A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE ENVIRONMENT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. (a) The department of health shall establish the Hawaii battery storage recycling task force to make 2 3 recommendations for a workable recycling program for battery 4 storage devices in Hawaii. The members of the task force shall 5 consist of the following members: 6 (1) The director of health or the director's designee, who shall serve as chairperson of the task force; 7 The program manager of the department of health's 8 (2) 9 solid and hazardous waste branch; 10 (3) A representative from the state energy office; 11 (4)A representative from the Distributed Energy Resources 12 Council of Hawaii; 13 (5) A representative from the Hawaii Solar Energy 14 Association; 15 (6) A representative of a battery or smart grid system 16 wholesale distributor, to be designated by the

chairperson;

| 3 | (8) A representative of the local recycling industry, to |
| 4 | be designated by the chairperson; and |
| 5 | (9) One at-large member designated by the chairperson. |
| 6 | (b) The chairperson shall have the discretion of reducing |
| 7 | the size of the task force; provided that the task force |
| 8 | maintains, to the extent reasonably possible, representation |
| 9 | from various sectors. The members of the task force shall serve |
| 10 | without compensation. |
| 11 | (c) The task force shall submit an interim report of its |
| 12 | findings and recommendations, including any proposed |
| 13 | legislation, to the legislature no later than twenty days prior |
| 14 | to the convening of the regular session of 2017, and a final |
| 15 | report of the task force's findings and recommendations, |
| 16 | including any proposed legislation, to the legislature no later |
| 17 | than twenty days prior to the convening of the regular session |
| 18 | of 2018. |
| 19 | (d) The task force shall terminate on July 1, 2018. |
| 20 | SECTION 2. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2016. |
