A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE REGISTRY OF CLEAN AND SOBER HOMES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Section 321-193.7, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended to read as follows: 3 "[+] §321-193.7[+] Clean and sober homes registry. (a) 4 The department shall establish a voluntary clean and sober homes 5 registry to assist persons recovering from substance abuse to 6 have a safe, clean, and sober environment that supports their 7 recovery. The department shall establish procedures and 8 standards by which homes will be allowed to be listed on the 9 registry, including but not limited to: 10 (1) Organizational and administrative standards; 11 (2) Fiscal management standards; 12 (3) Operation standards; 13 (4) Recovery support standards; 14 (5) Property standards; and 15 (6) Good neighbor standards.

- (b) Upon review and approval of a home operator's
- 2 application, the department shall issue a certificate of
- 3 registration that shall specify:
- 4 (1) The name of the holder of the registration;
- 5 (2) The address to which the registration applies;
- 6 (3) The maximum number of persons to reside in the home;
- 7 and
- 8 (4) The period for which the registration shall be valid.
- 9 An owner, operator, or landlord shall not hold the property out
- 10 to be or advertise to be a "registered clean and sober home"
- 11 unless the home is registered and in good standing with the
- 12 clean and sober homes registry.
- 13 (c) The certificate of registration shall be publicly
- 14 displayed at the home.
- 15 (d) The certificate of registration shall not be
- 16 transferred to a new owner or operator, or to an address other
- 17 than as specified on the certificate of registration.
- 18 (e) Nothing in this section shall relieve a certificate
- 19 holder from compliance with other pertinent statutory
- 20 provisions, nor shall a certificate holder be relieved from

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- 1 compliance with other applicable provisions of federal, state,
- 2 or county laws, ordinances, or rules.
- 3 (f) The department may revoke the certificate of
- 4 registration if a home ceases to meet established standards or
- 5 any other applicable federal, state, or county law, ordinance,
- 6 or rule.
- 7 (g) The department may immediately revoke a certificate of
- 8 registration if there are reasonable grounds to believe that the
- 9 continued operation of the home presents an immediate danger to
- 10 residents of the home or the general public.
- 11 (h) Any revocation of the certificate of registration
- 12 shall be made in writing to the certificate holder.
- (i) The department shall maintain a listing of all
- 14 registered clean and sober homes on its website.
- 15 (j) The department shall establish a toll-free telephone
- 16 number to receive complaints regarding clean and sober homes.
- 17 (k) This section shall not be construed to abrogate an
- 18 individual's right to privacy. Unless otherwise provided by
- 19 law, the department shall implement sufficient protections to
- 20 ensure that the identity of a clean and sober home resident

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- 1 remains confidential and that information collected pursuant to
- 2 this section is used solely for the purposes of this section.
- 3 (1) The department shall adopt rules under chapter 91 as
- 4 necessary to carry out the purposes of this section.
- 5 (m) The department and its employees, agents, and
- 6 volunteers shall be immune from liability for operating the
- 7 clean and sober homes registry reasonably and in good faith
- 8 under this chapter."
- 9 SECTION 2. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 10 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 11 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2112.
