A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO FORESTRY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Section 204.5, Hawaiian Homes Commission Act,
2	1920, as amended, is amended to read as follows:
3	"§204.5. Additional powers. In addition and supplemental
4	to the powers granted to the department by law, and
5	notwithstanding any law to the contrary, the department may:
6	(1) With the approval of the governor, undertake and carry
7	out the development of any Hawaiian home lands
8	available for lease under and pursuant to section 207
9	of this Act by assembling these lands in residential
10	developments and providing for the construction,
11	reconstruction, improvement, alteration, or repair of
12	public facilities therein, including, without
13	limitation, streets, storm drainage systems,
14	pedestrian ways, water facilities and systems,
15	sidewalks, street lighting, sanitary sewerage
16	facilities and systems, utility and service corridors,
17	and utility lines, where applicable, sufficient to
18	adequately service developable improvements therein,

1		sites for schools, parks, off-street parking
2		facilities, and other community facilities;
3	(2)	With the approval of the governor, undertake and carry
4		out the development of available lands for homestead,
5		commercial, and multipurpose projects as provided in
6		section 220.5 of this Act, as a developer under this
7		section or in association with a developer agreement
8		entered into pursuant to this section by providing for
9		the construction, reconstruction, improvement,
10		alteration, or repair of public facilities for
11		development, including, without limitation, streets,
12		storm drainage systems, pedestrian ways, water
13		facilities and systems, sidewalks, street lighting,
14		sanitary sewerage facilities and systems, utility and
15		service corridors, and utility lines, where
16		applicable, sufficient to adequately service
17		developable improvements therein, sites for schools,
18		parks, off-street parking facilities, and other
19		community facilities;
20	(3)	With the approval of the governor, designate by
21		resolution of the commission all or any portion of a

1		development or multiple developments undertaken
2		pursuant to this section an "undertaking" under part
3		III of chapter 39, Hawaii Revised Statutes; [and]
4	(4)	Set aside Hawaiian home lands for the forestry of koa
5		or other native trees. The department may enter into
6		one or more public-private partnerships to develop and
7		implement a forestry plan for koa and other native
8		trees. All proceeds from the sale of harvested koa or
9		native trees shall be deposited into the Hawaiian home
10		lands trust fund and expended by the department
11		pursuant to section 213.6; and
12	[-(4)-]	(5) Exercise the powers granted under section 39-53,
13		Hawaii Revised Statutes, including the power to issue
14		revenue bonds from time to time as authorized by the
15		legislature.
16	All j	provisions of part III of chapter 39, Hawaii Revised
17	Statutes,	shall apply to the department and all revenue bonds
18	issued by	the department shall be issued pursuant to the
19	provision	s of that part, except these revenue bonds shall be
20	issued in	the name of the department, and not in the name of the
21	State.	

1 As applied to the department, the term "undertaking" as 2 used in part III of chapter 39 shall include a residential 3 development or a development of homestead, commercial, or 4 multipurpose projects under this Act. The term "revenue" as used in part III of chapter 39, shall include all or any portion 5 6 of the rentals derived from the leasing of Hawaiian home lands 7 or available lands, whether or not the property is a part of the 8 development being financed." SECTION 2. Section 213.6, Hawaiian Homes Commission Act, 9 10 1920, as amended, is amended to read as follows: 11 "\$213.6. Hawaiian home lands trust fund. There is 12 established a trust fund to be known as the Hawaiian home lands 13 trust fund, into which shall be deposited all appropriations by 14 the state legislature specified to be deposited therein[-] and 15 all proceeds from the sale of harvested koa or native trees, 16 pursuant to section 204.5. Moneys of the Hawaiian home lands 17 trust fund shall be expended by the department, as provided by 18 law, upon approval by the commission and shall be used for 19 capital improvements and other purposes undertaken in 20 furtherance of the Act. The department shall have a fiduciary 21 responsibility toward the trust fund and shall provide annual

- 1 reports therefor to the legislature and to the beneficiaries of
- 2 the trust.
- 3 The commission may deposit moneys from the trust fund into
- 4 depositories other than the state treasury and may manage,
- 5 invest, and reinvest moneys in the trust fund. The commission
- 6 may hold, purchase, sell, assign, transfer, or dispose of any
- 7 securities and investments in which any of the moneys have been
- 8 invested, as well as the proceeds of the investments. Moneys
- 9 from the trust fund that are deposited into depositories other
- 10 than the state treasury shall be exempt from the requirements of
- 11 chapters 36 and 38. Any interest or other earnings arising out
- 12 of investments from the trust fund shall be credited to and
- 13 deposited into the trust fund."
- 14 SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 15 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 16 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.

DHHL; Koa and Native Tree Forestation

Description:

Provides that DHHL may utilize Hawaiian home lands for the forestry of koa or native trees. Allows DHHL to enter into public-private partnerships to implement the forestry plan. Requires the proceeds from the forestry plan to be deposited into the Hawaiian home lands trust fund. (SD1)
