RELATING TO EARLY LEARNING.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Section 302L-1.6, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is $\cdot$		
2	amended b	y amending subsections (b) and (c) to read as follows:	
3	"(b)	The advisory board shall consist of the following

18	of office	, whereupon the governor shall make appointments as
19	expeditio	usly as possible in accordance with section 1 of this
20	Act.
