A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO FIREWORKS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the transportation
- 2 of fireworks to, from, and within the State of Hawaii requires
- 3 the utilization of multiple methods of transportation, including
- 4 but not limited to interstate or intrastate trucking, rail, and
- 5 maritime transportation. The legislature also finds that given
- 6 the diversity of transportation processes and modes, it is
- 7 essential to the health and safety of the community and the
- 8 State's first responders that the importation of fireworks
- 9 shipments be thoroughly accounted for and reported. Although
- 10 existing law regulating fireworks provides requirements for
- 11 licensed individuals or entities, additional shipper and
- 12 redistribution requirements are necessary.
- 13 The purpose of this Act is to delineate the
- 14 responsibilities of those persons or entities defined as
- 15 "shipper"; clarify the label size of display fireworks, articles
- 16 pyrotechnic, and aerial devices; and authorize the use of
- 17 fireworks in certain circumstances.



1 SECTION 2. Chapter 132D, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated 3 and to read as follows: Requirements of shipper. Any shipper that 4 receives fireworks that are imported into the State or between 5 6 counties shall notify the county fire chief prior to shipment, 7 as to whether the shipment will be distributed from: 8 (1) Pier to pier; 9 (2) Pier to warehouse or storage facility; or 10 (3) Pier to redistribution." SECTION 3. Section 132D-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 11 12 amended by adding a new definition to be appropriately inserted 13 and to read as follows: ""Redistribution" means the performance or conducting of 14 15 activities related to the unpacking, segregating, and repacking of a consolidated shipment of fireworks or articles pyrotechnic 16 17 for the purpose of transporting or delivering to a storage, 18 wholesale, or retail site pursuant to section 132D-8.6. 19 Redistribution activities shall be temporary or of a short 20 duration."

1	SECT	ION 4. Section 132D-6, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended t	o read as follows:
3	"[+]	§132D-6[] Exceptions. The prohibitions in section
4	132D-5 do	not apply to:
5	(1)	The use of flares, noisemakers, or signals for
6		warning, pest control, or illumination purposes by
7		police and fire departments, utility companies,
8		transportation agencies, and other governmental or
9		private agencies or persons, including agricultural
10		operations, in connection with emergencies, their
11		duties, or business; [and]
12	(2)	The sale or use of blank cartridges for a show or
13		theater, or for signal, commercial, or institutional
14		purposes in athletics or sports[-];
15	(3)	The purchase and use of consumer fireworks, aerial
16		devices, display fireworks, or articles pyrotechnic in
17		a film or movie production with a valid permit issued
18		by a county pursuant to section 132D-10; and
19	(4)	The testing, disposal, or destruction of illegal or
20		unwanted fireworks by the authority having
21		jurisdiction."

1	SECTION 5. Section 132D-16.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows:
3	(b) Each shell, mine, comet, and multiple tube device,
4	such as finale or barrage boxes, roman candle batteries, or
5	cakes, shall bear a permanent label listing the licensee's name,
6	address, and contact information to include telephone number or
7	electronic mail address. The label shall also list the name and
8	business address of the manufacturer. The label shall be
, 9	approved by the state fire council and conform to the following
10	standards:
11	(1) Numerals and letters of the printed matter shall be
12	not less than one-eighth of an inch high;
13	(2) Required statements shall be printed in a color that
14	contrasts sharply with the background and shall be
15	printed within a borderline; and
16	(3) The label shall measure at least nine square inches
17	[by nine inches]; provided that if the size of the
18	shell, mine, comet, or multiple tube device is too
19	small to correctly display a label of this size, the
20	label may be reduced to a size no smaller than

1	necessary to properly display the information
2	described in this section."
3	SECTION 6. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
4	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
5	SECTION 7. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.

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Report Title:

Public Safety; Fireworks; Shipper Requirements; Labeling; Prohibitions

Description:

Requires shippers to notify the county fire chief as to where fireworks shipments imported into the State or between counties are to be distributed; defines the term redistribution to clarify shipment notification requirements; clarifies that labels on certain fireworks shall be at least nine square inches; and establishes exceptions to fireworks prohibitions.

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
