A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO NURSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the requirement of 1 all candidates for an initial nurse license to pass a national 2 examination has resulted in the consistent practice of quality 3 health care services administered to the public. 4 examination safeguards the quality of health care practices by 5 ensuring that each candidate possesses the minimum competencies 6 necessary for a newly licensed, entry-level registered or 7 practical nurse to perform work safely and effectively. Despite 8 the clear benefits of this safeguard, continuing competency 9 requirements are not currently instituted for nurse licensure 10 renewal applications in the State. 11 The legislature also finds that in today's health care 12 environment, knowledge of the latest developments in the 13 profession is a crucial means by which nursing duties are safely 14 and effectively fulfilled. New health care systems are emerging 15 and redoubling the challenge of licensure boards to assure 16 consumers that licensed nurses shall remain competent for the 17 duration of their practice. The legislature further finds the 18

- 1 most efficient means to ensure patient safety is to require
- 2 Hawaii-licensed nurses to complete continuing competency
- 3 requirements prior to any application for license renewal,
- 4 restoration, or restatement.
- 5 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to require all non-
- 6 exempt licensed registered nurses and licensed practical nurses
- 7 to complete continuing competency requirements prior to the
- 8 submission of an application for license renewal, restoration,
- 9 or restatement, beginning on July 1, 2017.
- 10 SECTION 2. Chapter 457, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 11 amended by adding two new sections to be appropriately
- 12 designated and to read as follows:
- 13 "§457- Continuing competency requirements; exemptions.
- 14 (a) Beginning July 1, 2017, with the renewal of the licensing
- 15 biennium, and every biennial renewal thereafter, each registered
- 16 nurse and practical nurse licensee shall have completed thirty
- 17 contact hours of learning activity options recognized by the
- 18 board within the two-year period preceding the renewal date, in
- 19 addition to the requirements of section 457-9.
- 20 (b) The following nurses shall be exempt from the
- 21 continuing competency requirements:

1	(1)	Registered nurses licensed in this State who also
2		maintain active advanced practice registered nurse
3		licenses in accordance with this chapter and have a
4		current national certification approved by the board;
5	(2)	Registered nurses licensed in this State who also
6		maintain current national certification, approved by
7		the board, in their practice role; or
8	(3)	A licensee who graduated or completed pre-licensure
9		requirements from an accredited nursing program
10		recognized by the board within twelve months prior to
11		the renewal date of the licensee's first license
12		renewal period.
13	<u>If a</u>	licensee who graduated or completed pre-licensure
14	requireme	nts from an accredited nursing program more than twelve
15	months bu	t less than two years prior to the renewal date, the
16	registered nurse or practical nurse licensee shall be required	
17	to obtain	fifteen contact hours of learning activity options
18	recognize	d by the board from an approved provider prior to the
19	first renewal period.	
20	(c)	The board may extend the deadline for compliance with
21	the conti	nuing competency requirements and shall consider each

1	case on a	an individual basis. Prior to the expiration of the
2	license,	a nurse licensee may submit a written request for an
3	extension	and any documentation requested by the board to
4	substanti	ate the reason for the extension of the deadline for
5	complianc	ce with the continuing competency requirements of this
6	section,	based on the following circumstances:
7	(1)	Illness, as certified by a physician or osteopathic
8		physician licensed under chapter 453 or advanced
9		practice registered nurse licensed under chapter 457
10		in the jurisdiction in which the licensee was treated;
11		<u>or</u>
12	(2)	Military service under extended active duty with the
13		armed forces of the United States.
14	<u>(d)</u>	Each licensee shall maintain copies of the licensee's
15	continuir	g competency records for the past four years or two
16	previous	bienniums.
17	<u>(e)</u>	Upon application for license renewal, restoration, or
18	reinstate	ement, each licensee shall have complied with and attest
19	to comple	etion of learning activity options recognized by the
20	board pur	suant to subsection (a) during the two years preceding
21	the appli	cation for license renewal, restoration, or

1	reinstate	ment and shall be prepared to submit evidence of
2	completio	n if requested by the board.
3	<u>(f)</u>	The board may conduct an audit to determine compliance
4	with the	continuing competency requirement. The board shall
5	provide w	ritten notice of an audit to all licensees selected for
6	audit. W	ithin sixty days of notification, the licensee shall
7	provide the board with documentation verifying compliance with	
8	continuing competency requirements.	
9	<u>§457</u>	- Learning activity options. (a) The successful
10	completio	n of one of the following shall meet the learning
11	activity	options requirements for continuing competency:
12	(1)	National certification or recertification related to
13		the nurse's practice role;
14	(2)	Thirty contact hours of continuing education
15		activities;
16	(3)	Completion of a board approved refresher course;
17	(4)	Completion of a minimum of two semester credits of
18		post-licensure academic education related to nursing
19		practice from an accredited nursing program;
20	(5)	Participation as a preceptor, for at least one nursing
21		student or employee undergoing orientation for at

1		least one hundred twenty hours, in a one-to-one
2		relationship; provided that the licensee may precept
3		more than one student or employee during the one
4		hundred twenty hours and shall be evidenced by
5		documentation of hours completed and objectives of the
6		preceptorship by the institution supervising the
7		student;
8	(6)	Completion as principal or co-principal investigator
9		of a nursing research or evidence-based practice
10		project;
11	(7)	Authoring or coauthoring a peer reviewed published
12		nursing or health-related article, book, or book
13		chapter;
14	(8)	Developing and conducting a nursing education
15		presentation or presentations totaling a minimum of
16		five contact units;
17	(9)	Completion of a board-recognized nurse residency
18		program; or
19	(10)	A similar type of learning activity option; provided
20		that the type of activity shall be recognized by the
21		board. "

- 1 SECTION 3. Section 457-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 2 amended by adding three new definitions to be appropriately
- 3 inserted and to read as follows:
- 4 ""Competency" means the ability of a nurse to integrate
- 5 knowledge, skills, judgment and personal attributes to practice
- 6 safely and ethically in the professional nursing position and in
- 7 accordance with the scope of nationally recognized nursing
- 8 practices.
- 9 "Contact hour" means the same as section 16-89-2, Hawaii
- 10 Administrative Rules.
- 11 "Continuing competency" means the long-term educational and
- 12 professional process by which an individual undertakes and
- 13 documents with verifiable evidence a personal learning plan that
- 14 encompasses a periodic self-assessment of personal strengths and
- 15 weaknesses as present in the individual's practice as a nurse as
- 16 well as a commitment to furthering the individual's professional
- 17 knowledge relating to the nursing field."
- 18 SECTION 4. Section 457-12, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 19 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:
- "(a) In addition to any other actions authorized by law,
- 21 the board shall have the power to deny, revoke, limit, or

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- 1 suspend any license to practice nursing as a registered nurse or
- 2 as a licensed practical nurse applied for or issued by the board
- 3 in accordance with this chapter, and to fine or to otherwise
- 4 discipline a licensee for any cause authorized by law, including
- 5 but not limited to the following:
- 6 (1) Fraud or deceit in procuring or attempting to procure
- 7 a license to practice nursing as a registered nurse or
- **9** (2) Gross immorality;
- 10 (3) Unfitness or incompetence by reason of negligence,
- 11 habits, or other causes;
- 12 (4) Habitual intemperance, addiction to, or dependency on
- alcohol or other habit-forming substances;
- 14 (5) Mental incompetence;
- 15 (6) Unprofessional conduct as defined by the board in
- 16 accordance with its own rules;
- 17 (7) Wilful or repeated violation of any of the provisions
- of this chapter or any rule adopted by the board;
- 19 (8) Revocation, suspension, limitation, or other
- 20 disciplinary action by another state of a nursing
- 21 license for reasons as provided in this section;

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1	(9)	Conviction, whether by noto contendere or otherwise,
2		of a penal offense substantially related to the
3		qualifications, functions, or duties of a nurse,
4		notwithstanding any statutory provision to the
5		contrary;
6	(10)	Failure to report to the board any disciplinary action
7		taken against the licensee in another jurisdiction
8		within thirty days after the disciplinary action
9		becomes final;
10	(11)	Submitting to or filing with the board any notice,
11		statement, or other document required under this
12		chapter, which is false or untrue or contains any
13		material misstatement of fact[+], including a false
14		attestation of compliance with continuing competency
15		requirements; or
16	(12)	Violation of the conditions or limitations upon which
17		any license is issued."

20	SECT	ION 6. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
