A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO FAIR PUBLIC ACCESS.

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BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that a centralized system 2 of state government provides for efficient coordination of 3 government functions and services, especially for a population spread out over separate islands. However, issues relating to 4 accessibility and delivery of government information, services, 5 and proceedings to residents living on the neighbor islands as 6 well as rural Oahu remain an ongoing challenge, in part because 7 8 of the centralized location of state government in Honolulu's 9 urban core.

10 The legislature further finds that the residents of Hawaii, Maui, Molokai, Lanai, Kauai, Niihau, and rural Oahu are 11 disadvantaged because of their location away from the seat of 12 13 government in Honolulu. This is true even though advancements 14 in technology, especially in the field of telecommunications, 15 have significantly reduced physical distance as a limitation on the ability of these residents to access government information, 16 personnel, and proceedings. 17

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1	The legislature believes it is the responsibility of		
2	government, through its executive, legislative, and judicial		
3	branches, to ensure that the residents of all islands have fair		
4	access to government information, services, and proceedings. To		
5	this end, the legislature finds that a statewide fair access		
6	commission, such as the one convened in 1989, may prove		
7	beneficial in providing recommendations to the governor.		
8	Moreover, the joint legislative access committee, statutorily		
9	created in 1996, has similar duties and thus is the most		
10	appropriate body to recommend ways to ensure fair access to		
11	legislative proceedings and information.		
12	The purpose of this Act is to:		
13	(1) Authorize the governor to establish a statew:	ide fair	
14	access commission;		
15	(2) Require the statewide fair access commission	and the	
16	joint legislative access committee to review	,	
17	evaluate, and make recommendations for impro-	ving the	
18	level of access by neighbor island and rural Oahu		
19	residents to proceedings, information, and services of		
20	government; and		

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1	(3) Appropriate funds to carry out the work of the fair
2	access commission.
3	SECTION 2. Chapter 27, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended
4	by adding a new section to be appropriately designated and to
5	read as follows:
6	§27- Fair access to state government. (a) The office
7	of the governor shall be responsible for ensuring that residents
8	throughout the State have fair access to government information,
9	services, and proceedings.
10	(b) Pursuant to subsection (a), the governor may appoint a
11	statewide fair access commission composed of representatives
12	from all the islands in the State to review, evaluate, and make
13	recommendations for improving the level of access to government
14	by residents on the neighbor islands and rural Oahu.
15	(c) The legislature shall be responsible for ensuring fair
16	access to information, services, and proceedings of the
17	legislative branch through programs that enable residents
18	statewide to have access to audio and video broadcasts of
19	legislative proceedings, legislative documents, and public
20	education and other services through technologies that allow
21	access by residents on all islands in the State.



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1	(d) The judiciary shall be responsible for ensuring fair		
2	access to information, services, and proceedings of the judicial		
3	branch; provided that the judiciary shall determine which		
4	records are non-administrative records of the judiciary and thus		
5	not subject to disclosure under the provisions of chapter 92F."		
6	SECTION 3. Section 21D-6, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
7	amended to read as follows:		
8	"[[]§21D-6 Joint legislative access committee.[]] There		
9	is established the joint legislative access committee which		
10	shall be composed of members of the legislature. The president		
11	of the senate and the speaker of the house of representatives		
12	shall each appoint a co-chair and two members or more to the		
13	committee, one of whom shall be a member of the minority party.		
14	The committee shall:		
15	(1) Oversee the staff and operations of the legislative		
16	broadcast [project,] program and recommend policies		
17	for the project which shall be adopted by concurrent		
18	resolution; [and]		
19	(2) Review the operations of the public access room,		
20	legislative internet project, and other public access		
21	projects of the legislature and recommend policies for

13	SECT	ION 5. There is appropriated out of the general	
14	revenues	of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so

16	the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal		
17	year 2016	-2017 to establish and carry out the work of the fair	
18	access commission.

State Government; Fair Access Commission; Neighbor Island Access; Rural Access; Appropriation

Description:

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Requires the governor, legislature including the joint legislative access committee, and judiciary to ensure public access to information, services, and proceedings of the executive, legislative, and judicial branches, respectively. Authorizes the governor to convene a statewide fair access commission to review public access issues for the neighbor islands and rural Oahu. Appropriates funds to establish and carry out the work of the fair access commission.
