A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII RULEMAKING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECT	ION 1. Section 304A-105, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended b	y amending subsection (a) to read as follows:
3	"(a)	The board of regents shall have management and
4	control o	f the general affairs, and exclusive jurisdiction over
5	the inter	nal structure, management, and operation of the
6	universit	y. The board may:
7	(1)	Appoint a treasurer and other officers as it deems
8		necessary;
9	(2)	Authorize any officer, elected or appointed by it, to
10		approve and sign on its behalf any voucher or other
11		document that the board may approve and sign;
12	(3)	Delegate to the president or the president's designee
13		the authority to render the final decision in
14		contested case proceedings subject to chapter 91, as
15		it deems appropriate;
16	(4)	Purchase or otherwise acquire lands, buildings,
17		appliances, and other property for the purposes of the
18		university; and

(5)	Expend any sums of money as, from time to time, may be
	placed at the disposal of the university from whatever
	source; provided that notwithstanding any other law to
	the contrary, all documents regarding expenditures and
	changes thereto, made by the board shall be disclosed
	in open meetings for the purpose of public comment;
	provided further that all expenditure requests,
	proposals, and any other budgetary documents used by
	the board at an open meeting shall be made available
	to the public at least six calendar days before the
	meeting.

All lands, buildings, appliances, and other property so purchased or acquired shall be and remain the property of the university to be used in perpetuity for the benefit of the university. The board, in accordance with this section and other law, shall manage the inventory, equipment, surplus property, and expenditures of the university and, [subject to chapter 91, may adopt rules, further] at an open public meeting held pursuant to chapter 92, may adopt regulations controlling and regulating the same."

12		bona fide resident of this State for at least twelve
13		consecutive months next preceding the student's first
14		day of officially scheduled instruction for any
15		semester or term in which the student is enrolling at
16		the particular college or campus; and
17	(2)	The adult or minor student has not been claimed as a
18		dependent for tax purposes for at least twelve months
19	,	next preceding the student's first day of officially
20		scheduled instruction for any semester or term in

15	meeting held pursuant to chapter 92, adopt [rules] regulations

18	SECTION 4. Section 304A-2160, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is	
19	amended to read as follows:

10	(1)	[Assess] Assessment of fees for parking on roadways	
11		and in the parking areas under the jurisdiction of the	
12		university; and	
13	(2)	[Install] Installation of parking meters on roadways	
14		and in parking areas[; and	
15	(3)	Make-rules relating to the assessments of fees for	
16		parking and the installation of parking meters. The
