A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO LAW ENFORCEMENT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the department of
- 2 public safety, sheriff division, would be better suited than the
- 3 department of transportation to perform law enforcement
- 4 functions relating to harbors. The legislature further finds
- 5 that consolidating harbor law enforcement functions in the
- 6 department of public safety and requiring harbor police officers
- 7 to meet state sheriff qualifications will benefit the State by
- 8 standardizing skill requirements and increasing professionalism.
- 9 During the 2014 regular session, the legislature passed
- 10 S.B. No. 2589, CD1, the purpose and intent of which was to
- 11 transfer the law enforcement functions and authority related to
- 12 harbors from the department of transportation to the department
- 13 of public safety. That measure was vetoed on the grounds that
- 14 both departments were working collaboratively to improve
- 15 efficiency and effectiveness and that legislation was
- 16 unnecessary. While the legislature appreciates the departments'

- 1 efforts, statutory amendments are still necessary to effectuate
- 2 the transfer.
- 3 SECTION 2. Section 26-14.6, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 4 amended to read as follows:
- 5 "§26-14.6 Department of public safety. (a) The
- 6 department of public safety shall be headed by a single
- 7 executive to be known as the director of public safety.
- 8 (b) The department of public safety shall be responsible
- 9 for the formulation and implementation of state policies and
- 10 objectives for correctional, security, law enforcement, and
- 11 public safety programs and functions, for the administration and
- 12 maintenance of all public or private correctional facilities and
- 13 services, for the service of process, and for the security of
- 14 state buildings.
- (c) Effective July 1, 1990, the Hawaii paroling authority
- 16 and the crime victim compensation commission are placed within
- 17 the department of public safety for administrative purposes
- 18 only.
- 19 (d) Effective July 1, 1990, the functions and authority
- 20 heretofore exercised by:

- 18 "sheriff", "sheriffs", a "sheriff's deputy", "sheriff's
- 19 deputies", a "deputy sheriff", "deputy sheriffs", or a "deputy",
- 20 under sections 21-8, 47-18, 105-4, 134-51, 183D-11, 187A-14,
- **21** 231-25, 281-108, 281-111, 286-52, 286-52.5, 321-1, 322-6, 325-9,

- 1 353-11, 356D-54, 356D-94, 383-71, 438-5, 445-37, 482E-4, 485A-
- 2 202, 501-42, 501-171, 501-218, 521-78, 578-4, 584-6, 587-33,
- 3 603-29, 604-6.2, 606-14, 607-2, 607-4, 607-8, 633-8, 634-11,

- **8** (g) Effective January 1, 1993, the functions and authority
- 9 heretofore exercised by the attorney general and the department
- 10 of the attorney general relating to the executive security
- 11 officers shall be transferred to the department of public
- 12 safety.
- (h) Effective July 1, 1999, the functions and authority
- 14 heretofore exercised by the director of public safety and the
- 15 department of public safety relating to after hours security
- 16 contracts at department of education facilities, except for the
- 17 security functions being performed by employees of the public
- 18 library system as well as the contractual security services for
- 19 the libraries, shall be transferred to the department of
- 20 education.

- 1 (i) Effective January 1, 1993, the functions and authority
- 2 heretofore exercised by the director of health and the
- 3 department of health relating to uniformed security employees
- 4 and security contracts at various state hospitals throughout the
- 5 State shall be transferred to the department of public safety.
- 6 Effective July 1, 2005, the functions, authority, and employee
- 7 positions of the department of public safety relating to
- 8 uniformed security employees and security contracts at health
- 9 facilities that are under the operation, management, and control
- 10 of the Hawaii health systems corporation shall be transferred to
- 11 the Hawaii health systems corporation.
- 12 (j) Effective January 1, 1993, the functions and authority
- 13 heretofore exercised by the director of human services and the
- 14 department of human services relating to contractual security
- 15 guard services shall be transferred to the department of public
- 16 safety.
- 17 (k) Effective July 1, 1994, the functions and authority
- 18 heretofore exercised by the adjutant general relating to
- 19 security for national guard and state emergency management
- 20 facilities in the Diamond Head complex, for after work hours,
- 21 shall be transferred to the department of public safety.

- 1 (1) Effective July 1, 2002, the functions and authority
- 2 heretofore exercised by the director of public safety and the
- 3 department of public safety relating to after hours security
- 4 contracts at department of education facilities, including all
- 5 security functions being performed by employees of the public
- 6 library system, as well as the contractual security services for
- 7 the libraries, shall be transferred to the department of
- 8 education and the public library system as appropriate.
- 9 (m) Effective July 1, 2017, the functions and authority
- 10 exercised by the director of transportation relating to harbors
- 11 law enforcement shall be transferred to the department of public
- 12 safety."
- 13 SECTION 3. Section 26-19, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 14 amended to read as follows:
- 15 "\$26-19 Department of transportation. The department of
- 16 transportation shall be headed by a single executive to be known
- 17 as the director of transportation. The department shall
- 18 establish, maintain, and operate transportation facilities of
- 19 the State, including highways, airports, harbors, and such other
- 20 transportation facilities and activities as may be authorized by
- 21 law.

1 The department shall plan, develop, promote, and coordinate 2 various transportation systems management programs that shall include, but not be limited to, alternate work and school hours 3 programs, bicycling programs, and ridesharing programs. 4 The department shall develop and promote ridesharing 5 6 programs which shall include but not be limited to, carpool and 7 vanpool programs, and may assist organizations interested in promoting similar programs, arrange for contracts with private 8 9 organizations to manage and operate these programs, and assist in the formulation of ridesharing arrangements. Ridesharing 10 programs include informal arrangements in which two or more 11 persons ride together in a motor vehicle. 12 The functions and authority heretofore exercised by the 13 department of public works with respect to highways are 14 transferred to the department of transportation established by 15 16 this chapter. Effective July 1, 2017, the functions and authority 17 exercised by the director of transportation relating to harbors 18

| 18 | officers; | provided that the director may establish and assign |
| 19 | the emplo | yees to positions or categories of positions that may |

- 4 SECTION 7. All rights, powers, functions, and duties of
- 5 the department of transportation, harbors division related to
- 6 law enforcement are transferred to the department of public
- 7 safety.
- 8 All employees who occupy civil service positions and whose
- 9 functions are transferred to the department of public safety by
- 10 this Act shall retain their civil service status, whether
- 11 permanent or temporary. Employees shall be transferred without
- 12 loss of salary, seniority (except as prescribed by applicable
- 13 collective bargaining agreements), retention points, prior
- 14 service credit, any vacation and sick leave credits previously
- 15 earned, and other rights, benefits, and privileges, in
- 16 accordance with state personnel laws and this Act; provided that
- 17 the employees possess the minimum qualifications and public
- 18 employment requirements for the class or position to which
- 19 transferred or appointed, as applicable; provided further that
- 20 subsequent changes in status may be made pursuant to applicable
- 21 civil service and compensation laws.



1 Any employee who, prior to this Act, is exempt from civil 2 service and is transferred as a consequence of this Act may retain the employee's exempt status, but shall not be appointed 3 4 to a civil service position as a consequence of this Act. An exempt employee who is transferred by this Act shall not suffer 5 any loss of prior service credit, vacation or sick leave credits 6 previously earned, or other employee benefits or privileges as a 7 8 consequence of this Act; provided that the employee possesses 9 legal and public employment requirements for the position to which transferred or appointed, as applicable; provided further 10 that subsequent changes in status may be made pursuant to 11 applicable employment and compensation laws. The director of 12 public safety may prescribe the duties and qualifications of 13 these employees and fix their salaries without regard to chapter 14 15 76, Hawaii Revised Statutes. SECTION 8. All appropriations, records, equipment, 16 machines, files, supplies, contracts, books, papers, documents, 17 maps, and other personal property heretofore made, used, 18 19 acquired, or held by the department of transportation relating 20 to the functions transferred to the department of public safety shall be transferred with the functions to which they relate. 21

| 12 | This Act makes statutory revisions which are necessary to |
| 13 | effectuate the transfer. |
