### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CORRECTIONS.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that adult corrections 2 officers are responsible for maintaining security and preventing 3 violence in the State's jails and prisons. The work of an adult 4 corrections officer can be demanding, and it is imperative that 5 adult corrections officers possess critical thinking and 6 interpersonal skills.

7 The purpose of this Act is to ensure that newly hired adult 8 corrections officers have the skills needed to maintain security 9 and communicate efficiently by establishing a minimum education 10 requirement.

SECTION 2. Chapter 353, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated and to read as follows:

#### 14 "§353- Adult corrections officers; education

15 <u>requirement.</u> Every person hired as an adult corrections officer
16 for the first time in the State after the effective date of this

17 Act shall have, at minimum, a high school diploma."
