RELATING TO CAMPAIGN FINANCE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Chapter 11, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended
- 2 by adding a new section to part XIII to be appropriately
- 3 designated and to read as follows:
- 4 "\$11- Time for candidate committee to file supplemental
- 5 reports; legislators; special session. In the event of the
- 6 convening of a special session of the legislature, the incumbent
- 7 candidate and treasurer of the candidate committee of each
- 8 incumbent candidate seeking election to the senate or house of
- 9 representatives whose name will appear on the ballot in the
- 10 immediately succeeding election shall file a supplemental report
- 11 within ten days of the conclusion of a special session of the
- 12 legislature. The supplemental report shall disclose information
- 13 pursuant to section 11-333 and shall cover the period from the
- 14 latest required reporting period under section 11-334 to the
- 15 conclusion of a special session of the legislature. The
- 16 supplemental reports shall apply to only information that is
- 17 related to the candidate committee in preparation for and during

2	amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:
3	"(a) The candidate and treasurer of the candidate
4	committee of each candidate whose name will appear on the ballot
5	in the immediately succeeding election shall file preliminary,
6	final, and supplemental reports [-]; provided that this section
7	shall not apply to supplemental reports filed pursuant to
8	section 11
9	(1) The filing dates for preliminary reports are:
10	(A) Thirty calendar days prior to a primary election;
11	(B) Ten calendar days prior to a primary, each
12	special, or each nonpartisan election; and
13	(C) Ten calendar days prior to a general election;
14	provided that this preliminary report does not
15	need to be filed by a candidate who is
16	unsuccessful in a primary, special, or
17	nonpartisan election, or a candidate who is
18	elected to office in the primary, initial
19	special, or initial nonpartisan election.
20	The preliminary report filed by the date required
21	under subparagraph (A) shall be current through

	June 30, and all other preliminary reports shall be
	current through the fifth calendar day before the
	filing deadline of those other preliminary reports.
(2)	The filing date for the final primary report is twenty
	calendar days after a primary, initial special, or
	initial nonpartisan election. The report shall be
	current through the day of the applicable election.
(3)	The filing date for the final election period report
	is thirty calendar days after a general, subsequent,
	subsequent special, or subsequent nonpartisan
	election. The report shall be current through the day
	of the applicable election. The final election period
	report shall be filed by a candidate who is
	unsuccessful in a primary, initial special, or initial
	nonpartisan election or a candidate who is elected to
	office in the primary, initial special, or initial
	nonpartisan election.
(4)	The filing dates for supplemental reports are:
	(A) January 31 after an election year; and
	(B) July 31 after an election year.
