A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 The legislature finds that the development of 2 commercial high technology in Hawaii is important to the State's 3 economic development. The Hawaii legislature created the high 4 technology innovation corporation in 2005 to facilitate the 5 growth and development of commercial high technology in Hawaii. The high technology innovation corporation's duties included but 6 7 were not limited to: 8 (1) Managing the assets and resources of the high 9 technology development corporation; 10 (2) Planning, creating, and implementing any programs and projects assigned by the high technology development 11 12 corporation including nonprofit, state, and federally 13 funded programs and projects; (3) Identifying and obtaining funding and other resources 14 15 in support of the high technology innovation 16 corporation and the high technology development 17 corporation from agencies not able to provide

1	resources directly to the high technology development
2	corporation; and
3	(4) Assisting the high technology development corporation
4	strategically and operationally in support of the
5	State's technology-based economic development
6	activities.
7	In 2013, the high technology innovation corporation was not
8	extended by the legislature, and the program ended.
9	The purpose of this Act is to renew support of commercial
10	high technology growth and development in Hawaii by
11	reestablishing the high technology innovation corporation.
12	SECTION 2. Chapter 206M, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
13	amended by adding a new part to be appropriately designated and
14	to read as follows:
15	"PART . HIGH TECHNOLOGY INNOVATION CORPORATION
16	§206M-A Establishment of the high technology innovation
17	corporation; purpose. (a) There is established, as a body
18	corporate, the high technology innovation corporation. The high
19	technology innovation corporation shall be a public, not-for-
20	profit organization under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal
21	Revenue Code of 1986, as amended. The high technology

1	innovation	corporation	shall	be	attached	to	the	department	of
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- 2 business, economic development, and tourism for administrative
- 3 purposes.
- 4 (b) The purpose of the high technology innovation
- 5 corporation shall include but not be limited to the facilitation
- 6 of the growth and development of the commercial high technology
- 7 industry in Hawaii. Its duties shall include but not be limited
- 8 to:
- 9 (1) Managing the assets and resources of the high
- 10 technology development corporation, including its
- 11 technology parks and incubation facilities;
- 12 (2) Planning, creating, and implementing any programs and
- projects of the high technology development
- 14 corporation that shall be assigned to the high
- technology innovation corporation, including
- 16 federally- and state-funded programs and projects and
- those programs funded by other nonprofit and for-
- 18 profit organizations;
- 19 (3) Identifying and obtaining funding and other resources
- in support of the purposes of the high technology
- 21 innovation corporation and the high technology

1		development corporation from agencies and
2		organizations not able to provide resources directly
3		to the high technology development corporation;
4	(4)	Assisting the high technology development corporation
5		in the promotion and marketing of Hawaii as a location
6		for commercial high technology activity; and
7	(5)	Assisting the high technology development corporation
8		in any other strategic or operational manner that
9		supports the State's technology-based economic
10		development activities.
11	(c)	The high technology innovation corporation shall
12	implement	this purpose by:
13	(1)	Furnishing the means, methods, and agencies by which
14		the management, programming, training, investigation,
15		research, and analysis may be conducted;
16	(2)	Other means to make the benefits of programming,
17		training, investigation, research, and analysis
18		available to the public; and
19	(3)	Any and all other acts reasonably designed to promote
20		the foregoing purposes in the interest of promoting
21		the general welfare of the people of the State.

- 1 The high technology innovation corporation shall have the sole
- 2 right to provide the foregoing services and support to the high
- 3 technology development corporation, and the high technology
- 4 development corporation shall use the high technology innovation
- 5 corporation to provide these services and support in every case,
- 6 except when the high technology development corporation
- 7 determines that the high technology innovation corporation may
- 8 not or cannot legally or operationally provide these services
- 9 and support.
- 10 §206M-B Board of directors; composition. (a) The affairs
- 11 of the high technology innovation corporation shall be under the
- 12 general management and control of a board of directors
- 13 consisting of nine voting members. The board shall be composed
- 14 as follows:
- 15 (1) The executive director and chief executive officer of
- 16 the high technology development corporation;
- 17 (2) The division head of the creative industries division
- of the department of business, economic development,
- 19 and tourism;
- 20 (3) The president of the Hawaii strategic development
- 21 corporation;

1	(4)	The executive director of the natural energy
2		laboratory of Hawaii authority;
3	(5)	The executive director of the agribusiness development
4		corporation;
5	(6)	The executive director of the Hawaii housing finance
6		development corporation;
7	(7)	The energy administrator of the Hawaii state energy
8		office;
9	(8)	One private business sector member to be appointed by
10	·	the speaker of the house of representatives; and
11	(9)	One private business sector member to be appointed by
12		the president of the senate.
13	(b)	All members of the high technology innovation
14	corporation	on's board shall serve without pay, but shall be
15	entitled	to reimbursement for necessary expenses, including
16	travel ex	penses, while attending meetings and while in the
17	discharge	of duties and responsibilities.
18	(c)	The executive director and chief executive officer of
19	the high	technology development corporation shall serve as the
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chairperson of the board.

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1	§206	M-C Powers of the board. The high technology
2	innovatio	n corporation, under the direction of its board of
3	directors	, shall have the following general powers:
4	(1)	To adopt, amend, and repeal bylaws governing the
5		conduct of its business and the exercise of the powers
6		and performance of duties granted to or imposed upon
7		it by law;
8 .	(2)	To sell, lease, rent, hold, maintain, use, and operate
9		any property, real, personal, or mixed, tangible or
10		intangible, in accordance with the conditions under
11		which it was received;
12	(3)	To enter into and perform contracts, leases,
13		cooperative agreements, or other transactions with the
14		high technology development corporation or any other
15		agency or political subdivision of the State, any
16		private person, firm, partnership, association,
17		company, or corporation, only as it may be necessary
18		in the conduct of its business and on terms as it may
19		deem appropriate; provided that the high technology
20		innovation corporation shall not obligate any funds of
21		the State except funds that have been appropriated to

	it by the legislature or transferred or contracted to
	it by the high technology development corporation or
	other agency or department of the state government.
	Notwithstanding the foregoing, the high technology
	innovation corporation may enter into and perform
	contracts, leases, cooperative agreements, or other
	transactions with any agency or instrumentality of the
	United States, a foreign nation, a state, a territory
	or a possession, or with any political subdivision
	thereof, whenever the donating or granting agency or
	instrumentality determines that the high technology
	development corporation or any other agency of the
	State cannot as effectively and efficiently accomplish
	the purposes for which the contracts, leases,
	cooperative agreements, or other transactions are
	being entered into; provided that the high technology
	innovation corporation shall not obligate any funds of
	the State except funds that have been appropriated or
	transferred to it or contracted for it;
(4)	To receive by gifts, grants, devises, bequests, or
	otherwise, from private sources only, any property,

real, personal, or mixed, intangible or tangible,
absolutely or in trust, to be used and disposed of,
either the principal or the income therefrom, in
accordance with the conditions under which it was
received; provided that no gift to the high technology
innovation corporation shall be accepted unless
approved or confirmed by its board of directors.
Notwithstanding the foregoing, the high technology
innovation corporation may receive gifts, grants, or
awards from any agency or instrumentality of the
United States, a foreign nation, a state, a territory
or a possession, or from any political subdivision
thereof, whenever the donating or granting agency or
instrumentality determines that the high technology
development corporation or any other agency of the
State cannot as effectively and efficiently accomplish
the purposes for which the gifts, grants, or awards
are being made; provided that no gift to the high
technology innovation corporation shall be accepted
unless approved or confirmed by its board of
directors;

1	(5)	To have a corporate seal;
2	(6)	To sue and be sued in its own name;
3	(7)	To serve as trustee or beneficiary under terms of any
4		gift, indenture, or will;
5	(8)	To apply for, take out, receive by purchase or gift,
6		hold, administer, and dispose of copyrights, patent
7		rights, licenses, assignments of inventions,
8		discoveries, processes, and other property, rights or
9		interests therein, and the income thereof, absolutely
10		or subject to conditions or trusts as may be attached
11		thereto or be imposed thereon, and to obligate itself
12		to perform and execute any and all conditions or
13		trusts;
14	(9)	To conduct programs, projects, research, studies,
15		experiments, investigations, and tests in all fields
16		of knowledge; to promote and develop the scientific
17	•	and commercial value of inventions, discoveries, and
18		processes; and to make, publish, and distribute the
19		results thereof;
20	(10)	To coordinate and correlate activities and projects of
21		the high technology innovation corporation with the

1		work of state agencies for the purpose of relating
2		research work to the economic development of the State
3		whenever practical or desirable;
4	(11)	To stimulate and promote cooperative research projects
5		and activities;
6	(12)	To establish and maintain, or to assist in
7		establishing and maintaining staff positions for the
8		purpose of aiding in technology-based economic
9		development, and to enter into agreements or contracts
10		with other corporations, organizations, institutions,
11		or persons for this purpose and to pay the necessary
12		and appropriate expenses therefor;
13	(13)	To prepare, print, or publish any manuscript, research
14		article, report, study, discussion, reference,
15		collection, or any pictorial or schematic
16		representation or group or collection thereof, whether
17		the same belongs to or is the work of any state agency
18		or its employees, or the high technology innovation
19		corporation or its employees or a contractor of the
20		high technology innovation corporation. The printing
21		or publication may be accomplished through whatever

1		person, company, or agency is deemed most appropriate
2		by the board of directors;
3	(14)	To establish operational bank accounts as may be
4		necessary in the conduct of its business and its out-
5		of-state offices, including accounts in in-state and
6		out-of-state locations and accounts of foreign
7		denomination in out-of-state locations, without the
8		approval of the director of finance or the
9		comptroller; and
10	(15)	To do any or all other acts reasonably necessary to
11		carry out the objects and purposes of the high
12		technology innovation corporation.
13	§206	M-D Innovation corporation; exempted from certain
14	state law	s. The high technology innovation corporation shall be
15	exempt fr	om the following state laws:
16	(1)	Section 78-1, relating to public employment;
17	(2)	Chapter 36, relating to the management of state funds;
18	(3)	Chapter 38, relating to deposits of public funds;
19	(4)	Chapter 76, relating to civil service; and
20	(5)	Chapter 103D, relating to the Hawaii public
21		procurement code.

1	§206M-E Officers and employees of the innovation
2	corporation. The high technology innovation corporation's board
3	of directors shall select the president of the high technology
4	innovation corporation and may also appoint other officers and
5	employees as may be necessary in administering the affairs of
6	the high technology innovation corporation. The high technology
, 7	innovation corporation's board of directors shall set the
8	employees' duties, responsibilities, salaries, holidays,
9	vacations, leaves, hours of work, and working conditions and may
10	grant other benefits as it deems necessary. New employees of
11	the innovation corporation shall not be entitled to any benefits
12	conferred under chapter 76, 78, 88, or 89, or any public
13	employee collective bargaining agreement, executive order,
14	executive directive, or rule; provided that any existing officer
15	or employee of the State whose functions are transferred by this
16	part shall not suffer any loss of salary, seniority, prior
17	service credit, vacation, sick leave, or other employee benefit
18	or privilege as a consequence of this part.
19	§206M-F Annual report. The high technology innovation
20	corporation shall submit an annual report, not later than twenty

days prior to the convening of each regular session, to the

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- 1 governor, president of the senate, and speaker of the house of
- 2 representatives. The report shall include but not be limited to
- 3 the high technology innovation corporation's audited financial
- 4 statement, total amount of payroll and other disbursements made,
- 5 and progress and accomplishments made during the year.
- 6 §206M-G Dissolution. If the high technology innovation
- 7 corporation is dissolved, all of its property, real, personal,
- 8 and mixed and wheresoever situated, shall vest immediately and
- 9 absolutely in the high technology development corporation, and
- 10 none of its property shall inure to the benefit of any officer,
- 11 director, or member of the high technology innovation
- 12 corporation.
- 13 §206M-H Patents, copyrights, and other rights. Any
- 14 patents, copyrights, inventions, discoveries, or other rights
- 15 arising from high technology innovation corporation activities
- 16 shall belong to the high technology innovation corporation and
- 17 be subject to policies or rules as the high technology
- 18 innovation corporation board of directors may adopt.
- 19 §206M-I Contracts with state agencies. Any contract
- 20 between the high technology innovation corporation and any
- 21 agency, office, department, or other administrative subdivision



1	of the ex	ecutive branch of the State shall include the
2	following	
3	(1)	Its termination date;
4	(2)	Its intent and purpose;
5	(3)	A statement establishing the full permissible extent
6		of its applicability; and
7	(4)	A description of the circumstances under which it may
8		be amended or extended."
9	SECT	TION 3. In codifying the new sections added by section
10	2 of this	Act, the revisor of statutes shall substitute
11	appropria	te section numbers for the letters used in designating
12	the new s	ections in this Act.
13	SECT	TION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
