A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO WILDLIFE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Chapter 188, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 2 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
- 3 and to read as follows:
- 4 "§188- Selling of aquatic life for aquarium purposes
- 5 prohibited; penalties; fines. (a) It shall be unlawful for any
- 6 person at any time to knowingly or intentionally sell or offer
- 7 to sell, for aquarium purposes, aquatic life taken from any of
- 8 the waters within the jurisdiction of the State.
- 9 (b) This section shall not apply to a person exercising a
- 10 customary and traditional right for subsistence, cultural, or
- 11 religious purposes, subject to the right of the State to
- 12 regulate that right, including native Hawaiian gathering rights
- and traditional cultural practices as authorized by law or as
- 14 permitted by the State pursuant to article XII, section 7, of
- 15 the Hawaii State Constitution.

1	<u>(c)</u>	This section shall not apply to the taking of aquatic
2	life for	human consumption or for sale for human consumption,
3	including	the use of bait.
4	<u>(d)</u>	This section shall not prohibit special activity
5	permits a	llowed under section 187A-6; provided that the permit
6	issued is	for bona fide scientific or public display purposes.
7	<u>(e)</u>	Any person violating this section or any rule adopted
8	pursuant	to this section shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and,
9	notwithst	anding any law to the contrary:
10	<u>(1)</u>	For a first offense, shall be fined not more than
11		\$1,000 or thirty days imprisonment, or both;
12	(2)	For a second offense within five years of a previous
13		violation, shall be fined not more than \$2,000 or
14		sixty days imprisonment, or both; and
15	(3)	For a third or subsequent violation within five years
16		of a previous violation, shall be fined not more than
17		\$3,000 or ninety days imprisonment, or both.
18	(f)	In addition to any other penalty imposed under this
19	section,	a person violating this section shall be subject to:
20	(1)	An administrative fine of not more than \$1,000 for
21		each aquatic life specimen sold;

1	(2)	Seizure and forfeiture of any taken aquatic life
2		specimens, commercial marine license, vessel, and
3		equipment; and
4	(3)	Assessment of administrative fees and costs, and
5		attorney's fees and costs.
6	<u>(g)</u>	The division of aquatic resources of the department of
7	land and	natural resources shall submit an annual report on the
8	effective	ness and enforcement of this section to the legislature
9	no later	than twenty days prior to the convening of each regular
10	session.	
11	(h)	For the purposes of this section:
12	"Aqu	arium purposes" means the holding of saltwater fish,
13	freshwate	r nongame fish, or other aquatic life alive in a state
14	of captiv	ity as pets, for scientific study, for public
15	exhibitio	n or display, or for sale for these purposes.
16	"Aqu	atic life" means any type or species of mammal, fish,
17	amphibian	, reptile, mollusk, crustacean, arthropod,
18	invertebr	ate, coral, or other animal that inhabits the
19	freshwate	r or marine environment and includes any part, product,
20	egg, or o	ffspring thereof; or freshwater or marine plants,
21	including	seeds, roots, products, and other parts thereof.

1 "Sell" means to transfer, prescribe, give, or deliver to 2 another; to leave, barter, or exchange with another; or to offer 3 or agree to do the same to another for consideration. 4 "Take" means to fish for, catch, capture, confine, or 5 harvest, or to attempt to fish for, catch, capture, confine, or 6 harvest aquatic life." 7 SECTION 2. Section 188-31, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 8 amended to read as follows: 9 "§188-31 Permits to take aquatic life for aquarium 10 purposes. (a) Except as prohibited by law, the department, upon receipt of a written application, may issue an aquarium 11 12 fish permit, not longer than one year in duration, to take 13 aquatic life and to use fine meshed traps, or fine meshed nets other than throw nets, for the taking of marine or freshwater 14 15 nongame fish and other aquatic life for aquarium purposes. person shall take aquatic life for aquarium purposes or use fine 16 meshed traps or fine meshed nets, other than throw nets, to take 17 marine or freshwater nongame fish and other aquatic life for 18 aquarium purposes without an aquarium fish permit. 19 20 Except as prohibited by law, the permits shall be (d) 21 issued only to persons who can satisfy the department that they

- 1 possess facilities to and can maintain fish and other aquatic
- 2 life alive and in reasonable health.
- 3 (c) It shall be illegal to sell or offer for sale any fish
- 4 and other aquatic life taken under an aquarium fish permit
- 5 [unless those fish and other aquatic life are sold alive for
- 6 aquarium purposes].
- 7 The department may adopt rules pursuant to chapter 91 for
- 8 the purpose of this section.
- 9 (d) For the purposes of this section:
- 10 [\(\frac{(1)}{1}\)] "Aquarium purposes" means [\(\frac{to-hold}{n}\)] the holding of
- 11 salt water fish, freshwater nongame fish, or other aquatic life
- 12 alive in a state of captivity as pets, for scientific study, or
- 13 for public exhibition or display[, or for sale for these
- 14 purposes; and].
- 15 $\left[\frac{(2)}{2}\right]$ "Aquarium fish permit" means a permit issued by the
- 16 board for the taking of aquatic life, and for the use of fine
- 17 mesh nets and traps to take salt water fish, freshwater nongame
- 18 fish, or other aquatic life for aquarium purposes.
- "Sell" means to transfer, prescribe, give, or deliver to
- 20 another; to leave, barter, or exchange with another; or to offer
- 21 or agree to do the same to another for consideration.

- 4 SECTION 5. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
- 5 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
- 6 begun before its effective date.
- 7 SECTION 6. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 8 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 9 SECTION 7. This Act shall take effect on January 1, 2016.

Report Title:

Aquatic Life; Aquarium Permits; Fish; Sale of Aquatic Life for Aquarium Use Prohibited

Description:

Criminalizes the sale of aquatic life for aquarium use and establishes the penalties for first and subsequent violations. Amends existing aquarium fish permit law to conform to the ban. Takes effect on 1/1/2016.
