A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE HEALTH IMPACT OF PESTICIDES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Chapter 321, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 2 amended by adding a new part to be appropriately designated and
- 3 to read as follows:
- 4 "PART . PESTICIDE DRIFT PROTECTIONS
- 5 §321-A Definitions. As used in this part, unless the
- 6 context clearly requires otherwise:
- 7 "Department" means the department of health.
- 8 "Experimental use pesticide" means a pesticide whose use is
- 9 authorized by an experimental use permit by either the
- 10 Environmental Protection Agency or the department.
- "Health" means physical and mental health.
- 12 "Outdoor application" means an application of a pesticide
- 13 made outside of a building or enclosed structure. The term
- 14 excludes indoor applications of pesticides and structural or
- 15 termite application of pesticides, regardless of whether such
- 16 applications are applied inside or outside of a building or
- 17 enclosed structure.

13	pesticide	use. (a) Beginning July 1, 2016, any entity or
14	person tha	at annually uses or purchases in excess of pounds
15	or g	gallons of restricted use pesticides during a prior
16	calendar y	rear shall disclose the use of all pesticides,
17	including	restricted use, general use, or experimental use, in
18	compliance	e with the following disclosure and notification
19	requiremen	nts:
20	(1)	Provide public posting of warning signs in the area in
21		which pesticides are to be applied a minimum of

1	twenty-four hours prior to the outdoor application of
2	any pesticide, including restricted use, general use,
3	or experimental use. The warning signs shall remain
4	posted during the outdoor application of any pesticide
5	and until expiration of the applicable restricted-
6	entry interval established by the Environmental
7	Protection Agency for the particular pesticide. The
8	posting of warning signs during and after the outdoor
9	application of any pesticide shall conform to the
10	worker protection standard established by the
11	Environmental Protection Agency. The pesticide
12	warning signs shall contain but not be limited to the
13	following information:
14	(A) The trade name of the pesticide to be applied;
15	(B) The name of the active ingredient or ingredients
16	of the pesticide to be applied;
17	(C) The potential hazards to humans and domestic
18	animals as listed in the precautionary statements
19	of the pesticide's label; and
20	(D) Emergency telephone numbers to call in case of
21	poisoning from the pesticide.

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1	(2)	Provide pre-application written notification to any
2		entity or person within feet of the property
3		line where the pesticide is anticipated to be applied
4		outdoors a minimum of twenty-four hours prior to the
5	,	outdoor application of any pesticide, including
6		restricted use, general use, or experimental use. The
7		pre-application written notifications shall contain
8		but not be limited to the following information:
9		(A) The trade name of the pesticide to be applied;
10		(B) The name of the active ingredient or ingredients
11		of the pesticide to be applied;
12		(C) The potential hazards to humans and domestic
13		animals as listed in the precautionary statements
14		of the pesticide's label; and
15		(D) Emergency telephone numbers to call in case of
16		poisoning from the pesticide.
17	(3)	No later than sixty days following the end of each
18		calendar year, any entity or person subject to this
19		section shall provide annual public reports of all
20		pesticides, including restricted use, general use, or

experimental use, used in outdoor applications during

16	conduct any	out	door application of pesticides when the wind
17	speed is mo	re t	han miles per hour. If a more restrictive
18	standard is	set	forth in information contained on the label of
19	the pesticion	de,	or by other regulations, including county or

local regulations, the more restrictive standard shall apply.

1	§321-C Pesticide buffer zones for sensitive areas. (a)
2	Beginning July 1, 2016, any entity or person that uses or
3	purchases in excess of pounds or gallons of
4	restricted use pesticides annually shall restrict the outdoor
5	application of all pesticides, including restricted use, general
6	use, or experimental use, within feet of any sensitive
7	area.
8	(b) If a more restrictive standard is set forth in the
9	information contained on the label of the pesticide, or by other
10	regulations, including county or local regulations, the more
11	restrictive standard shall apply.
12	(c) Any entity or person that is subject to section 321-B
13	shall ensure that prior to any outdoor application of
14	pesticides, the application site is positively identified using
15	a unique and verifiable method, including:
16	(1) An onboard, geo-referenced electronic mapping and
17	navigation system, such as Global Positioning System;
18	(2) Effective site markings visible to the pesticide
19	applicator; or

(3) Other methods approved by the department.

1	(d) Any entity or person that is subject to section 321-B,
2	prior to any application of pesticides, shall provide the
3	certified pesticide applicator, commercial pesticide applicator,
4	or pest control operator with a site plan that includes a site
5	map that:
6	(1) Delineates the boundaries of the application area and
7	the property lines;
8	(2) Depicts the type and location of sensitive areas
9	within feet of the application areas; and
10	(3) Depicts the pesticide buffer zones for sensitive areas
1	where no pesticide application is allowed.
12	§321-D Exemptions. Notwithstanding the provisions of this
13	part, any entity or person subject to section 321-B may obtain
14	from the department a single use exemption from the prohibition
15	on outdoor applications of pesticides in pesticide buffer zones
16	around sensitive areas. The department shall issue a single use
17	exemption if it determines that:
18	(1) The pest situation poses an immediate threat to human
19	health and the environment; and

(2) That there is no viable alternative to the use of the

proposed pesticide."

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The department of health shall adopt rules, SECTION 2. 1 pursuant to chapter 91, Hawaii Revised Statutes, necessary for 2 3 the purposes of this Act. SECTION 3. Nothing in this Act shall be construed to 4 prohibit or preempt the authority of an unit of local government 5 6 in the State of Hawaii, including counties and any other political subdivisions created under article VIII, section 1, of 7 the Hawaii State Constitution, to regulate pesticide disclosure, 8 notification, and use in a manner that is equivalent to or more 9 10 restrictive than the provisions contained in this Act. If any provision of this Act, or the 11 SECTION 4. 12 application thereof to any person or circumstance, is held 13 invalid, the invalidity does not affect other provisions or applications of the Act that can be given effect without the 14 invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions 15 16 of this Act are severable. SECTION 5. In codifying the new sections added by section 17 18 1 of this Act, the revisor of statutes shall substitute appropriate section numbers for the letters used in designating 19

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the new sections in this Act.

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SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
