### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO SENTENCING FOR PUBLIC EMPLOYEES.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that there have been a
- 2 number of cases in which public employees have abused their
- 3 public positions to commit crimes thereby breaching public
- 4 trust. However, the defendants in these cases served little or
- 5 no time at all for the felonies or misdemeanors they were
- 6 convicted of committing.
- 7 The legislature further finds that greater consideration
- 8 should be exercised during sentencing when a public employee
- 9 abuses a position in order to commit a felony or misdemeanor.
- 10 In such instances, the public employee takes advantages of the
- 11 powers and duties the public employee is granted for personal
- 12 gain. This abuse breaches the government's trust and, more
- 13 importantly, the public's trust in government.
- The purpose of this Act is to:
- (1) Establish additional factors for the court to consider
- 16 when sentencing a defendant who abused a position as a
- public employee to commit a felony or misdemeanor;

2		penalties during sentencing under certain	
3		circumstances; and	
4	(3)	Make a defendant ineligible for deferred acceptance of	
5		guilty plea or nolo contendere plea if the defendant	
6		abused the defendant's position as a public employee	
7		to commit a felony or misdemeanor.	
8	SECT	ION 2. Chapter 706, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is	
9	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated		
10	and to re	ad as follows:	
11	" <u>\$</u> 70	6- Sentencing considerations for felonies or	
12	misdemean	ors committed by a public employee; enhanced penalties.	
13	(1) If t	he court determines that the defendant abused the	
14	defendant	's position as a public employee to commit a felony or	
15	misdemean	or, the court shall consider the following factors, in	
16	addition	to the factors considered under section 706-606, in	
17	determini	ng the sentence to be imposed:	
18	<u>(a)</u>	The nature and circumstances of the defendant using	
19		the defendant's position as a public employee to	
20		commit a felony or misdemeanor;	
21	(b)	Any monetary loss, if applicable; and	

1	(c) Any real or personal property loss or damage, if		
2	applicable.		
3	(2) The court may impose additional or enhanced penalties		
4	if the court deems necessary; provided that the defendant is		
5	convicted of any offense that constitutes a felony or		
6	misdemeanor and is not eligible for a deferred acceptance of		
7	guilty plea or nolo contendere plea pursuant to section		
8	853-4(16).		
9	(3) As used in this section, "public employee" means any		
10	public employee of the State or any county, and the political		
11	subdivisions and agencies thereof, any employees under contract		
12	with the State or county, any civil service employees, and any		
13	probationary or provisional employees of the State or county."		
14	SECTION 3. Section 853-4, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
15	amended to read as follows:		
16	"§853-4 Chapter not applicable; when. (a) This chapter		
17	shall not apply when:		
18	(1) The offense charged involves the intentional, knowing,		
19	reckless, or negligent killing of another person;		
20	(2) The offense charged is:		

1		(A) A felony that involves the intentional, knowing,
2		or reckless bodily injury, substantial bodily
3		injury, or serious bodily injury of another
4		person; or
5		(B) A misdemeanor or petty misdemeanor that carries
6		mandatory minimum sentence and that involves the
7		intentional, knowing, or reckless bodily injury,
8		substantial bodily injury, or serious bodily
9		injury of another person;
10	(3)	The offense charged involves a conspiracy or
11		solicitation to intentionally, knowingly, or
12		recklessly kill another person or to cause serious
13		bodily injury to another person;
14	(4)	The offense charged is a class A felony;
15	(5)	The offense charged is nonprobationable;
16	(6)	The defendant has been convicted of any offense
17		defined as a felony by the Hawaii Penal Code or has
18		been convicted for any conduct that if perpetrated in
19		this State would be punishable as a felony;
20	(7)	The defendant is found to be a law violator or
21		delinquent child for the commission of any offense

1		defined as a felony by the Hawaii Penal Code or for
2		any conduct that if perpetrated in this State would
3		constitute a felony;
4	(8)	The defendant has a prior conviction for a felony
5		committed in any state, federal, or foreign
6		jurisdiction;
7	(9)	A firearm was used in the commission of the offense
8		charged;
9	(10)	The defendant is charged with the distribution of a
10		dangerous, harmful, or detrimental drug to a minor;
11	(11)	The defendant has been charged with a felony offense
12		and has been previously granted deferred acceptance of
13	·	guilty plea status for a prior offense, regardless of
14		whether the period of deferral has already expired;
15	(12)	The defendant has been charged with a misdemeanor
16		offense and has been previously granted deferred
17		acceptance of guilty plea status for a prior felony,
18		misdemeanor, or petty misdemeanor for which the period
19		of deferral has not yet expired;
20	(13)	The offense charged is:
21		(A) Escape in the first degree;

1	(B)	Escape in the second degree;
2	(C)	Promoting prison contraband in the first degree;
3	(D)	Promoting prison contraband in the second degree
4	(E)	Bail jumping in the first degree;
5	(F)	Bail jumping in the second degree;
6	(G)	Bribery;
7	(H)	Bribery of or by a witness;
8	(I)	Intimidating a witness;
9	(J)	Bribery of or by a juror;
10	(K)	Intimidating a juror;
-11	(上)	Jury tampering;
12	(M)	Promoting prostitution in the second degree;
13	(N)	Abuse of family or household member;
14	(0)	Sexual assault in the second degree;
15	(P)	Sexual assault in the third degree;
16	(Q)	A violation of an order issued pursuant to
17		chapter 586;
18	(R)	Promoting child abuse in the second degree;
19	(S)	Promoting child abuse in the third degree;
20	(T)	Electronic enticement of a child in the first
21		dearee:

1		(U)	Electronic enticement of a child in the second
2			degree;
3		(V)	Prostitution pursuant to section 712-1200(1)(b);
4		(W)	Street solicitation of prostitution under section
5			712-1207(1)(b);
6		(X)	Solicitation of prostitution near schools or
7			public parks under section 712-1209;
8		(Y)	Habitual solicitation of prostitution under
9			section 712-1209.5; or
10		(Z)	Solicitation of a minor for prostitution under
11			section 712-1209.1;
12	(14)	The	defendant has been charged with:
13		(A)	Knowingly or intentionally falsifying any report
14			required under chapter 11, part XIII with the
15			intent to circumvent the law or deceive the
16			campaign spending commission; or
17		(B)	Violating section 11-352 or 11-353; [or]
18	(15)	The	defendant holds a commercial driver's license and
19		has	been charged with violating a traffic control law,
20		othe	er than a parking law, in connection with the
21		oper	ration of any type of motor vehicle[-]: or

1	(16) The defendant has been charged with a felony or
. 2	misdemeanor committed through abuse of the defendant's
3	position as a public employee.
4	The court may adopt by rule other criteria for purposes of
5	this section."
6	SECTION 4. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
7	matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
8	begun before its effective date.
9	SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
10	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
11	SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
