of prescription drugs
18		prescribed and the total number of pills dispensed;
19	(3)	Ascertaining whether the State has met community
20		standards of care and specialty standards of care and

1		coordinating with the state medical board if there has
2		been a deviation from standards of care; and
3	(4)	Providing recommendations regarding state-designated
4		pain programs, opioid-use policy, continuing medical
5		education requirements concerning drug prescriptions,
6		and the Hawaii drug take-back and education initiative
7		program established in section 329-B.
8	<u>§329</u>	-B Hawaii drug take-back and education initiative;
9	establish	ed. There shall be established within the department
10	of public	safety the Hawaii drug take-back and education
11	initiativ	e. The objectives of the Hawaii drug take-back and
12	education	initiative shall include the following:
13	(1)	Organization of the safe return and disposal of drugs
14		through a drug take-back event, which shall meet the
15		requirements of federal law, each quarter;
16	(2)	Development of strategic partnership recommendations
17		to incentivize the return and disposal of drugs;
18	(3)	Initiatives, in collaboration with the department of
19		health and the narcotics enforcement and prescription
20		drug monitoring advisory committee, to expand and

1		coordinate education programs, partnerships, and
2		federal grants; and
3	(4)	Integration of recommendations from the narcotics
4		enforcement and prescription drug monitoring advisory
5		committee established in section 329-A."
6	SECT	ION 2. In codifying the new sections added by section
7	1 of this	Act, the revisor of statutes shall substitute
8	appropria	te section numbers for the letters used in designating
9	the new s	ections in this Act.
10	SECT	ION 3. New statutory material is underscored.
11	SECT	ION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2015.
