A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE BUDGET OF THE OFFICE OF HAWAIIAN AFFAIRS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to appropriate funds
- 2 for the biennial budget of the office of Hawaiian affairs. This
- 3 Act shall be known and may be cited as the "Office of Hawaiian
- 4 Affairs Appropriations Act of 2015".
- 5 SECTION 2. Unless otherwise clear from the context, as
- 6 used in this Act:
- 7 "Means of financing", or "MOF", means the source from which
- 8 funds are appropriated or authorized, as the case may be, to be
- 9 expended for the programs and projects specified in this Act.
- 10 Letter symbols following appropriations have the following
- 11 meanings:
- 12 A General Funds
- T Trust Funds
- 14 "Position ceiling" means the maximum number of permanent
- 15 positions authorized for a particular program during a specified
- 16 period or periods, as noted by an asterisk.



- 1 "Program ID" means the unique identifier of the specific
- 2 program, and consists of the abbreviation for the office of
- 3 Hawaiian affairs followed by a designated number for the
- 4 program.
- 5 SECTION 3. The following sums, or so much thereof as may
- 6 be necessary to accomplish the purposes and programs designated
- 7 herein, are appropriated or authorized, as the case may be, from
- 8 the sources of funding specified to the office of Hawaiian
- 9 affairs for the fiscal biennium beginning July 1, 2015, and
- 10 ending June 30, 2017. The total general fund expenditures and
- 11 the number of permanent positions established in each fiscal
- 12 year of the biennium shall not exceed the sums and the position
- 13 ceilings indicated for each year, except as provided elsewhere
- 14 in this Act.

- 1 SECTION 4. Provided that the general fund appropriations
- 2 in section 3 of this Act shall be expended by the office of
- 3 Hawaiian affairs.
- 4 SECTION 5. Provided that of the funds appropriated for
- 5 beneficiary advocacy (OHA 175), the sum of \$415,000 in general
- $\mathbf{6}$ funds and \$415,000 in trust funds for fiscal year 2015-2016 and
- 7 the sum of \$415,000 in general funds and \$415,000 in trust funds
- 8 for fiscal year 2016-2017 shall provide for social services,
- 9 including referral services and case management, to at-risk
- 10 office of Hawaiian affairs beneficiaries to immediately address
- 11 unexpected crises. Program activities shall be designed with an
- 12 overall objective to provide financial assistance to improve
- 13 stability during emergency situations; provided that
- 14 notwithstanding section 10-17(e), Hawaii Revised Statutes, any
- 15 funds expended for the purposes of this section shall be in
- 16 accordance with chapter 103D or 103F, Hawaii Revised Statutes,
- 17 as appropriate.
- 18 SECTION 6. Provided that of the funds appropriated for
- 19 beneficiary advocacy (OHA 175), the sum of \$615,000 in general
- 20 funds and \$615,000 in trust funds for fiscal year 2015-2016 and
- 21 the sum of \$615,000 in general funds and \$615,000 in trust funds

- 1 for fiscal year 2016-2017 shall provide for educational
- 2 improvement programs for Native Hawaiian students. Program
- 3 activities shall be designed to help Native Hawaiians meet or
- 4 exceed educational standards; provided that notwithstanding
- 5 section 10-17(e), Hawaii Revised Statutes, expenditure of any
- 6 funds for the purposes of this section shall be made in
- 7 accordance with chapter 103D or 103F, Hawaii Revised Statutes,
- 8 or a competitive grants process, as appropriate.
- 9 SECTION 7. Provided that of the funds appropriated for
- 10 beneficiary advocacy (OHA 175), the sum of \$524,400 in general
- 11 funds and \$524,400 in trust funds for fiscal year 2015-2016 and
- 12 the sum of \$524,400 in general funds and \$524,400 in trust funds
- 13 for fiscal year 2016-2017 shall provide for legal services and
- 14 legal representation to office of Hawaiian affairs beneficiaries
- 15 for: the assertion and defense of quiet title actions;
- 16 assistance with ahupua'a and kuleana tenant rights, including
- 17 rights of access and rights to water; land title assistance,
- 18 including review of title and genealogy; preservation of
- 19 traditional and customary practices; protection of culturally
- 20 significant places; and preservation of Native Hawaiian land
- 21 trust entitlements; provided further that notwithstanding

- 1 section 10-17(e), Hawaii Revised Statutes, expenditure of any
- 2 funds expended for the purposes of this section shall be made in
- 3 accordance with chapter 103D or 103F, Hawaii Revised Statutes,
- 4 as appropriate.
- 5 SECTION 8. Provided that of the funds appropriated for
- 6 beneficiary advocacy (OHA 175), the sum of \$460,000 in general
- 7 funds and \$460,000 in trust funds for fiscal year 2015-2016 and
- 8 the sum of \$460,000 in general funds and \$460,000 in trust funds
- 9 for fiscal year 2016-2017 shall provide for health improvement
- 10 services and programs to office of Hawaiian affairs
- 11 beneficiaries to include information and referral services, case
- 12 management and counseling, and the establishment of prevention
- 13 programs. Direct services and prevention programs include those
- 14 designed to have the greatest statewide impact on the overall
- 15 wellness of Native Hawaiians through targeted foci on the
- 16 reduction of Native Hawaiian chronic diseases rates, especially
- 17 obesity; provided further that notwithstanding section 10-17(e),
- 18 Hawaii Revised Statutes, expenditure of any funds expended for
- 19 the purposes of this section shall be made in accordance with
- 20 chapter 103D or 103F, Hawaii Revised Statutes, or a competitive
- 21 grants process, as appropriate.

SECTION 9. Provided that of the funds appropriated for 1 beneficiary advocacy (OHA 175), the sum of \$455,000 in general 2 funds and \$455,000 in trust funds for fiscal year 2015-2016 and 3 the sum of \$455,000 in general funds and \$455,000 in trust funds 4 for fiscal year 2016-2017 shall provide for housing improvement 5 programs to office of Hawaiian affairs beneficiaries to increase 6 the capacity of Native Hawaiians to attain housing stability. 7 Programs shall include information and referral services, case 8 management and financial counseling and shall be designed with 9 an overall objective to address barriers that hinder Native 10 Hawaiians from obtaining housing; provided that notwithstanding 11 section 10-17(e), Hawaii Revised Statutes, any funds expended 12 for the purposes of this section shall be in accordance with **13** chapter 103D or 103F, Hawaii Revised Statutes, or a competitive 14 grants process, as appropriate. 15 SECTION 10. Provided that of the funds appropriated for 16 beneficiary advocacy (OHA 175), the sum of \$455,000 in general 17 funds and \$455,000 in trust funds for fiscal year 2015-2016 and 18 the sum of \$455,000 in general funds and \$455,000 in trust funds 19 for fiscal year 2016-2017 shall provide for income improvement 20 programs to office of Hawaiian affairs beneficiaries to increase 21

- 1 the capacity of Native Hawaiians to obtain higher-wage
- 2 employment. Programs shall be designed with an overall goal to
- 3 improve the ability of low- and moderate-income, under-employed,
- 4 unemployed, or displaced Native Hawaiians to increase their
- 5 incomes by expanding knowledge, skills, and abilities through
- 6 the completion of high school equivalency, vocational training,
- 7 or two-year degree programs; provided that notwithstanding
- 8 section 10-17(e), Hawaii Revised Statutes, any funds expended
- 9 for the purposes of this section shall be in accordance with
- 10 chapter 103D or 103F, Hawaii Revised Statutes, or a competitive
- 11 grants process, as appropriate.
- 12 SECTION 11. Provided that whenever necessary, the board of
- 13 trustees of the office of Hawaiian affairs or the board's
- 14 designee may transfer sufficient funds and positions between
- 15 programs for operating purposes; provided further that these
- 16 transfers shall not be inconsistent with legislative intent;
- 17 provided further that a report of these fund transfers shall be
- 18 made to the legislature no later than the end of the 2016 and
- 19 2017 fiscal years, respectively.
- 20 SECTION 12. If any portion of this Act or its application
- 21 to any person or circumstances is held to be invalid for any



- 1 reason, the remainder of the Act and any provision thereof shall
- 2 not be affected. If any portion of a specific appropriation is
- 3 held to be invalid for any reason, the remaining portion shall
- 4 be independent of the invalid portion and shall be expended to
- 5 fulfill the objective and intent of the appropriation to the
- 6 extent possible.
- 7 SECTION 13. If manifest clerical, typographical, or other
- 8 mechanical errors are found in this Act, the board of trustees
- 9 of the office of Hawaiian affairs may correct these errors. All
- 10 changes made pursuant to this section shall be reported to the
- 11 legislature at its next session.
- 12 SECTION 14. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2015.
