A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PUBLIC SAFETY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 353, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
3	and to read as follows:
4	"§353- Committed persons; sale of products and crafts.
5	(a) The department shall permit committed persons, at the
6	director's discretion, to create products and crafts for sale,
7	including photographs, paintings, drawings, sewn items,
8	crocheted items, woodwork, and other items deemed appropriate
9	for sale by the director.
10	(b) The products and crafts created by committed persons
11	may be sold by the director through the correctional industries
12	program established in section 354D-3.
13	(c) The proceeds from the sale of products and crafts
14	pursuant to subsection (a) shall be deposited as follows:

(1) Twenty-five per cent shall be deposited into the

correctional industries revolving fund; and

1	(2) Seventy-five per cent shall be deposited into the
2	committed person's account established pursuant to
3	section 353-20."
4	SECTION 2. Section 354D-10, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
5	amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:
6	"(a) There is created the correctional industries
7	revolving fund to be administered by the department. All moneys
8	collected by the department from the sale or disposition of
9	goods and services produced in accordance with this chapter,
10	from the sale of products and crafts in accordance with section
11	353- , and any inmate deductions shall be deposited into the
12	correctional industries revolving fund. The proceeds in the
13	correctional industries revolving fund shall be used for: the
14	purchase or lease of supplies, equipment, and machinery; the
15	construction, leasing, or renovating of buildings used to carry
16	out the purposes of this chapter; the salaries of personnel
17	necessary to administer the enterprises established in
18	accordance with this chapter; payment of inmates for work
19	assignments; the reimbursement of incarceration costs of the
20	inmates related to the inmates' participation in correctional
21	industries; and other necessary expenses; provided that the

- 1 correctional industries revolving fund shall not be maintained
- 2 in excess of the amount necessary to carry out the purposes of
- 3 this chapter."
- 4 SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 5 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 6 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.

Corrections; Committed Persons; Sale of Crafts; Correctional Industries Program; Correctional Industries Revolving Fund

Description:

Allows committed persons to create approved products and crafts that may be sold through the correctional industries program. Requires that all moneys collected from the sale of products and crafts to be deposited into either the correctional industries revolving fund or the committed person's account. (SD1)
