A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE HEALTH IMPACT OF PESTICIDES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Chapter 321, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 2 amended by adding a new part to be appropriately designated and
- 3 to read as follows:
- 4 "PART PESTICIDE BUFFER ZONES AROUND SCHOOLS
- 5 §321-A Definitions. As used in this part, unless the
- 6 context clearly requires otherwise:
- 7 "Department" means the department of health.
- 8 "Experimental use pesticide" means a pesticide whose use is
- 9 authorized by an experimental use permit by either the
- 10 Environmental Protection Agency or the department.
- "Health" means physical and mental health.
- "Outdoor application" means an application of a pesticide
- 13 made outside of a building or enclosed structure. The term
- 14 excludes indoor applications of pesticides and structural or
- 15 termite application of pesticides, regardless of whether such
- 16 applications are applied inside or outside of a building or
- 17 enclosed structure.

2	July 1, 2	016, any entity or person that uses or purchases in
3	excess of	pounds or gallons of restricted use
4	pesticide	es annually shall restrict the outdoor application of
5	all pesticides, including restricted use, general use, or	
6	experimen	tal use, within feet of any school.
7	(b)	If a more restrictive standard is set forth in the
8	information contained on the label of the pesticide, or by other	
9	regulatio	ns, including county or local regulations, the more
10	restricti	ve standard shall apply.
11	(c)	Any entity or person subject to this section shall
12	ensure that prior to any outdoor application of pesticides, the	
13	application site is positively identified using a unique and	
14	verifiable method, including:	
15	(1)	An onboard, geo-referenced electronic mapping and
16		navigation system, such as Global Positioning System;
17	(2)	Effective site markings visible to the pesticide
18		applicator; or
19	(3)	Other methods approved by the department.
20	(d)	Any entity or person that is subject to this section,

prior to any application of pesticides, shall provide the

1	certified pesticide applicator, commercial pesticide applicator,		
2	or pest control operator with a site plan that includes a site		
3	map that:		
4	(1) Delineates the boundaries of the application area and		
5	the property lines;		
6	(2) Depicts the location of schools within feet of		
7	the application areas; and		
8	(3) Depicts the pesticide buffer zones for schools where		
9	no pesticide application is allowed.		
10	§321-C Exemptions. Notwithstanding the provisions of this		
11	part, any entity or person subject to section 321-B may obtain		
12	from the department a single use exemption from the prohibition		
13	on outdoor applications of pesticides in pesticide buffer zones		
14	around schools. The department shall issue a single use		
15	exemption if it determines that:		
16	(1) The pest situation poses an immediate threat to human		
17	health and the environment; and		
18	(2) That there is no viable alternative to the use of the		
19	proposed pesticide."		

- 1 SECTION 2. The department of health shall adopt rules,
- 2 pursuant to chapter 91, Hawaii Revised Statutes, necessary for
- 3 the purposes of this Act.
- 4 SECTION 3. Nothing in this Act shall be construed to
- 5 prohibit or preempt the authority of an unit of local government
- 6 in the State of Hawaii, including counties and any other
- 7 political subdivisions created under article VIII, section 1, of
- 8 the Hawaii State Constitution, to regulate pesticide disclosure,
- 9 notification, and use in a manner that is equivalent to or more
- 10 restrictive than the provisions contained in this Act.
- 11 SECTION 4. If any provision of this Act, or the
- 12 application thereof to any person or circumstance, is held
- 13 invalid, the invalidity does not affect other provisions or
- 14 applications of the Act that can be given effect without the
- 15 invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions
- 16 of this Act are severable.
- 17 SECTION 5. In codifying the new sections added by section
- 18 1 of this Act, the revisor of statutes shall substitute
- 19 appropriate section numbers for the letters used in designating
- 20 the new sections in this Act.
