BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECT	ION 1. Chapter 324, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is	
2	amended b	y adding a new part to be appropriately designated and	
3	to read as follows:

5	§324	-A Definitions. As used in this part, unless the	
6	context otherwise requires:		
7	"Department" means the department of health.		
8	"Director" means the director of health or the director's		
9	designee.		
10	"Family" means:		
11	(1)	Spouse;	
12	(2)	Each legal parent;	
13	(3)	The natural mother;	
14	(4)	The natural father;	
15	(5)	The adjudicated, presumed, or concerned natural father	
16		as described in section 578-2;	

17 (6) Each parent's spouse or former spouses;

1 (7)Each sibling or person related by consanguinity or 2 marriage; 3 (8) Each person residing in the same dwelling unit; and Any other person who, or legal entity that, is a 4 (9) 5 child's legal or physical custodian or guardian, or 6 who is otherwise responsible for the child's care, 7 other than an authorized agency that assumes such a 8 legal status or relationship with the child under 9 chapter 587A. 10 "Individually identifiable health information" means the 11 same as in title 45 Code of Federal Regulations part 164, 12 subpart E, as may be amended. 13 "Maternal morbidity and mortality", "maternal death", or 14 "maternal morbidity and mortality event" means any one of the 15 following: Pregnancy-related death, which is the death of a woman 16 (1)17 while pregnant or within one year after a pregnancy, 18 regardless of whether the pregnancy is normal or 19 ectopic, from any cause related to or aggravated by 20 the woman's pregnancy or its management, but not from 21 accidental or incidental causes;

"Provider of medical care" means any health care
 practitioner who provides any medical evaluation or treatment,
 or any facility through which health care is provided, including
 dental and mental health evaluation or treatment.

§324-B Hawaii maternal morbidity and mortality review 5 6 panel; established. (a) There is established the Hawaii 7 maternal morbidity and mortality review panel, which shall be placed within the department for administrative purposes only. 8 9 The purpose of the panel is to conduct comprehensive, 10 multidisciplinary reviews of maternal deaths in the State to 11 identify factors associated with the deaths and make 12 recommendations for system changes to improve health care services for women in the State. The members of the panel shall 13 be appointed by the director, in collaboration with the 14 organizations listed below, and shall consist of: 15 Three members from the Hawaii section of the American

16 (1) Three members from the Hawaii section of the American
17 Congress of Obstetricians and Gynecologists, and of
18 the three members, there shall be at least one
19 generalist and at least one maternal fetal medicine
20 specialist;

1	(2)	One member from the Hawaii chapter of the American
2		Academy of Pediatrics specializing in neonatology;
3	(3)	One member from the Hawaii Medical Association;
4	(4)	One member from the Hawaii chapter of the American

6	(5)	One member from the Hawaii section of the Association
7		of Women's Health, Obstetric and Neonatal Nurses;
8	(6)	The head of the department's maternal and child health
9		branch, or a designee;
10	(7)	An epidemiologist from the department with experience
11		analyzing perinatal data, or a designee;
12	(8)	The chief medical examiner, pathologist, or designee;
13		and
14	(9)	A representative of community mental health centers in
15		the State;
16	provided	that the chair of the panel may invite nonvoting expert
17	consultan	ts to its meetings.
18	(b)	The terms of the members shall be three years;
19	provided	that the initial members' terms shall be staggered in a
20	manner to	be determined by the director. The director shall
21	appoint t	he initial chair of the panel, who shall call the first

1 meeting of the panel and serve as chair for six months, after
2 which time the panel shall elect its chair. Members of the
3 panel shall serve without compensation but shall be reimbursed
4 for actual and necessary expenses, including travel, board, and
5 lodging, incurred in the performance of panel activities.

6 (c) The director shall delegate to the panel the functions 7 of collecting, analyzing, and disseminating maternal morbidity and mortality review information; organizing and convening 8 9 meetings of the panel; and performing other substantive and 10 administrative tasks as may be incident to these activities. 11 The activities of the panel and its employees or agents shall be subject to the same confidentiality provisions as apply to 12 13 members of the panel.

§324-C Panel duties. (a) The panel, in collaboration 14 15 with the director, shall conduct comprehensive and multidisciplinary reviews of maternal morbidity and mortality in 16 17 Hawaii. The panel shall not be subject to part I of chapter 92. The panel may invite consultants to attend reviews of 18 (b) 19 maternal morbidity and mortality events. Each consultant shall 20 be subject to the same confidentiality provisions that apply to 21 panel members.

1 (C) The panel shall be responsible for disseminating the 2 panel's recommendations to the institutions and professional organizations represented by members on the panel, as 3 4 applicable. The panel's recommendations shall not contain any 5 information that would permit identification of a person and 6 shall be disseminated through the institution's or 7 organization's quality assurance program to protect the 8 confidentiality of all persons involved in any maternal 9 morbidity and mortality event. 10 (d) The panel shall not have the power to: Call witnesses or take testimony from any individual 11 (1) 12 involved in the investigation of a maternal death; or Enforce any public health standard or criminal law, or 13 (2) otherwise participate in any legal proceeding, except 14 to the extent that a member of the panel is involved 15 in the investigation of a maternal death or resulting 16 prosecution and participates in the legal proceeding 17 in the course of performing a member's duties outside 18 19 of the panel.

20 (e) The director, in collaboration with the panel, shall
21 submit an annual written report to the legislature no later than

1 twenty days prior to the convening of each regular session on
2 the panel's activities and incidents of maternal deaths in the
3 State. The report shall include statistics setting forth the
4 number of maternal deaths in the State, identifiable trends in
5 maternal deaths, including possible causes, and recommendations
6 for system changes, including any proposed legislation.

7 §324-D Access to information. (a) All providers of
8 medical care and state and county agencies shall report all
9 maternal morbidity and mortality events to the director.

10 (b) Upon written request of the director, all providers of medical care and state and county agencies shall disclose to the 11 department, and those individuals appointed by the director to 12 13 the panel, maternal morbidity and mortality review information 14 regarding the circumstances of a maternal death so that the department may conduct a multidisciplinary review of maternal 15 morbidity and mortality pursuant to section 321-31 and this 16 17 part.

18 (c) To the extent that this section conflicts with other19 state confidentiality laws, this section shall prevail.

20 §324-E Exception. Information regarding an ongoing civil
21 or criminal investigation shall be disclosed at the discretion

of the applicable state, county, or federal law enforcement
 agency.

§324-F Use of maternal morbidity and mortality review 3 Except as otherwise provided in 4 information and records. (a) this part, all maternal morbidity and mortality review 5 6 information acquired by the department during its review of maternal deaths pursuant to this part, is confidential and may 7 only be disclosed as necessary to carry out the purposes of this 8 9 part.

10 (b) The department shall redact any individually
11 identifiable information prior to sharing maternal morbidity and
12 mortality review information with panel members.

(c) General maternal morbidity and mortality review information and statistical compilations of data that do not contain any individually identifiable information shall be public records.

(d) The panel and every panel member shall maintain the confidentiality of the maternal morbidity and mortality review information and all information obtained as part of the panel proceedings. Neither the panel nor any panel member shall

release or re-disclose information obtained as part of the panel
 proceedings.

3 (e) No individual participating in the panel's review of a 4 maternal death shall be questioned in any civil or criminal 5 proceeding regarding information presented in or opinions formed 6 as a result of a panel meeting. Nothing in this subsection shall be construed to prevent a person from testifying to 7 information obtained independently of the department's request 8 9 for maternal morbidity and mortality review information or the panel's review of the maternal death, or which is public 10 information, or where disclosure is required by a court of law. 11 (f) Maternal morbidity and mortality review information 12 13 held by the department as a result of maternal morbidity and mortality reviews conducted under this part shall not be subject 14

15 to subpoena, discovery, or introduction into evidence in any 16 civil or criminal proceeding, except that maternal morbidity and 17 mortality review information otherwise available from other 18 sources shall not be immune from subpoena, discovery, or 19 introduction into evidence through those sources solely because 20 they were provided to the department as required by this part.

(g) The director shall have access to individually
 identifiable information relating to each maternal morbidity and
 mortality event on a case-by-case basis where public health is
 at risk.

5 (h) The director may retain identifiable information 6 regarding facilities where a maternal morbidity and mortality 7 event occurred and geographic information on each maternal 8 morbidity and mortality event solely for the purposes of 9 trending and analysis of maternal morbidity and mortality events 10 over time.

11 §324-G Immunity from liability. The panel, the panel
12 members, any provider of medical care, state or county agency,
13 or individual participating in, or cooperating in, the review of
14 a maternal death pursuant to this part shall not be held civilly
15 or criminally liable for providing the information required
16 under this part.

17 §324-H Rules. The director, with the advice and 18 recommendation of a majority of the members of the panel, shall 19 adopt rules pursuant to chapter 91 related to the following: 20 (1) The system for identifying and reporting maternal 21 morbidity and mortality events to the director;

1 (2)The form and manner through which the director and the 2 members of the panel may acquire information pursuant 3 to this part; The protocol to be used in contacting a family member 4 (3) 5 of the deceased woman for a discussion of the maternal morbidity and mortality event, including allowing 6 7 family members to delay or refuse such a discussion; 8 and 9 The confidentiality provisions of this part." (4) 10 SECTION 2. Section 324-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 11 amended to read as follows: 12 "§324-1 Sources of information protected. Any person, hospital, sanitorium, nursing or rest home, or other similar 13 14 medical facility may provide information, interviews, reports, 15 statements, memoranda, or other data or material relating to the 16 condition and treatment of any person to [the maternal and 17 perinatal mortality study committee of the Hawaii Medical Association, any in-hospital staff-committee, or] the department 18 19 of health, to be used in the course of [any] study for the 20 purpose of reducing morbidity or mortality.

1 No liability of any kind or character for damages or other 2 relief shall arise or be enforced against any person or 3 organization by reason of having provided the information or material, or by reason of having released or published the 4 findings, conclusions, and summaries of the research or study 5 6 committees to advance medical research and medical education." SECTION 3. Section 324-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 7 8 amended to read as follows: "§324-2 Identification of persons studied; restriction. 9 [The maternal and perinatal mortality study committee of the 10 11 Hawaii Medical Association, the department of health, or any inhospital staff committee] The maternal morbidity and mortality 12 review panel shall use or publish this material only for the 13 purpose of advancing medical research, medical education, or 14 education of the public in the interest of reducing morbidity or 15 mortality. In all events, the identity, or any group of facts 16 17 which tends to lead to the identity $[\tau]$ of any person whose condition or treatment has been studied shall be confidential 18 and shall not be revealed [under any circumstances]." 19 20 SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the general revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ 21 or so

much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2015-2016 and
 the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal
 year 2016-2017 for the implementation and operation of the
 maternal morbidity and mortality review panel.

5 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department6 of health for purposes of this Act.

7 SECTION 5. In codifying the new sections added by section
8 1 of this Act, the revisor of statutes shall substitute
9 appropriate section numbers for the letters used in designating
10 the new sections in this Act.

SECTION 6. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

13 SECTION 7. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2015.
