A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO INFRASTRUCTURE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that dams and reservoirs

2 are a critical part of our State's infrastructure, providing

3 numerous benefits that our communities depend upon. In addition

4 to storing and delivering a reliable source of water for

5 agriculture during dry periods, assisting with flood control

6 during large storms, and helping to mitigate erosion and reduce

7 sediment runoff to near shore ocean reefs, dams and reservoirs

8 also play an important role in providing drinking water for

9 Hawaii's residents.

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10 The legislature further finds that the continued

availability and operation of dams and reservoirs is extremely

12 important in sustaining our water resources and enhancing public

safety. By capturing storm water that would otherwise rush to

14 the ocean, reservoirs help to recharge our groundwater aguifers,

15 which are a primary source for much of Hawaii's drinking water.

16 Providing renewable energy through the use of hydropower is

- 3 The purpose of this Act is to establish a dam and reservoir
- 4 working group to ensure and enhance the continued availability
- 5 and operation of dams and reservoirs in the State of Hawaii.
- 6 SECTION 2. (a) There is established a dam and reservoir
- 7 working group, to be placed within the department of land and
- 8 natural resources for administrative purposes only.
- 9 (b) Without regard to section 26-34, Hawaii Revised
- 10 Statutes, the dam and reservoir working group shall consist of
- 11 the following members:
- 12 (1) The chairperson of the board of land and natural
- resources or the chairperson's designee, who shall
- serve as the co-chairperson of the working group;
- 15 (2) The chairperson of the board of agriculture or the
- 16 chairperson's designee, who shall serve as the co-
- 17 chairperson of the working group;
- 18 (3) The deputy director for water resource management of
- 19 the department of land and natural resources or the
- 20 deputy director's designee;

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1	(4)	Two persons appointed by the governor, one of whom
2		shall represent the counties;
3	(5)	One person selected by the Hawaii Cattlemen's Council
4		to represent the Council;
5	(6)	One person selected by the Land Use Research
6		Foundation to represent the foundation;
7	(7)	One person selected by the Hawaii Farm Bureau
8		Federation to represent the federation; and
9	(8)	Three owners of dams and reservoirs regulated by the
10		department of land and natural resources to be
,11		selected by the co-chairpersons of the working group.
12	Any	vacancies in the commission shall be filled in the
13	manner pr	ovided for in the original appointments.
14	(c)	The dam and reservoir working group shall review
15	applicabl	e state laws, administrative rules, and operational
16	policies	and recommend amendments, modifications, or actions to
17	be taken to ensure and enhance the continued availability and	
18	operation	of dams and reservoirs in the State of Hawaii.
19	(d)	The dam and reservoir working group shall report its
20	findings	and recommendations, including any proposed
21	legislati	on, amendments to rules, policy modifications, or other

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- 1 actions, to the legislature no later than twenty days prior to
- 2 the convening of the regular session of 2017.
- 3 (e) The members of the working group shall serve without
- 4 compensation but shall be reimbursed for expenses, including
- 5 travel expenses, necessary for the performance of their duties.
- 6 (f) The dam and reservoir working group shall cease to
- 7 exist on June 30, 2017.
- 8 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
