A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO MOTOR VEHICLE DRIVER LICENSING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. This Act shall be cited as the "Drivers Safety
- 2 Act".
- 3 SECTION 2. The legislature finds that the federal REAL ID
- 4 Act of 2005, Pub. L. No. 109-13, requires states to comply with
- 5 federally mandated eligibility criteria in issuing driver's
- 6 licenses, including the requirement of proof of lawful presence
- 7 in the United States. Accordingly, a person who does not submit
- 8 satisfactory proof of the person's presence in the United
- 9 States, as authorized by federal law, cannot legally operate a
- 10 motor vehicle. The REAL ID Act, however, specifically allows
- 11 states to issue driver's licenses that do not comply with the
- 12 minimum federal use requirements and standards of the REAL ID
- 13 Act, a critical exception. Since 2010 when the State
- 14 implemented the restrictive identification requirements for
- 15 driver's licenses, a significant number of residents are now
- 16 unable to carry out necessary daily activities unless they

- 1 operate motor vehicles without a license, and therefore, without
- 2 insurance.
- 3 The heightened requirements unduly burden elderly
- 4 residents, houseless individuals, undocumented immigrants,
- 5 lawfully present nonimmigrants, and survivors of gender-based
- 6 violence. The lack of access to licensure hinders the ability
- 7 to drive safely, legally, and insured to work, to church, to run
- 8 errands, to drop children off to school and drive them to
- 9 medical appointments. Women in particular are
- 10 disproportionately impacted by these requirements because they
- 11 are often the primary caretakers of children.
- 12 In recent years, there has been a significant increase in
- 13 state efforts to expand access to driver's licenses for persons
- 14 who cannot provide proof of authorized presence in the United
- 15 States. Several states now grant access to a driver's license
- 16 regardless of immigration status and only require that the
- 17 applicant establish evidence of current residency in the
- 18 respective state.
- 19 The legislature further finds that the lack of access to
- 20 driver's licensure as a result of restrictive identification
- 21 requirements poses a serious threat to public safety. Allowing

- 1 all age-qualifying residents to obtain driver's licenses will
- 2 improve public safety by ensuring that all drivers are tested
- 3 for driving skills and able to acquire motor vehicle insurance.
- 4 It is not the intent of this Act to jeopardize the State's
- 5 compliance with the REAL ID Act of 2005 or the receipt of any
- 6 federal grants or funding. Issuing restricted driver's licenses
- 7 clearly marked as not acceptable for federal identification
- 8 purposes for the limited purpose of driving a motor vehicle, is
- 9 permissible and will not jeopardize the State's eligibility for
- 10 federal grants or funding.
- 11 The purpose of this Act is to create a limited purpose
- 12 driver's license, limited purpose provisional driver's license,
- 13 and limited purpose instruction permit for all age-eligible
- 14 drivers; provided that all other qualifications for such
- 15 licensure or permitting are met, including satisfactory proof of
- 16 identity and proof of Hawaii residency.
- 17 SECTION 3. Chapter 286, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 18 amended by adding a new section to part VI to be appropriately
- 19 designated and to read as follows:
- 20 "S286- Limited purpose driver's license, limited purpose
- 21 provisional driver's license, and limited purpose instruction

20	(2)	A valid, unexpired passport issued by the applicant's
21		country of citizenship;

1	(3)	An original birth certificate, or other proof of age,
2		as designated by the director;
3	(4)	A current home utility bill, lease or rental
4		agreement, or other proof of Hawaii residency, as
5		designated by the director;
6	<u>(5)</u>	A United States Department of Homeland Security Form
7		I-589, Application for Asylum and for Withholding of
8		Removal;
9	(6)	An official school or college transcript that includes
10		the applicant's date of birth, or a foreign school
11		record that is sealed and includes a photograph of the
12		applicant at the age the record was issued;
13	<u>(7)</u>	An official school or college identification card that
14		includes the applicant's full name and a photograph of
15		the applicant at the time the identification was
16		issued;
17	(8)	A United States Department of Homeland Security Form
18		I-20, or Form DS-2019 (Certificate of Eligibility for
19		<pre>Exchange Visitor (J-1)) Status;</pre>
20	(9)	A United States Customs and Immigration Services
21		Deferred Action for Childhood Arrival Approval Letter;

1	(10)	A deed or title to real property;
2	(11)	An identification card for health benefits;
3	(12)	An identification card for a state public assistance
4		program;
5	(13)	A current voter registration card issued by the State;
6	(14)	A payroll statement indicating wages earned in this
7		State issued no more than six months preceding the
8		time of the application;
9	(15)	An income tax return filed in the State no more than
10		two years preceding the time of the application;
11	(16)	A social security card;
12	(17)	The following documents, which, if in a language other
13		than English, shall be accompanied by a certified
14		translation or an affidavit of translation into
15.		English:
16		(A) A marriage license or divorce certificate;
17		(B) A current foreign federal electoral photo card
18		issued on or after January 1, 1991;
19		(C) A current foreign student identification card; or
20		(D) A current driver's license issued by another
21		country.

1	(b) Except as otherwise provided in this subsection, an
2	application for a limited purpose driver's license, limited
3	purpose provisional driver's license, or limited purpose
4	instruction permit shall be made upon the form and in the manner
5	required under section 286-111; and shall be accompanied by the
6	payment of the fee established for non-limited purpose licenses
7	or permits under section 286-111.
8	(c) Notwithstanding any other law, the director shall not
9	require any applicant for a limited purpose driver's license,
10	limited purpose provisional driver's license, or limited purpose
11	instruction permit to furnish information regarding the
. 12	applicant's ineligibility for a social security account number.
13	The director shall not disclose the identity of an applicant who
14	does not provide a social security card as a form of
15	identification for purposes of this section.
16	(d) A limited purpose driver's license, limited purpose
17	provisional driver's license, or limited purpose instruction
18	permit issued pursuant to this section shall:
19	(1) On its face bear the phrase, "Not acceptable for
20	federal identification purposes"; and

1	(2)	On the reverse side bear the phrase, "This license is
2		issued only as a license to drive a motor vehicle. It
3		does not establish eligibility for employment, voter
4		registration, or public benefits.
5	<u>(e)</u>	A limited purpose driver's license shall expire on the
6	first bir	thday of the licensee occurring eight years after the
7	date of t	he issuance of the limited purpose driver's license,
8	unless so	oner revoked or suspended; provided that:
9	(1)	The limited purpose driver's license shall expire on
10		the first birthday of the licensee occurring four
11		years after the date of the issuance of the limited
12		purpose driver's license, if at the time of issuance
13		the applicant is twenty-four years of age or younger;
14	(2)	The limited purpose driver's license shall expire on
15		the first birthday of the licensee occurring two years
16		after the date of the issuance of the limited purpose
17		driver's license, if at that time of the issuance the
18		applicant is seventy-two years of age or older;
19	(3)	If the applicant is a legal immigrant, the license
20		shall expire no later than the licensee's authorized
21		period of stay in the United States;

1	(4)	In the case of a provisional license, if not suspended
2		or revoked, a limited purpose provisional driver's
3		license shall expire on the date of the limited
4		purpose provisional licensee's nineteenth birthday;
5		and
6	(5)	A limited purpose instruction permit shall expire one
7		year after the date of issuance.
8	(f)	A limited purpose driver's license or limited purpose
9	provision	al driver's license shall be renewed in accordance with
10	section 2	86-107 and reactivated in accordance with section 286-
11	107.5. A	limited purpose instruction permit shall be renewed in
12	accordanc	e with section 286-110.
13	(g)	A limited purpose driver's license, limited purpose
14	provision	al driver's license, or limited purpose instruction
15	permit sh	all not be used to consider a person's citizenship or
16	immigrati	on status in a criminal investigation, arrest, or
17	detention	<u>.</u>
18	(h)	Documents and information collected during the
19	<u>applicati</u>	on process for a limited purpose driver's license,
20	limited p	urpose provisional driver's license, or limited purpose
21	instructi	on permit shall be confidential and shall not be

1 disclosed by the examiner of drivers or the department, except 2 as required by law. (i) If it is determined that the requirements under this 3 section do not comply with applicable federal law, the examiner 4 5 of drivers, under the direction of the department, shall modify the limited purpose license and permit requirements to the 6 extent necessary to satisfy the requirements of federal law. 7 (j) The licensing authority may adopt rules pursuant to 8 9 chapter 91 to implement and enforce the requirements of this 10 section." SECTION 4. Section 286-102, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 11 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows: 12 13 "(a) No person, except one [exempted]: (1) Exempted under section 286-105[, one-who]; 14 Who holds an instruction permit under section 15 (2) 286-110[, one who]; 16 17 (3) Who holds a limited purpose license, limited purpose provisional license, limited purpose instruction 18 19 permit under section 286- ; (4) Who holds a provisional license under section 20 21 286-102.6[, one who];

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2	section 286-239[, or one who]; or
3	(6) Who holds a commercial driver's license instruction
4	permit issued under section 286-236,
5	shall operate any category of motor vehicles listed in this
6	section without first being appropriately examined and duly
7	licensed as a qualified driver of that category of motor
8	vehicles."
9	SECTION 5. Section 286-110, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
10	amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:
11	"(a) Any person aged fifteen years and six months or more
12	who, except for the person's lack of instruction in operating a
13	motor vehicle, would be qualified to obtain a driver's license
14	issued under this part may apply for a temporary instruction
15	permit or a limited purpose instruction permit at the office of
16	the examiner of drivers in the county in which the applicant
17	resides; provided that the applicant complies with section

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21 1. By amending subsection (a) to read:

- 1 "(a) Every application for an instruction permit,
- 2 provisional license, [or] driver's license, limited purpose
- 3 driver's license, limited purpose provisional driver's license,
- 4 or limited purpose instruction permit shall be made upon a form
- 5 furnished by the examiner of drivers and shall be verified by
- 6 the applicant before a person authorized to administer oaths.
- 7 The examiner of drivers and officers serving under the examiner
- 8 may administer the oaths without charge. Each application for
- 9 an instruction permit for a category (1), (2), (3), or (4)
- 10 license shall be accompanied by a fee to be determined by the
- 11 council of each county, and each application for a provisional
- 12 license or driver's license shall be accompanied by the fee,
- 13 unless the applicant has already paid the fee upon application
- 14 for an instruction permit in the same county, in which event no
- 15 fee shall be charged. An additional fee to be determined by the
- 16 council of each county shall be charged and collected upon the
- 17 issuance of a provisional license or driver's license. All of
- 18 the foregoing fees shall become county realizations."
- 19 2. By amending subsection (e) to read:
- "(e) $[\pm f]$ Except as provided in section 286-, if the
- 21 applicant is not eligible to receive a social security number,

1	the applicant shall submit, in lieu of providing proof of social
2	security number pursuant to subsection (d):
3	(1) A United States Social Security Administration letter
4	stating that the applicant is ineligible to obtain a
5	social security number; and
6	(2) Either:
7	(A) A government-issued photo identification
8	document; or
9	(B) Other identification documents as deemed
10	acceptable by the director."
11	SECTION 7. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
12	matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
13	begun before its effective date.
14	SECTION 8. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
15	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
16	SECTION 9. This Act shall take effect on January 1, 2016.

Drivers Safety Act; Motor Vehicle Licensing; Proof of Residency; Proof of Identity; REAL ID Act of 2005

Description:

Creates a limited purpose driver's license, limited purpose provisional driver's license, and limited purpose instruction permit. Provides that limited purpose driver's licenses, limited purpose provisional driver's licenses, and limited purpose instruction permits shall not be acceptable for federal identification purposes. Requires satisfactory proof of identity and Hawaii residency. Effective 1/1/2016.
